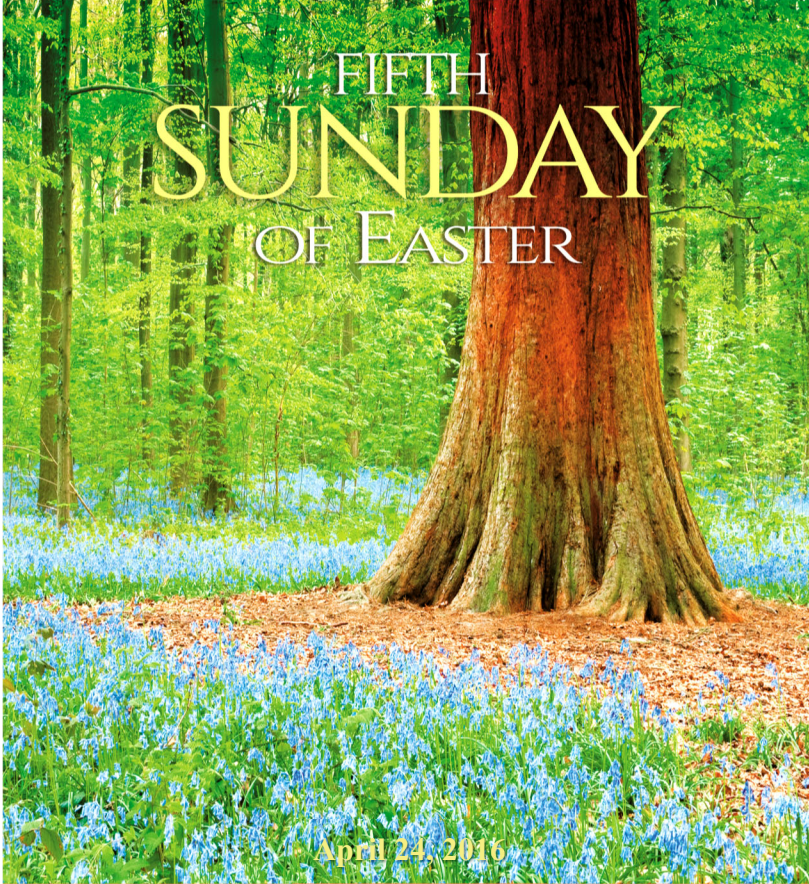

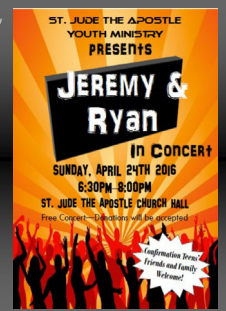

My dear parish family,

Summer is a dice-y time to try to start things, but there are some things that simply shouldn't be "put off".

Next month we will be opening up a time of inquiry for any baptized non-Catholic who wants to learn more about the Catholic Church, and who wonders if maybe God is calling him or her into the Catholic Church. There will be opportunities for the unbaptized and for Catholics who would like to receive their First Communion and/or be confirmed. But these particular sessions will be reserved for already baptized non-Catholic Christians.


Baptized non-Catholics are already members of The Family; we are even now one in God's family. What unites us as brothers and sisters of Jesus and daughters and sons of God our Father is far more significant than what divides us. But this doesn't mean that what divides us is insignificant. Most all the baptized can say "Amen" at the end of the Apostles' Creed and the Nicene Creed (which are often prayed in Protestant Churches as we pray them at Mass). But there are many areas of faith where there is some measure of disagreement between Christian Churches. Just to list a few of them: the number and the necessity of the sacraments, the authority of the pope and his brother bishops, the place that the mother of Jesus has in salvation history, the value of the prayers and the example of the saints,... Our summer sessions together will focus on those particular areas where there is disagreement between Christian Churches.

Our sessions will be held on Sunday mornings: in mid-May we will begin to gather after the 10:00 Mass. While it's inevitable that each of us involved will have to miss one session or another because of summer plans and commitments, this is actually just as true for most of us throughout the rest of the year, too. We hope to utilize the Internet between gatherings to prepare for and to supplement what is presented in our sessions, and to do a little remedial work when we've missed a session.



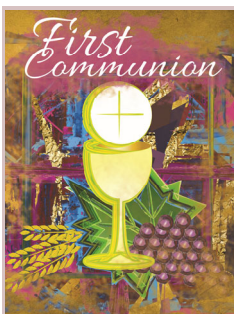

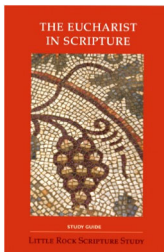

THURSDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY

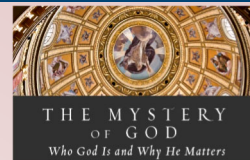

BISHOP ROBERT BARRON'S VIDEO SERIES CONTINUES - The Mystery of God - Who is God and Why does He matter?



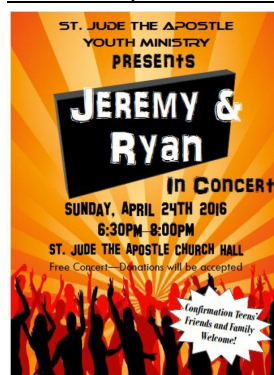
