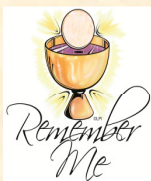

Job 38:1, 8-11

The Mystery of Suffering

As one generation passes to the next, we figure out more and more about life. Technological advances continue at record pace. Teenagers communicate through mediums their parents could only have dreamed about. The mysteries of the world are being unlocked.

Some people set science and religion at odds. When they could not figure out cures for illnesses, the management of energy, or the translation of languages, people assigned these mysteries to the wisdom of God. But in time, the mysteries became less mysterious. Human wisdom advanced. To some, it seemed that God was not as responsible as they once thought. To others, explanations for the mysteries of the universe strengthened their belief in God, who created and rules over all.

Job wanted an explanation. He didn't want algebra, calculus or engineering. He just wanted to know why so many catastrophes had befallen him. He lost his family, his property, and his health. He wanted to know why.

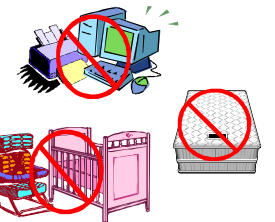
Job didn't get the answer he wanted. God basically told him, "I could explain it, but you wouldn't understand it." Instead he heard how God gave birth to the sea, wrapping it with clouds and darkness, and keeping it from spilling over the land. God set limits for the sea and fastened the bar of its door. Job could only conclude that God must know what is best. Job may never know the reasons, but he trusts that God does.
