



PENTECOST SUNDAY

The feast of Pentecost invites us to reflect prayerfully upon the Holy Spirit. Our readings today reveal three distinct views of the Holy Spirit. In Acts, the Spirit moves powerfully and unpredictably, sometimes in disorienting ways, to renew the world. In Paul, the Spirit unites the church in Jesus into one body, and provides many varied and complementary gifts to the church. In John, the Spirit continues the healing and forgiving presence of Jesus, and empowers his followers to extend the ministry of Jesus to the whole world. Pentecost teaches us that the Holy Spirit speaks and acts in many ways: to comfort us, to shake us up, and to open us to something new. Always, the Spirit is communicating God's love. Just like those who first heard God's proclamation in many languages, we might hear the Spirit who penetrates our hearts, speaking the many languages of love.

ENCOUNTERING CULTURE

We listen today, in Acts, of how very diverse individuals, all Jewish, heard the proclamation of Jesus in their own languages. These were likely diaspora Jews who had lived in other lands and had learned different languages and cultures. Throughout the book, the author of Acts is hinting at what will happen later. The Good News will be received by different peoples and cultures. There will be dialogue between Jesus' message and each culture, and the message will take root within the culture. Many persons will reject Jesus, but those who accept him will learn to proclaim Jesus, and join in the Spirit's work of transforming the culture.

We too are invited to join God's mission in our own culture, approaching with both humility and boldness. We are to be servants, companions, and sometimes prophets, always with charity and openness. The Spirit calls us both to engage in dialogue with others and to proclaim Jesus with our lives.

GIFTS TO BE SHARED

Through Paul's ministry in Corinth, the Christian community there had sprung up quickly. A variety of spiritual gifts were enthusiastically shared. But that variety led to arguments among them. Some believed that some gifts, such as speaking in tongues, were more important. Those with certain gifts gained honor and status in the community.

In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul challenged this. He wrote that all are gifted, and all gifts come from the Holy Spirit. The gifts, though quite varied, are fundamentally equal in importance. They have one shared purpose, to proclaim and live the good news of Jesus.

Each of us is invited to consider how the Spirit has given us gifts within the Church to participate in God's mission in the world. Our gifts are valuable and distinctly ours. But they are no better or worse than the gifts of others. All are given to serve our common purpose. With both humility and boldness, let us share our gifts.



Campus Security Project for St. Jude the Apostle School

Back in 1982, our founding pastor Monsignor O' Connell had the ground breaking vision to build St. Jude's School. Without a doubt, his vision has been grasped and expanded upon based on the needs of our ever changing community. Since its founding 35 years ago, St. Jude's school has undergone several modifications. Each modification planned and measured to fit the needs of its students. With each layer of progression, our children have benefited as a result. Once again, our school is due for another advancement. This time, it's in the form of campus security. We can all agree, there is nothing more important in this world to the parents and parishioners of St Jude's School than the well-being and safety of our children.

Our security program will consist of creating a perimeter using wrought Iron fencing, vehicular gates, and personal gates that will control who is allowed access while school is in session. While school is in session, these gates will be closed. Wrought Iron has been selected as the material of choice for this project due to the fact that it is not easily breached or vandalized. Moreover, it maintains visibility. On weekends, for this busy parish, the fences will be rolled back to allow maximum use of the parish parking lot.

Here are the goals of the security fencing, gate and access control security plan:

- 1) Designating the school grounds as a well-defined. carefully maintained space that deserves respect.
- 2) Further enabling and expanding video surveillance by school staff.
- 3) Modernizing our safety systems and providing more efficiency.
- 4) Limiting access to areas that are not highly visible.
- 5) Restricting entry and exit points to a few easily monitored areas.

To help you visualize the scope of the future project we have put together a site plan and renderings outlining where the new fencing, vehicular gates, and personal gates will be located. We are in the process of obtaining firm bids for the work from several local contractors. This project will be phased over a period of time based on the gracious and kind support of our St. Jude the Apostle Community.

St. Jude's Prayer Shawl Ministry



UPDATE: It's always gratifying to share all the wonderful things happening through our generous parishioners and capable Loaves and

Fishes coordinators in one month's time. The month started with a BIG food collection in our SMALLEST geographical area: 169 bags of food and \$1,710 were collection in Area 2. Thank you, Area 2 Team and donors! Things only got more exciting from there.

Thanks to **all** who donated, coordinated and delivered for all the projects below:

- Bikes 4 Kids was busy cleaning, repairing and delivering bikes for transportation to work and school: 2 bikes to Catholic Charities Moorpark, 1 bikes to Many Mansions Casa de Paz in Simi Valley, 2 bikes to Lutheran Social Services, and 1 bike to James Storehouse.
- 2) White Oak Elementary School had a bike collection for Earth Day and donated 4 bikes and one scooter for us to share. Thanks to those students!
- Diapers were delivered for a baby diagnosed with leukemia whose family is being served by Friends of Fieldworkers.
- 4) Sheets, towels, and shower curtains were donated to Many Mansions for an influx of families moving into affordable housing.
- 5) The First Communion Clothing Collection was a huge success serving 47 children through MICOP, Catholic Charities Moorpark, SOX/Port Hueneme and some local children.
- 6) For their April service project, our Junior High Ministry packed 72 "start-up kits" for children going into foster care. The kits contain clothing, pjs, toiletries, a teddy bear and a blanket, as children are often taken from their homes suddenly with only the clothing on their backs. These kits were donated to James Storehouse, Heart 2 Heart and Kids and Families.
- 7) A large donation devoted to serving the homeless made it possible to visit Oxnard Rescue Mission and measure the feet of their homeless population for new shoes. Thanks to the parishioners who helped to measure, shop, and deliver 102 pair of shoes and to the children in a parish family who have made a tradition of coming with us to hand out new socks to the recipients.
- 8) The month ended celebrating the success of a huge Service Day with 24 adults and 4 kids going to two sites to help seniors with projects indoors and out. They sorted, cleaned, washed windows, painted, did yard work and generally made the senior recipients feel appreciated and cared for. Thank you to our great coordinator and all those who turned out for the morning.

need a helping hand, gifts at Christmas, coats when it's cold, a roof over their heads, Easter blessings or candy, or simply, a few dollars for school.


