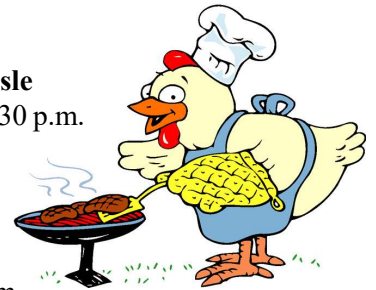

Future Tuition: Did you know that you can begin earning tuition credit through SCRIP the moment a child is born? We've had families start at St. Benedict with their whole first year tuition covered!

Registration for St. Benedict School, preK-8th grade is ongoing through June 15. Please contact the school for an information packet, to schedule a tour or if you have any questions. Tuition for 1 child for the 2018-2019 school year is \$2,100 (for parishioners) and \$3,100 (for non-parishioners) for K-8. Families can also register children after August 1. Contact the school office: 740-432-6751.

We still welcome registrations for Kindergarten and can schedule a screening. Please contact the school by May 31 if you would like to learn more. Currently we are expecting 12-14 students in our Kindergarten for 2018-2019.

Pastor's Letter

This upcoming Wednesday we will conclude the second season, or set of sessions, for the ChristLife approach to personal and parish renewal. There is one more set of sessions to be conducted with this first group of parishioner participants, which will likely be in the fall of this year. This is the kind of process that is meant to be repeated both with a new large group of parishioner participants and with some who have participated in previous sessions serving as small group facilitators and team members for the next cycle of sessions.

Having gone through these two sets of sessions, I have come to appreciate and understand better now what this process can accomplish in a person. It has been providing me with some good personal renewal as well. I am looking forward to applying this approach to renewal more and more in my own life and I am looking forward to repeating the process with additional parishioners. We are one of the pilot parishes for our Diocese and I can see better now how other parishes could also benefit from ChristLife. This can form part of a more complete offering of approaches to faith formation, especially when we have other groups and ministries, such as RCIA, Bible studies, prayer groups, and other groups and outreach ministries. I am looking forward to providing an overview outline of all the various groups and opportunities for faith formation and support we have as a parish, which seems to be becoming more and more complete.

Thank you to the many parishioners who participate in our various parish and school advisory councils. We have both a Pastoral Advisory Council and a Financial Advisory Council for the parish as a whole and an Educational Advisory Council and a newly-formed Educational *Financial* Advisory Council for St. Benedict School. We are blessed with many capable and generous advisors for our parish and school community.

Thank you, also, to all who contributed to this past Friday's Salad Luncheon. Thank you for providing us with a school fundraiser that is also a great opportunity for fellowship with members of our broader Guernsey County community.

May the Lord help us to continue journeying together, alive in Jesus Christ, always ready for the gift of eternal life.

READINGS FOR THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

May 27, 2018

Through the mystery of the Trinity we are drawn into a loving and personal relationship with our triune God.

The focus of our readings is the experience of God acting in our lives in various ways. We have no adequate language for God because God is beyond any single image we may have. We experience God in Jesus Christ who shares with us his experience of God, as creator, as redeemer, and as a person of intimate relationship. Our experience of this relationship is the Spirit of God living in us.

In the readings from the letter of Paul to the Romans, Paul tells us that because we live in the Holy Spirit and because we are brothers and sisters of Christ, we are children of God. We too can enjoy the intimate relationship that Jesus called “Abba.”



In the gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to preach, baptize and teach in the name of God—the God who is intimate like a parent (Father), who comes as Savior (Son), and who lives within us (Holy Spirit).

Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40

The Lord is God and there is no other.

- Which of God’s commands are most difficult for me to keep?

Romans 8:14-17

The Spirit bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God.

- How have I experienced the Spirit of God leading me?

Matthew 28:16-20

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- How am I living my Baptismal gift of faith?

Each of the readings for next Sunday’s Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity highlights a key summary statement of what God is like.

The First Reading focuses on God the Father and, therefore, the Trinity as a whole. This reading teaches us that God is both awesome and personal. This reading is from Deuteronomy, which is the fifth book of the Bible. The setting for that book is that the Hebrew people were gathered at the edge of the desert just before entering into the Promised Land at the end of their forty years after being set free from slavery in Egypt. Throughout this book of the Bible, Moses reviews with the Hebrew people, the Twelve Tribes of Jacob, the special relationship God has had with them. He reminds them that God gave them freedom from slavery with awesome signs and wonders. Then, God taught them his own law and both instructed and guided them as a nation in a very personal way.

The Second Reading, from St. Paul’s letter to the Romans, describes the kind of relationship God wants us to have individually. He reinforces that when we experience God working and present individually, our relationship with God can grow from being one primarily of awe, fear and

trembling to one in which we can call God, “Abba.” That word can be translated as “Daddy,” especially as said by a son or daughter to a father who is the patron of a large family. Again, like in that First Reading from Deuteronomy, we are meant to experience God as both awesome and tenderly personal.

And, in the Gospel, Jesus teaches us that we are to experience and to proclaim that God wants each of us to be immersed – the literal meaning of “baptized” – into God who is “the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit” (Matthew 28:19). This awesome and personal God will be with us always, “until the end of the age.”

We live in the age of the complete revelation of who God is and what God is like through Jesus taking on our human nature (Hebrews 1:1-2), through the Holy Spirit helping us to experience God changing our hearts from within, and by the Holy Spirit enabling us to relate to God by sharing in God’s divine nature (2 Peter 1:4). Ultimately, we believe that God is a Trinity both from our experience of God and from Jesus’ own teaching – again, see especially the final four verses of the Gospel of Matthew. Indeed, may our Lord Jesus help us to grow in our relationship with our God who is both awesome and tenderly personal.
