Fr. Joe's Jottings

August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. It is a holy day but since it is on a Saturday it is not obligatory. Since there is a wedding on Friday evening along with the regular four Masses on the weekend – I have asked Fr. Ron Garry of St. John's, Ft. Pierre if he was offering the Holy Mass and if the good people of Ss. Peter and Paul could join him there. He is most gracious. I will be conducting a burial at Cavalry Cemetery at the same time.

Also in Sioux Falls there is the Legacy of Faith celebration acknowledging the 125th year for us as the diocese of Sioux Falls. The intent of the Bishop is that as many as possible of the faithful from throughout the diocese would attend. It is hoped that your family may be included. After residing here for 30 days I wish to express my gratitude for your hospitality and openness to a new pastor. Some have asked if another priest will be joining me and the answer is no. When we get to the final Day of Judgment God will be so pleased that so many have been so involved in parish life from childhood through adulthood. We never get too old to respond to the call of God in our lives.




