Today is Corpus Christie Sunday. It is also known as the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We listen to our Lord in the Gospel as he institutes the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper. I have been celebrating Holy Mass for almost 41 years now and it never ceases to touch my heart that it is the Body and Blood of the Risen Christ that we receive. This is a great Sunday to take a moment and savor that gift that is ours for the taking.

Hopefully this week, you have received your Pledge Card. It is our "One Card, Two Pledges". We are going into our 5th year on our Capital Campaign. That is one pledge. The other pledge is for your on-going (weekly, monthly, etc.) support of the parish. We will collect them anytime but our Pledge Sunday is next weekend. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ B 1 Exodus 24:3-8

The Blood of the Covenant

To drink the blood of Christ is to perform a strong act of faith. Drinking human blood would be repulsive in any culture. But drinking divine blood is an act of faith.

Jesus specifically asked us to do this. "Take and drink," he said. "This is my blood." And, "If you do not drink my blood you have no life in you." Strong words.

Moses used blood as a sign of the covenant between Israel and God. After relating God's commands to the people, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Moses had some young men slaughter some young bulls as a peace offering. He sprinkled some of the blood on an altar. He sprinkled more of it on the people. Blood, the symbol of life, united the people with God in a committed covenant.

Moses told the people, "This is the blood of the covenant." Jesus told those gathered at the Last Supper, "This is the blood of the new and everlasting covenant."

When we drink the blood of Christ, we drink the source of life. We make firm our commitment with God. We say in our sip, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us."




