





When Moses went up Mount Sinai, God revealed the divine Self to him by name. "The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God" (Exodus 34:6). In the Old Testament, we are accustomed to assuming that the "Lord Goo" indicates the Father only. But in the retrospect with which we look at these readings, we can see that the title is inclusive of the three persons of the Trinity. Never has there been any separation of the three persons in one God, and although there may be mention of only one person, it is understood that all three persons are present. Jesus taught many times that he and the Father are one, and that the Holy Spirit would come upon us and remind us of all things. We believe in God, creator of all that is, the Son, redeemer of our human lives and giver of eternal life, and the Holy Spirit, inspiration of the prophets and lover of all humanity; holy Wisdom, inspiring in us the understanding of all things holy.

everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life," we begin to see how language that expresses the sending of the Son fails to express the unity of the Holy Trinity. This failure of human language in the presence of the mystery of the Trinity is what makes it so hard to explain and comprehend.

So how can we respond when we see a reference to "God"? We can strive to remember that God is three persons, not just one as we are, but one in being. Our best response is praise to the Holy Trinity. "Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, to God who is, who was, and who is to come." And we can bless each other when we pray with Saint Paul, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you" (2 Corinthians 13:13).

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Trinity

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." We are used to this profound idea, so used to it that we often glaze over the incredible reality: God the Father has a Son who became man and dwelt among us! Too often we blithely make the sign of the cross in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, without realizing what a radical theology we are announcing.

Only Christianity proclaims a triune God. Only Christianity professes that we have one God in three divine persons. Only Christianity declares that the very nature of God is to be relational and literally "personal." Why does this matter? Because we are made in God's image, as the opening chapters of Genesis tell us. We, therefore, are made in the image of this Trinitarian God who IS love. We are built to be like this God! Just as God the Father loves God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, we too are called to love one another. In fact, we are not fulfilling our nature and design when we don't. And just as God loved the world (that is, us!) so too we are called to love him in return.

We don't have to embrace this image in which we were made, of course. God gave us freedom so that our love can be real, but this means our choices really matter. We can decide not to reflect God's interpersonal love in the world. We can opt not to return the love that God pours out to each of us. But this can only lead to disappointment in the end. After all, God sent his Son so that "everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Ultimately, this means spending eternity in the Trinitarian embrace of love. So why not start now?


- Families with students in 1<sup>st</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> grade will join our Family Faith program

#### The Justice Corner

#### Poverty and Hunger - Part II

In our last Column in the Bulletin we discussed poverty and hunger in the world and the United States. Many were surprised at the magnitude of these problems, that literally hundreds of millions of people are suffering from both poverty and severe malnutrition, that several million children under six are dying each year of starvation, and that billions have to live on less than two dollars a day – almost all of them in the developing world. But we believe it. We don't dispute it.

Many are also surprised that we have 43 million people in poverty in this country, according to our government. But many of us don't believe this. Many, of course do. Therefore in the U.S. we have both a poverty and hunger problem and a perception problem. This makes it more difficult for us to deal with hunger and poverty, because many of us are not sure that we even have one.


So for today's Column, in the short space we have, we'll address what's been happening across the oceans. We'll come back to the U.S. situation later.


There is good news. The United Nations has had a major program going since 2000 to reduce poverty and hunger- the Millennium Project - and it is working. Instead of 2 billion people with extreme poverty, as in 1990, we now have 800 million. And severe malnutrition has been reduced by almost half. Another UN program has been started with the hope of eliminating extreme poverty by 2030. As the Irish say, praise God, but much more needs to be done, and you will be hearing more.




