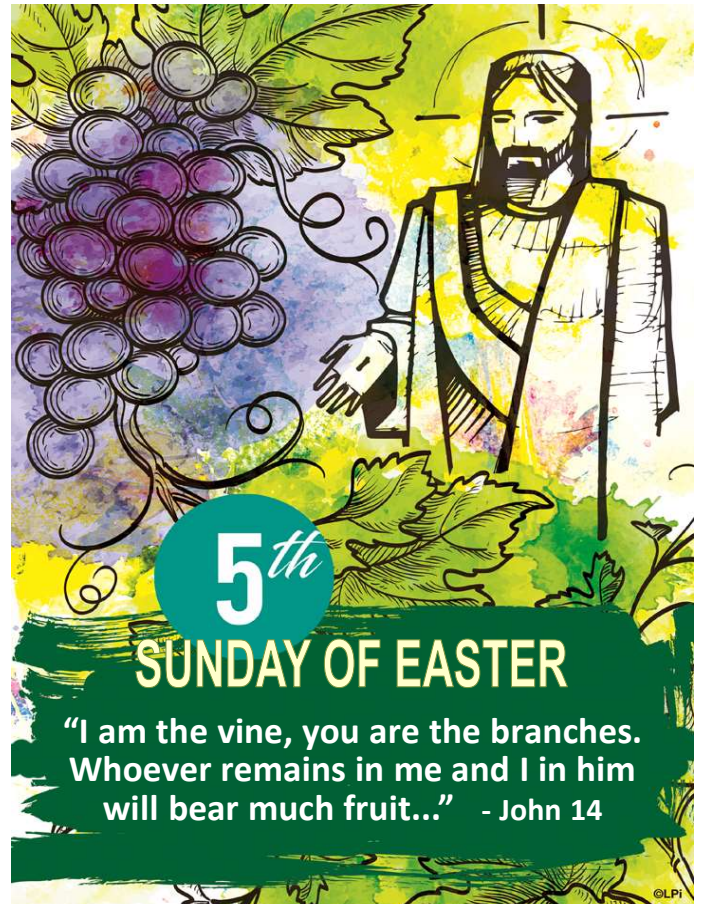
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Parish School of Religion (PSR) classes for children in grades K through 12 are held Sunday mornings from September to May.

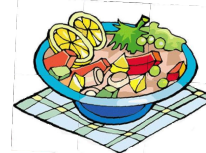

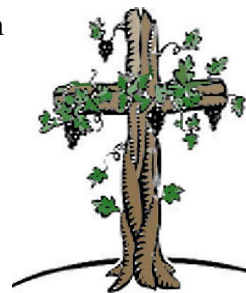

Pastor's Letter

As mentioned a couple of weeks ago, we were waiting for news from the parish in Caracol, Haiti, as to what would be the best focus for another round of support for them. Should we focus on supporting their agricultural and farming needs or focus on raising funds to help them reopen a health clinic that has been closed due to lack of funds? One of their key parish volunteers said the following in an email message last week:

"The news for the possible revival of the clinic is very gratifying and will provide a long term impact in the neighborhood. This will also help those who now have to venture further away to a treatment site and have to use odd travel modes at times of crisis."

The kind of local illnesses they would like to be able to treat are malaria, typhoid, flu, tuberculosis, high blood pressure, diabetes and other typical pains and infections. They hope to restock a full range of medical supplies for the clinic, such as vision test cards, ointments for bruises, toothbrushes, aprons, gloves, masks as well as filing cabinets, folding cots, wheelchairs and check-up tables.

So, let us simply do what we can! Next week we will have our monthly collection "for those in need" and on Mother's Day weekend our Catholic Women's Club will have a collection for participating in a number of their out-reach initiatives. Therefore, I'd like to wait until the weekend of May 19th/20th before announcing more about collecting for the health clinic for St. Elisabeth Parish in Caracol. However, please feel free to do as we did for raising funds for their school in the fall. Please feel free to contribute at your convenience throughout May and June by placing an envelope labeled *"Haiti health care clinic"* or *"St. Elisabeth Health Clinic"* in the regular collection. And, if you'd like to contribute by writing a check, you could write the check to *"Christ Our Light Parish"* with a similar note designating it for the health clinic on the memo line.

On a very different note, please continue providing input on ways we can improve the security around our church campuses. We will be working on additional signage around our parking lots and buildings and developing procedures for securing our doors and access points during Mass times. We have already started locking the outer church doors once Mass begins when we have a school Mass. Thank you for your input, vigilance and patience.

May the Lord help us to continue journeying together, alive in Jesus Christ, always ready for the gift of eternal life.

READINGS FOR THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

May 6, 2018

The call to discipleship is rooted in love, for God is love. The Eucharist calls us to remember and enter more fully into the mystery of God's love revealed in Jesus Christ.

The mission of the church is to love—all people, everywhere.

The ultimate sign of the Christian believer is love. Love is not an option. It is the commandment of the one who witnessed to his love for us by giving his life. The gospel tells us, with the clearest of focus, "You are my friend if...you love one another.



*"Love
each other
as I have
loved you."*
JOHN 15:12, NIV



In the first reading Peter tells us that this love must be all inclusive. God does not have favorite people. God's Spirit is poured out on the Gentiles as well as the Jews. The Christian community is founded, not in external circumstances, but in Christ's love.

Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

In truth, I see that God shows no partiality.

- Have you experienced God's unconditional love for you?

1 John 4:7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God.

- Who is the most difficult person for you to love as God asks?

John 15:9-17

This I command you: love one another.

- Who is the person who is most loveable for you? Why is that person easily loved?

This is a time of year when much growth is happening all around us every day.

This is a time of year for spiritual growth as well. This means that we become more aware of being immersed into life in Jesus. Our Mass readings for this Sunday and next Sunday both speak of this spiritual growth.

This week, for the 5th Sunday of Easter, Year B, Our Lord describes our relationship with him through the image of the Vine and the Branches. Next week, for the 6th Sunday of Easter, is a continuation of that passage from John 15. He says, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain" (John 15:16).

What can help us to "go and bear fruit"? Before he gave this command to his apostles at the Last Supper Jesus had said two things that can give us a confident joy to know he is helping us to carry it out. He had said, "I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends,

because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father" (15:15) and "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete" (15:11). We will have the strength to lay down our lives for each other, following Jesus' example and command, because his own joy – the joy and confidence that come from close friendship – will be in us.

It might be challenging for us to see our relationship with God from a friendship perspective. We might be more familiar with a king-servant or creditor-debtor perspective, seeing him as perfect and us as quite a bit less than perfect. We might be more familiar with trying to earn God's praises rather than focusing on the joy that he wants to give us that helps us to do the difficult right thing. But Jesus suggests that the spiritual growth he wants for us will come from appreciating that friendship perspective more completely.

Hopefully we have some friendships to which we have become supremely loyal. We couldn't fathom betraying this or that friend. Jesus wants our relationship with Him to become a supremely loyal friendship as well.

This can be challenging when much of our culture puts pressure on our fidelity to Jesus' teaching about respect for life, for example, or about acknowledging our sins and receiving his mercy before receiving his body and blood in Holy Communion (1 Corinthians 11:28). When we in fact turn to him for his mercy and for his assistance in having a restored relationship with him he is tremendously generous and welcoming with his mercy (Romans 5:6-11).

May his gift of mercy bear fruit in our hearts as a confident joy that we can offer to others. In that way we, too, will bear fruit that will remain.

We go through the Lord's life on the hand of the Blessed Mother.



What is the Living Rosary?

The Living Rosary is a prayer group that requires a short, simple, daily commitment from the members. Parishioners form teams of five members, with each member individually praying one decade of the Rosary, so that each day the team completes a full Rosary. Each team will have one special intention for which they offer their decade in addition to prayer intentions of the members. Each member follows a calendar indicating the mystery to meditate on as they pray their decade, which can be prayed at any time. At this we have "13" teams and we welcome anyone who would like to help form a new team or join an existing team that may be lacking a member (s). We have one parishioner who has expressed desire to join, and I would love to be able to contact her about new team formation. Anyone may join our Living Rosary prayer group, and it would be best for younger children to be guided by an adult or older sibling.
