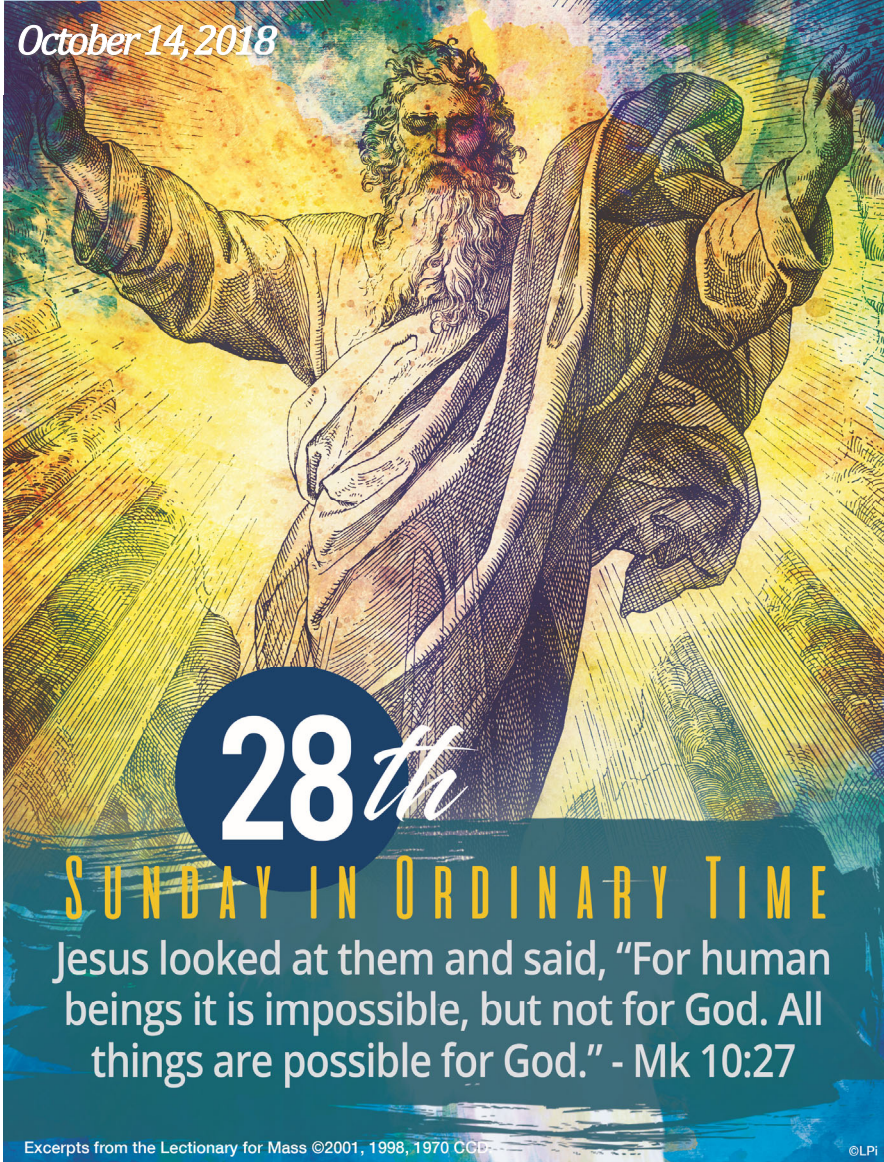

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today is the Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time. It begins a period of reflection on the meaning of "riches" for individuals and communities. We read a love song to the spirit of wisdom. The Psalm and Hebrews both continue this meditation on wisdom and the Word of God. Mark personalizes these reflections by the story of a good man who wants only to move closer to eternal life but finds his way blocked by his own success. He walks away sadly from Jesus. The choice could not be clearer but even a good man, recognized as such by Jesus, finds it impossible to uproot himself from his possessions. The lesson is both about the treasure that is Wisdom, that is eternal life, that is Jesus, and the power of our attachment to things that are not eternal. We must choose again and again which path we will make our own.

SPIRIT OF WISDOM

The first reading is about wisdom. It is a love poem written to the object of the author's desire. The author loves wisdom itself and experiences wisdom as the source of all good things, all riches. The psalm tells us that wisdom is kindness. It is knowing and doing the work of God. It is understanding what our life is for. Hebrews recognizes that Wisdom is, in fact, the Word of God, Jesus. The source of our continuing life is Jesus. Mark makes this even more personal with the story of one man. A good man who has observed the laws from his youth, even in the loving presence of Jesus, cannot find the strength to leave his worldly possession behind and follow.

LETTING GO

Who does not strive to be successful? What good person does not want to be able to provide for their family all the necessities of life, to assure that they will have the means to feed, clothe, shelter, educate, and care for themselves and those they love as well as help their neighbors, strangers, the needy? Isn't that what is asked of us, to love God and our neighbor as ourselves? The readings today make clear that even more is required of us. We must do all those things and we must realize that doing so is only the first step to understanding what is at the center our lives. We must realize that our accomplishments are not the measure of our value and worth. However successful or unsuccessful we are, our worth is measured by the truth that Jesus suffered, died, and rose for us. To truly know that, we must let go of everything else that roots us in time, space, and expectation and be willing to follow eternity.

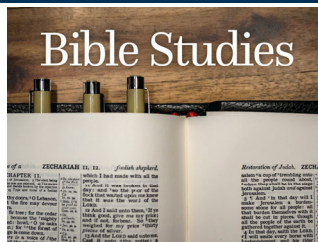

National Fire Prevention Month

Fire was the great scourge of American cities in the 19th century. As the country's population grew, compressed tenements and multistory factories posed a growing risk to life and property if fire struck.



Insurers and municipalities worked together to protect public safety. Even with the vastly improved building codes of today, fire safety remains a concern. Protect your family by following these simple steps:

- 1) Install working smoke alarms in your home, AND change the batteries twice a year.
- 2) Do not overload circuits by the use of multiple extension cords. Always inspect extension cords for wear and never place them under rugs or mats.
- 3) Do not leave burning candles unattended. Always extinguish them when you leave a room.
- 4) When cooking, do not leave stoves unattended.
- 5) Never barbecue in a garage or other enclosed structure.
- 6) Have a home fire extinguisher; know how to use it; and check it regularly to ensure that it is still charged.
- 7) Always call 911 in the event of a fire. Never presume that you can handle it yourself.

Each year a different theme on fire prevention is chosen and promoted by the National Fire Protection Association. You can learn ways to keep your family safe from the dangers of fire by visiting the NFPA website at www.nfpa.org.

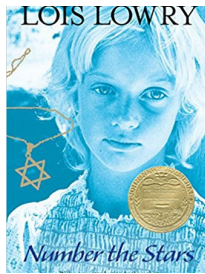

Did You Know? The Importance of Emotional Boundaries We discuss the importance of physical boundaries quite a bit, teaching children to understand privacy and the difference between good touches and bad touches. But emotional boundaries are just as important, if not more so, because abuse victims are often manipulated into trusting and believing their abusers. Predators can violate emotional boundaries fairly easily, worming their way into a child's life and creating a false relationship. Parents should talk to their children about appropriate boundaries for their emotional relationships — with teachers, the parents of their friends, and other adults in their lives. Children do not always have the emotional maturity to set their own boundaries, so parents should be on the lookout for anything that seems inappropriate or "off" about the relationships their children form with other adults. 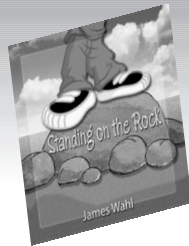

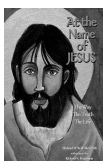
