UNITY. What does "unity" mean? For those of us who claim Christ as our model of living and savior of humanity, it means we are one. This year the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has as its theme the Scripture citation 2 Corinthians 5:14-20. The first line contains our mission statement... "For the love of Christ impels us, once we have come to the conviction that one died for all; therefore all have died." If that is not a mandate for unity, then there is none. We are one in the death of Christ and therefore live in unity with all other Christians.

God, who are unity in three holy persons--Father, Son, and Holy Spirityou have called us to live in peace with all people.
You have also called us to work toward unity in purpose to spread the Gospel to all nations.
Graciously give us the courage and strength to work toward unity,
and act toward each other as brothers and sisters.

We ask this in the unity of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

"Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God." John the Baptist had an important message to impart. He was called by God to prepare the people of Israel to recognize Jesus' true identity. In a sense, he helped establish credibility for Christ by confirming that he was in fact the Messiah. Jesus didn't just have to claim it on his own; John also "testified" to the fact. We, of course, also benefit from the witness of John the Baptist recorded for us in the Gospels. And we have additional witnesses from the rest of the people throughout the Gospels who knew and recognized Jesus as the Son of God. But we also have the benefit of two thousand years of Church history! We have countless testimonies of saints and believers throughout the centuries who have known Jesus in their own lives and acted accordingly.



This raises two questions. First, are we willing to believe these testimonies from those who have gone before us? Consider how much credence we give to the experiences and the stories of our forefathers and foremothers in the faith--whether they are blood relatives or members of the larger communion of saints. Sometimes these personal accounts of coming to know the Lord are much more powerful than any "proof" or intellectual proposal about Christianity. They do require a degree of faith and trust, but they nonetheless provide us with real evidence about the impact of being close to Christ.

Secondly, let us consider whether or not we are willing to give testimony to who Christ is to us? It's one thing to believe in Jesus; it's another thing to share that faith with others. But like John the Baptist, we are called to share the truth so that others may come to believe.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

It is important to know who we are and from where we come. Having a clear sense of identity allows us to make choices that further express and develop our ultimate purpose and goals. We are reminded today of Jesus' unique identity as God's Son and that by our baptism we are given the gift of sharing in that same intimate relationship with God. May knowledge of this make a difference in how we live our lives!

THE JUSTICE CORNER

What Do We Mean By Justice?

A classic definition of Justice is that it is "the strong will and commitment on the part of each of us to give every person his or her due as a child of God".

We practice Justice when we implement this definition.

What is meant by our "due" as a child of God? That what God gave each of us at the time of our creation – the gift of an intrinsic and permanent worthiness and dignity because He made us in His own image – must be honored by all others. It means that we have an innate right to be treated with dignity and a responsibility to treat others with dignity. It means also that whenever the dignity of one or a group of God's children is diminished – by poverty, or violence, or character assassination, or for any reason - the rest of us are called to try to take some action to repair that dignity to the extent we are able. More on this in subsequent columns.

God's call for us to develop a "strong will and commitment" to Justice implies that we learn about the Justice principles of Jesus and His Church to help guide our actions, and that we pay attention to what's happening in our society with respect to Justice and Justice issues.

We hope that the Justice Corner will help you as you strive to play your part in understanding and practicing Justice.


Help children communicate by reading between the lines ~ When children express that something is wrong at school or with other activities, it's often the job of caregivers to read between the lines to

determine what's really going on. They might say "I'm bored" and need your guidance finding a better school-life balance or engaging in more challenging academic work. Ask them to give examples and to help you understand what is going on. If the child is still being vague, remind them that they can tell you anything and that you'll listen with an open mind. As parents and caregivers, you have the opportunity to help kids deal well with negative feelings and challenges. And, if they are being mistreated in some way, keeping an open line of communication with kids will enable you to be their advocate. 
