



THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The grand and dramatic story of God comes into focus in today's readings. The passages from Acts and from the Gospel of Luke describe how Jesus' disciples began to understand how Jesus fits into the larger narrative of God, Israel, humanity, and all of creation. In the Gospel, Jesus interprets the scriptures for his followers. He shows how his seemingly shameful death was actually the fulfillment of God's promises. Jesus shows how his life, death, and resurrection are the surprising turning point of the scripture story. We, the Church today, find ourselves in the middle of this story. We first look back, to recall God's overflowing and steadfast love, beginning from Creation, through Christ, until today. We then look forward to the fulfillment, already launched by Jesus, of the Reign of God. With this perspective, we play our part in the drama, joining God to bring God's work to completion.

THE SURPRISE MESSIAH

After the crucifixion of Jesus, his disciples were in despair. Not only had they seen their master's horrible death, their own lives were now at risk, for the crucifixion suggested to them that Jesus was not the awaited Messiah after all. The Messiah had been envisioned as somehow coming in power, liberating Israel from foreign domination and signaling God's long-awaited return to dwell again with Israel. The Crucifixion suggested to them the possibility of God's rejection of Jesus, or Jesus' failure to achieve God's purposes. This is partly why the disciples were amazed when Jesus appeared. God had vindicated Jesus by raising him. The Resurrection revealed that God's promises were actually fulfilled, precisely through this death. Through the cross, God had indeed liberated the people from sin and death. God had truly returned, in Jesus and then later in the presence and activity of the Holy Spirit. The dominion of sin and death had been broken. The Resurrection was the first display of the new kingdom of God, in Jesus.

NOT FOR HEAVEN ONLY

In the Gospel passage, Jesus specifically emphasizes his bodily presence. He invites the disciples to touch him, and he eats some fish in front of them. He makes it clear that he is not a ghost and did not shed his physicality or his humanity when he was raised. The disciples began to understand Jesus in a new way. Christians later articulated this as Jesus' bodily resurrection. The resurrected Jesus, both human and divine, reigns both in heaven and on earth.

So when Jesus sent his disciples, and today sends all of us, to proclaim God's kingdom, he never means "for heaven only." God aims to renew, not reject, human bodies, human culture, and the created universe. God's project for us is here and now, within all the limitations and messiness of daily life. We are called to care for each other, for the earth, and for all God's beloved creation.







This Lenten Season was filled with GOOD NEWS as parishioners helped: many families and individuals without homes; kids in

difficult circumstances; and seniors at risk of becoming homeless through the Loaves and Fishes Ministry. In March, it all began when the Area 1 food collection donated 164 bags of food and more than \$3,500 to be converted to more food and paper goods.

- 1. Thank you to all who dropped food items into the grocery cart in the vestibule during the entire Lenten Season. An amazing 119 bags of food were collected!
- 2. 175 Care Bags were donated to Brother Joseph's outreach ministry.
- 3. Food was donated to fill the pantry at Lutheran Social Services where homeless citizens can stop by and use their kitchen to heat up easy-to-prepare foods.
- 4. Thanks to the team who went to Samaritan Center to measure individuals for new sneakers or work shoes, and to those who shopped and delivered the shoes.
- 5. Two homeless men were successful in finding work and shelter and were given appropriate clothing and gas cards for transportation to work.
- 6. A special thanks to the anonymous parish donor who provided the funds for a large bus to take 45 kids and 29 caregivers to visit fathers in Folsom Prison through the Get on the Bus program. And thanks to the team who packed 74 backpacks with activities and comfort items for the long ride, Stay-in-Touch bags, snack bags and breakfast bags. Much gratitude to Marlene, Ellen, Ethel and Cindy for providing 74 beautiful handmade blankets for the trip.
- 7. Jakk's Pacific Toys donated 750 toys for Easter baskets arranged by an anonymous friend of the parish. A team of volunteers which included Confirmation students and St. Jude School students prepared 511 baskets which were donated to farm worker's children (through Friends of Fieldworkers) and children in foster care (through Heart2Heart).
- 8. Brenda's Baskets donated 190 Easter baskets for seniors served by Catholic Charities OASIS program. L & F added food gift cards for each senior.
- 9. In addition, 695 baskets were donated to Adopt-a-Family Easter and 225 baskets were prepared with a generous donation from a parishioner. Sum total: 1621 Easter baskets were donated to Ventura County
- 10. St. Jude's Junior High Ministry packed 100 activity/ food bags for kids in a new program in Oxnard---Planting Hope started by Sister Cristina of the Notre Dame Sisters. They were most grateful for this donation to the new academic and personal enrichment program aimed at assisting and encouraging youth in a high risk area.

Let it be known: these are the **highlights!** There are numerous generous things happening monthly---recycling, 650 sandwiches made and distributed, Panera bread picked up and donated, eyeglasses and clothing donated, bicycles donated and repaired for use, hotel toiletries collected. It is always uplifting to account for the wonderful ways in which St. Jude parishioners reach out to our struggling brothers and sisters.




