


INCREASED OFFERTORY PROGRAM

My dear parish family,

Six years ago I had no idea that I was being sent to the most colossally generous parish in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. But St. Jude's has endlessly impressed me ever since becoming pastor here with an astonishing outreach to both local and global needs. Sunday after Sunday I come before our parish family to ask you to extend your generosity (to hurricane victims in Texas, to a mission church in Uganda, to all the variety of needs presented to us by our Loaves and Fishes crew, to the neediest and poorest parishes and schools in the archdiocese through participation in the Together In Mission Annual Appeal,...), and every appeal has been responded to with a faithful generosity, and warm compassion, and the question, "Is there anything else we can do?" I'm writing this letter to you today to make you aware of another need that I've never voiced here at St. Jude's. Today I'm asking that you consider your parish family as a focus for your regular, dependable generosity. I'm not asking because I need a raise. You pay me a most generous stipend which is more than I deserve. I'm not asking because of some particular needs of the church building or the parish plant. Our parishioners over the years have provided us with a beautiful church and wonderful campus of resource buildings. I'm asking you to consider what you might consider donating to your parish family for the simple day-to-day needs that our parish family has: the



practical necessity of keeping the lights on and the doors open and the air conditioning (ahem) on, the need for ongoing faith formation both for kids and for adults, the need to support our wonderful liturgical worship team,...

Please take some time to review the contents of a special brochure available at Mass today, and prayerfully consider how you might contribute to the stability and growth of our terrific parish community. The goal of this effort is to substantially increase our regular offertory contributions. Other parishes that have conducted similar programs have seen their offertory increase between 20% and 40%. NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

The administration of St. Jude the Apostle School is responsible for determining the admission of students. Non-Discrimination Policy

Mindful of its mission to form young people in the image of Christ, St. Jude the Apostle School admits students of any race, color, and national and/or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at this school. St. Jude the Apostle School does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, and national and/or ethnic origin, age, sex or disability in administration of educational policies and practices. Likewise, St. Jude the Apostle School does not discriminate against any applicant for employment on the basis of sex, age, handicap, veteran status, race, color, or national and/or ethnic origin.

Inclusion

Catholic inclusive education is both a goal and a method by which archdiocesan schools, through administration and education, create classrooms that value the uniqueness of all students.

Catholic inclusive schools:

- Realize that all children within a classroom have special Godgiven strengths and needs.
- Create a learning environment that is safe, accepting, and caring, where differences are seen as challenges and opportunities for growth.
- Utilize strategies for teaching and learning that maximize each child's participation, development and interaction.
- Manage the classroom and school environment to best provide for the widest variety of learners within the parameters of the school's resources.
- Demonstrate awareness of the wider issues, such as parent involvement, networks, support personnel (both within and outside the school), and attitudinal development.

It is to be understood that due to limited resources, St. Jude the Apostle School may not be able to provide an appropriate educational environment for students needing additional support. If outside resources are needed and would supply the necessary support for the student to remain at St. Jude the Apostle, the parent/guardian would be responsible for providing those resources. The needs of each student applying for admission must be considered. Parents/Guardians must understand that St. Jude the Apostle school may not be the best educational setting for their child.






