





# **Pastor's Letter**

This letter is a bit shorter because I was away from Cambridge for a seminar in Tulsa, Oklahoma, during the first part of this past week.

As you might have heard me mention in past homilies and letters that we moved to Tulsa when I was just going into my freshman year of high school. We lived there as a whole family for five years as my father worked and taught at Oral Roberts University. After I started at Oklahoma State University and between my freshman and sophomore years of college, the rest of the family packed up and moved to Steubenville when Dad started teaching at Franciscan University. I continued to live in Oklahoma and eventually joined the Diocese of Tulsa as a seminarian, intending to serve there as a priest. This past week's seminar gave me a great opportunity to visit with good friends from that time when I lived in Oklahoma. And, the seminar where the convention was held was where my high school prom had been some 35 years ago in the spring of 1983!

Please join us this evening at 7:00 p.m. at St. Benedict Church as we are hosting this week's Guernsey Association of Churches Lenten Ecumenical Prayer Service. Rev. Jeff Bergeson, the pastor at Unity Presbyterian, will preach. We will follow the basic outline of an Evening Prayer/Vespers format. At the conclusion of the prayer service there will be an opportunity both for some fellowship in our social hall and some time for individual prayer offered by both Rev. Bergeson and me for relief from various burdens, especially any emotional or spiritual heaviness. That can be seen as foreshadowing of next Sunday's Mass readings that will emphasize that Our Lord came into our world to free us from the heaviness of sin and death: for God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life.

Thanks, again, for all who put countless hours and great effort into making this year's St. Benedict School Auction a success, a blessing for our School and community and a truly fun event.

A great follow-up event is this week's St. Benedict School Open House, on Thursday, March 8th, from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. This is a great way to meet the teachers and staff and get a feel for the mission of the School firsthand, including the Preschool, which is enjoying a highly successful first year.

May the Lord help us to walk together ever more peaceful and joyful, always ready, for the gift of eternal life!

# READINGS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT March 11, 2018

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son that we might have life. As we continue on our Lenten journey, let us turn to the Lord who is rich in mercy and compassion.

We live in a world broken by a false sense of worth based on the work ethic and personal accomplishment. Our new life in Christ is God's free gift to us.

In the reading from **Ephesians**, Paul assures us that our salvation is not a commodity we have earned or worked for. We have been taken out of darkness into the light, freely. We choose to live a life of good deeds—not to earn salvation, but as a fitting thanksgiving because we have been saved.

The gospel reminds us that this free gift was given through the ultimate act of love—the giving of one's life, freely. Christ, lifted up on the cross, is our reminder that

we have been saved, gratuitously, by him.

# We pause next week in our Sunday Mass

**Readings** from the focus on the successive 4 kinds of covenants described in the First Reading. Instead, we observe Laetare Sunday. That will be one of the two times each year when our liturgical color shifts from purple to rose. It is a kind of oasis in the middle of the Lenten desert, a drink of refreshment to help us to persevere with our Lenten disciplines. And, key to this drink of refreshment is love!

Next Sunday's Gospel for, again, the 4th Sunday of Lent, is from the well-known passage of John 3:16, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son...," quoted further below. Pope Benedict XVI gave a reflection on this passage during the Way of the Cross held at the Coliseum in Rome on Good Friday, April 10, 2009.

"The anguish of the Passion of the Lord Jesus cannot fail to move to pity even the most hardened hearts, as it constitutes the [high point] of the revelation of God's love for each of us. Saint John observes: God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life (Jn. 3:16).

"It is for **love** of us that Christ dies on the cross! Throughout the course of the millennia, a great multitude of men and women have been drawn deeply into this mystery and they have followed him, making in their turn, like him

and with his help, a gift to others of their own lives. They are the saints and the martyrs, many of whom remain unknown to us. Even in our own time, how many people, in the silence of their daily lives, unite their sufferings with those of the Crucified One and become apostles of a true spiritual and social renewal! What would [our human family] be without Christ? Saint Augustine observes: 'You would still be in a state of wretchedness, had he not shown you mercy. You would not have returned to life, had he not shared your death. You would have passed away had he not come to your aid.' So why not welcome him into our lives?

"Let us pause...to contemplate his disfigured face: it is the face of the Man of Sorrows. His face is reflected in that of every person who is humiliated and offended, sick and suffering, alone, abandoned and despised. Pouring out his blood, he has broken the solitude of our tears. He has entered into our every grief and our every anxiety.

"Brothers and Sisters! As the cross rises up on Golgotha, the eyes of our faith are already turned towards the dawning of the new Day, and we begin to taste the joy and splendor of Easter."

May the Lord help our observance of Lent, both this week and next, help us to place our faith in Him, that we may receive the gift of His merciful love for us and for the world, leading to His gift of eternal life.


