

READINGS FOR THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD May 13, 2018

The Ascension marks the end of the age when Christ physically walked among us and heralds the promise of the Spirit to come. It is through the power of the Holy Spirit that we are called into discipleship and into mission. The mission of the church is to evangelize.

The gospel reading tells us that before Christ left his disciples physically, he commissioned them to preach and baptize in his name. This command is accompanied by the promise that Jesus will be with them always.

The passage from **Acts** tells us how they were able to do this. Jesus reminds the disciples of his promise to send his Spirit. Baptized in the Holy Spirit, they have the power to preach in the name of Jesus. Like love, evangelization is not an option for the church. We are commanded in the readings, "Go... you will be my witnesses..."

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you.

- When have you experienced being "inspired" by the Holy Spirit?

Ephesians 4:1-13

He puts all things beneath his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, which is his body.

- What teachings of the church do you find difficult to live with?

Mark 16:15-20

The Lord Jesus was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God.

- When the Lord returns, what will his judgement be for you?


Next week we will observe the Feast of the Ascension.

Historically observing remembrance of Jesus' ascension forty days after his resurrection was connected to the Jewish observance of Pentecost fifty days after Passover. That meant that the Ascension was usually observed on a Thursday. Recently, for practical reasons, we've been observing this feast on the 7th Sunday of Easter.

Why did Jesus ascend to the Heaven after appearing to numerous people

after his resurrection? Let us consider Jesus' words to St. Mary Madgalene, the first person to see Jesus after his resurrection, and, let us consider Jesus' command to his apostles in next Sunday's Gospel from Mark 16.

When Mary Magdalene discovered that the person she thought was the gardener in the cemetery where Jesus had been buried was actually Jesus, she grabbed a hold of him with frightened joy! Perhaps it was the opposite of not wanting to be pinched lest we wake up in the middle of experiencing something surprisingly and truly good. Mary Magdalene did not want to let go of him who had given her new hope through his mercy and who now had so clearly conquered even the grave and death itself.



Jesus then told her not to cling to him. Why? "For I have not yet ascended to the Father... I am going to my Father and your father, to my God and your God" (John 20:17). After Jesus' ascension, he sent the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. By this, they could have an even more profound relationship with Jesus. They, including St. Mary Magdalene, could have an interior relationship with Jesus.

So it can be for us. Through the Holy Spirit we can have a relationship with Jesus that is more profound than if it

was only an exterior relationship. One of the ways we can tap into the depths of that interior relationship with Jesus is by tapping into the level of who we <u>are</u> in Jesus, at the level of our identity. This can connect us with the Gospel for next week, from Mark 16, and Jesus' command for us to "go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).

To put into practice the command of Jesus just before his ascension, let us bear in mind the relationship between who we <u>are</u> as human <u>beings</u> and as Christians and what we <u>do</u>. These thoughts echo commentary from <u>Emmanuel</u>, May-June 2015, p. 183, which is a journal with an emphasis on Eucharistic spirituality.

Sometimes in life it's easy to fall into the trap of valuing what we <u>do</u> as more important than who we <u>are</u>. In reality, the opposite is true: who we <u>are</u> ultimately determines what we <u>do</u>! Discovering who we are, in light of Jesus' resurrection, is a central theme of the Easter season.

These seven weeks of Easter teach us about who we are: God's beloved daughters and sons. We have been bought back from slavery to sin and from the culture of death, redeemed through the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and given new life through the sacraments. In Baptism we are born again into life in Jesus and both adopted and grafted into the family of God. This new life is healed and strengthened through the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Penance and nourished for growth through the Eucharist. We ask that by these gifts we may experience an interior relationship with Jesus that we can invite others to experience as well.

Pastor's Letter

Congratulations to the children of our parish who are celebrating their First Communion today, Sunday, May 6th. May this be just the beginning of day-by-day being drawn more closely and more confidently into life in Jesus!

All of us can benefit from reviewing ways we can renew our experience of Our Lord Jesus through Holy Communion.

A new resource you might find helpful is a video series at the formed.org website, free with our parish's access code. It is a multi-episode series called, <u>Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist</u>, with both visually reinforced teachings about the Eucharist and personal witnesses about how experiencing Jesus through the Eucharist has enlivened and transformed people's lives.

There are several other movies and another video series at the formed.org online resource center that could help to renew your experience of the Eucharist.

One of them is a 39-minute video simply entitled, <u>Prayer</u>, featuring Bishop Mark Davies of the Diocese of Shrewsbury, England (you can practice your British accent through this video as well!). This can help many of us whose prayer life flows from and to the Mass as the center-point of our way of encountering Jesus personally.

A suggested children's resource is from the <u>Brother Francis</u> series entitled, <u>The Bread of Life</u>. This is a computer-animated series that features a Franciscan friar (brother) on a variety of topics for children's faith formation.

Finally, two other video resources are a movie about the life of St. Padre Pio, whose profound way of offering the Mass transformed the lives of thousands of people, and another video entitled, <u>Hostia</u>, which explains the biblical and historical roots of our belief in Jesus' Real Presence through the Eucharist. Please let me know if you have any difficulty accessing these free resources at <u>www.formed.org</u>.

I'd also like to encourage you, if you haven't had the opportunity yet, to spend some quiet time on Wednesdays in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel, which is open each week from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. This is accessible through the back porch alley entrance at the east end of the St. Benedict Church and Rectory. Eucharistic Adoration has helped me at various points in my own life to experience a peace, grounding and renewed focus from the Lord, and I know many, many others who have had similar experiences.

May the Lord help us to continue journeying together, alive in Jesus Christ, always ready for the gift of eternal life.


