



DISCOVERING CHRIST: ChristLife, an evangelization organization from Baltimore, MD, will be conducting a "Discovering Christ" training conference for our Diocese on August 21-22 to train parish teams in evangelization. ChristLife provides an effective evangelization videobased program that some have described as a Catholic alpha. It assumes nothing about a person's level of knowledge, introduction you to the purpose of life and especially life in Christ. You start with basic kerygma. It evangelizes and the course hosts function more as facilitators than leaders or catechists. Next weekend we will welcome Fr. Tom Shaugnessy, SSC who is a Columban missionary. St. Columba was an Irish monk who traveled to Europe to spread the Gospel. The Columban Fathers are also missionaries. Fr. Shaugnessy will share with us stories of his order's work around the world. A second collection will be taken up for their missionary endeavors.

Did you know that today's Gospel was the one that changed the life of St. Francis of Assisi? He was a wealthy young man who was so struck by Jesus' instruction to journey forth and preach the Gospel, taking nothing for the journey-not even food or money- that he gave away all his possessions and the rest is history!

My Dad introduced our family to the prayer of St. Francis and we have said it for years at the start of a family meal. It goes:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness joy.

Grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console: to be understood as to understand; to be love as to love; for it is in pardoning that we are pardoned; and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time B 1 Amos 7:12-15

God-given Words

"Get out of here!" No one likes to hear those harsh words. Wherever we go, we like the assurance that the place where we have arrived is hospitable. Sometimes we trespass. Sometimes we say offensive words. Sometimes we perform an action that separates us from the community. If we upset the host, we may hear those awful words, "Get out of here!"

That was the command that Amaziah the priest of Bethel leveled against the prophet Amos. Amos came from Tekoa of Judah in the southern part of the kingdom. At God's command he traveled to Bethel in the north to prophesy. He warned the people of God's judgment against them. The local priest didn't like hearing the message Amos brought. So Amaziah gave Amos a blunt and derisive retort: "Go home. Get out of Bethel. Go back to Judah. Prophesy there. Leave us alone."

There was one problem. Prophesying in Bethel wasn't Amos's idea in the first place. It was God's idea. God sent Amos from Judah to Bethel to bring divine judgment on the people.

Sometimes when people tell us to leave them alone, they are wrong. If God has given us words to speak, we stay and deliver them.

They encourage young people in various countries to become Columban priests and lay missionaries in order to continue spreading the Good News of God's love for all humanity.
