

### **Holy Water and Blessed Candles**



Dear Friends,

The month of February we will make Holy Water bottles available to all parishioners. I ask that you fill them with holy water, bless your home with it, even have a holy water font by the main door to your home or in each bedroom so that you and your children can bless themselves and remember God in a profound way everyday. Holy Water is a beautiful reminder of our Baptismal commitment. We have been given the grace of the Holy Spirit which opens the doors to salvation. We need to remind ourselves of this awesome gift and never be afraid to renew or remember our faith.

We will also make Blessed Candles available for those who wish them. The candle is a reminder of the Light of Christ which was handed to our god-parents and parents at our Baptism. It is a symbol of how we are to keep the light of Christ burning brightly as it casts away the darkness of evil. These candles can be lighted in times of tragedy, crisis, or sickness as a helpful reminder of God's presence amongst us.

Sacramentals (i.e. objects of faith—statues, medals, pictures of saints, crucifixes, etc.) which help draw us to Christ in small ways are important reminders of how our Faith is not only to be a Sunday event, but one celebrated in all aspects of our lives, especially in our homes. Our Faith cannot be an isolated, once-a-week event. What we profess, we live out. What we worship, we display to the world around us. Our Christian Faith is not an embarrassment, but a joy worth sharing and shouting about.

All these little things help to make the biggest thing—the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass—more important and prominent. Our goal is to save our souls—and by extension, the souls of our children and families. The Faith is worth the struggle. The world can't give you victory, but Jesus Christ can. Stick with Him and you can't go wrong.

### **Blessing of Throats**



In memory of St. Blaise a "Blessing of Throats" will be given at each Mass next weekend. This blessing is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick, and for those who need our prayers.

### Q: What is the origin of this blessing of the throats?

A: St. Blaise was a bishop of Schaste, Armenia, in modern Turkey, who was martyred for witnessing to the faith. He was tortured and beheaded for his beliefs by the local Roman governor around 316 AD. This is all that is known about him, the rest being legend. We know much more about devotion to the popularity of St. Blaise than historical facts.

The special blessing of throats associated with St. Blaise is due to a miracle attributed to him. While in prison, he miraculously saved a boy choking on a fish bone. Early in the sixth century, evidence exists in the Eastern Church that Blaise was prayed to for ailments of the throat. To this day, his feast is a holy day in the Eastern Church. In the ninth century, veneration of St. Blaise came to the Western Church and became very popular. Blessing of the throats with crossed candles began in the 1500's, the height of devotion to St. Blaise, and that blessing is still part of the devotion of the Catholic Church.

St. Blaise is a constant reminder to us of God's care and concern for us in our weakness, sickness, and limited human existence. God's healing touch is with us always. St. Blaise's celebration is one of the ways in which we highlight and thank God for that care and concern.

When praying for clarity in discernment, it can be helpful to reflect upon a method of prayer that was practiced by St. Ignatius of Loyola. It is said that when he would go to prayer, he would often envision himself before Christ in prayer much like a child who is present before a teacher. This is a beautiful way to view prayer because it helps us to recognize that we aren't the ones that are in charge and at the same time it helps us to focus on the fact that we have to be receptive in order for our prayer to make a difference in our lives. To put this into perspective, it wouldn't work too well if a child went into class one morning thinking that they had all of the answers. So too, if a child didn't trust what the teacher was presenting to them, then not much learning or growth would occur. Just as a child would fail to learn if they didn't humbly submit to the guidance of their teacher, we won't grow in our spiritual lives if we try to tell Christ what's best for us when we come to pray! So the next time that you seek God's guidance in your life, open up your heart and don't resist what you hear. Remember who the teacher is, trust in His knowledge, and allow yourself to be transformed by the knowledge that you acquire.


