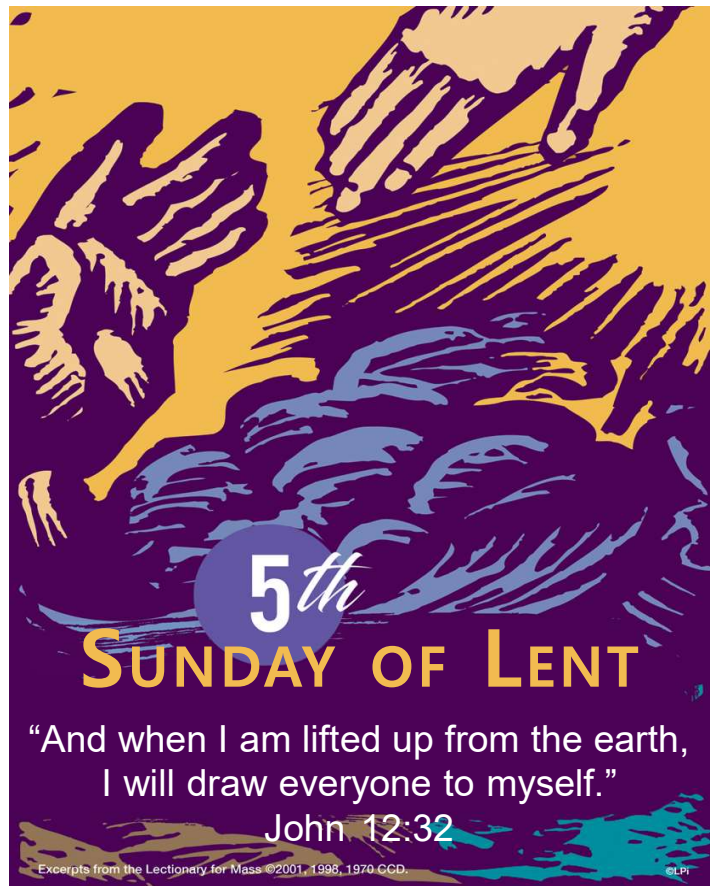
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Parish School of Religion (PSR) classes for children in grades K through 12 are held Sunday mornings from September to May.

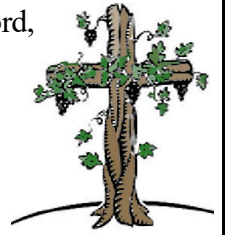

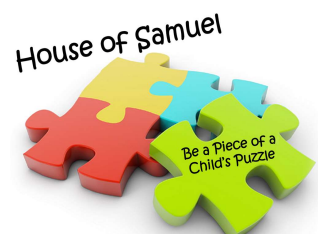

READINGS FOR PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

March 25, 2018

“My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?” These words spoken by Jesus on the cross reveal the depths of the suffering our Savior endured for our sins. As we enter into the passion of our Lord Jesus Christ, let us cry out for mercy and pardon for our sins.

We live in a world broken by pride and false identity.

The gospel for the Procession with Palms (Mark 11:1-10) is a beautiful hymn of unconditional love, the creed of those who would “think and live like Christ.” Jesus, eternal God, humbled himself to be identified with humankind—the humankind that would lead him to his passion. Those who sought their own importance humiliated Jesus and denied his identity—Messiah, beloved Son, Temple of God. Savior of the world. They put him to death but God raised him up



and proclaimed his true identity—Jesus Christ is Lord!

Isaiah 50:4-7

I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame.

- How have you experienced being asked to sacrifice for someone else?

Phillipians 2:6-11

He emptied himself taking the form of a slave, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

- For what or whom would you lay down your life?

Mark 14:1-15:47

The passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- Take time this week to read the passion according to St. Mark.

We could place our focus during next Sunday’s readings on several points.

We could focus on the entrance of Jesus into the city of Jerusalem and on much symbolism and fulfillment of prophecies described by St. Mark. Or, we could put our focus on the Passion Narrative that we read next Sunday as well. Palm Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday. We could probably call it “*Full Range of Emotions*” Sunday! That could help us to connect some of the various points.

As Jesus enters into Jerusalem in chapter 11 of the Gospel of St. Mark, which is the opening Gospel that we read at the door of the church at the beginning of the Palm Sunday Mass, we read that Jesus arrived from the side of the city of Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives. Fr. Robert Barron points out that this harkens to the Old Testament prophet Ezekiel and his description both of when the glory of the Lord left the Temple and when it would return. Jesus’ return to Jerusalem was indeed celebrated with a sense of hope that the glory of Israel was returning and that Jesus would ultimately drive out the Roman conquerors.

But, Jesus came to prepare for a more profound kingdom. Yes, the Temple did feature in the time between Jesus’ arrival into Jerusalem and his death later in the week on Good Friday. The Passion Narrative that we read from St.

Mark begins in chapter 14. Among the events described in the chapters and verses between his arrival into Jerusalem and his death and resurrection is the cleansing of the Temple. Then, as Jesus was on the cross the people who jeered at him said, “Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, save yourself by coming down from the cross.” At the moment of Jesus’ death we read that the sanctuary veil in the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. At his death, Jesus passed through the veil of the heavenly Temple, according the New Testament Letter to the Hebrews (6:19, 8:1-6), fulfilling the sacrifices offered in the Temple in Jerusalem.

The Temple in Jerusalem can also represent our souls. So, the return of Jesus and the purification of the Temple followed by his death and resurrection can describe the Lord establishing a more profound kingdom in each of our hearts. He wants to reign at the very center of our hearts and lives. During Lent we ask the Lord to triumph over those aspects of our lives that are like the people who jeered at Jesus, disappointed at the way that he reigns, wanting more of an earthly kingdom rather than one that is a preparation for the gift of eternal life.

May next week’s “*Full Range of Emotions*” Sunday, both the Palm Sunday aspects and the Passion Sunday aspects, help us to become more open to the reign of the Lord in our hearts, in the way that he knows is best for us.

Pastor's Letter

Regarding Mass times for Easter 2018, like the last couple of years, think “8, 10 and 12,” “8, 10 and 12.” Please spread the word about our Mass times for Easter. We are planning to have 3 Easter Sunday Masses here in Cambridge at 8:00 & **10:00 a.m.**, and **12:00 Noon**. The Easter Sunday Mass at Sts. Peter & Paul in Lore City is also at **10:00 a.m.**

We also have the Easter Vigil Mass at 8:00 p.m. on Saturday evening, March 31st, at St. Benedict Church. If you have never attended an Easter Vigil Mass, I encourage you to attend for the sake of experiencing the “anchor” Mass of the Church year.

At each Easter Mass we have a renewal of our baptism promises. This can be a very spiritually powerful way to renew and deepen our relationship with the Lord, making promises that were often made as an infant or renewed as a junior high or high school student at Confirmation, more consciously one’s own. We believe that eternal salvation in Heaven is ultimately a gift of God. That is one key reason we celebrate those sacraments when we are younger. And, because Lent historically has roots in adults preparing for Baptism and Confirmation at Easter (recall the sign of the Cross in ashes received on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday, which is a reminder of the first step of the Rite of Baptism – without the ashes, of course), one of the key focuses of Lent is to prepare for renewing our baptism promises. The graces received as a gift when

we are younger is to be renewed and deepened as we celebrate Jesus’ victory over sin and death on Easter Sunday.

A great way to prepare for that renewal of baptismal promises is by participating in our parish Lenten Reconciliation Service, tomorrow, Monday, March 19th, at 7:00 p.m. at St. Benedict Church. We should have 6 priests available for this sacrament, including Msgr. Coyne, Msgr. Froehlich and Fr. Pabin.

We are planning to have some renewed landscaping around and in the front of St. Benedict Church, completed before Easter Sunday, weather willing. And, some spring clean up is planned for the cemeteries.

Tonight, Sunday, March 18th, I will preach at the weekly Lenten Ecumenical Prayer Service at 7:00 p.m. at Lore City United Methodist Church for the Guernsey Association of Churches. Please keep the cooperation of our area churches in prayer as we try to respond to the many needs in our county and beyond by coordinating outreach ministries and by worshipping together as we are able. Thank you for all who participated when we hosted that prayer service a couple of Sundays ago, all who attended, our musicians and all who provided food for the fellowship afterward in the social hall.

May the Lord help us to continue journeying together, alive in Jesus Christ, always ready for the gift of eternal life.
