
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Parish School of Religion (PSR) classes for children in grades K through 12 are held Sunday mornings from September to May.

Pastor's Letter

Please note that beginning this week we will be adjusting the weekday Confession schedule. In addition to our usual weekend scheduled times for Confession of Saturdays at 4:00 p.m. at St. Benedict Church before the 5:00 p.m. Mass and Sundays at ~11:45 a.m. at Sts. Peter & Paul Oratory before the 12:15 p.m. Mass, we will continue to have Confessions scheduled regularly for Tuesday evenings from 7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m.

That two-hour block of time is both meant to provide an opportunity for folks who find it difficult to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the other two times and intended to give an opportunity for an experience of the Sacrament as more of a sacrament of healing. Not having the pressure of many others in line or potentially the self-consciousness of people seeing you go into the confessional can help the experience to be relaxed and focused on healing the roots of sin. Of course, you are always welcome to contact any one of the three of us here associated with Christ Our Light Parish to meet for Confession at a time other than those regularly scheduled.

Not having Confessions on Thursday evenings can also open up another block of time for adult faith formation groups and gatherings. Our Men's Prayer Group usually meets on the first and third Thursday evening in the Marian Room during the school year. Again, we are looking at a few other faith formation options in addition to the Christ Life series and an RCIA group – perhaps another formatted Bible study program.

Vacation Bible School is just around the corner as is our annual Christ Our Light Parish picnic. Thanks to all who have served as volunteers for both of those events.

Like the last couple of summers, Vacation Bible School will be held in the evenings, this year from Sunday, July 15th, through Thursday, July 19th. That has proven to be a better time than mornings for more parent involvement, including fathers. Please see details including sign-up information in other parts of this bulletin. Then, a number of the children who participate in the VBS during the week have also provided music of VBS songs at the parish picnic the following Sunday evening.

READINGS FOR THE 15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME July 15, 2018

By virtue of our baptism, we are called to share in the mission of Jesus Christ. As we prepare our hearts to celebrate the sacred mysteries, let us seek the Lord's mercy and pardon for the times we have wavered in our call to serve.

The focus of the readings for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time is mission. The apostles (the word means "sent") are sent out to preach. They are warned, however, that they must be true to their mission and that for this they may be rejected. In the reading from Amos, the prophet was rejected because he preached the Word of God which was in opposition to the civil authorities. The message of God is not always in harmony with the ways of the world. What matters most is fidelity to the message. For the prophet/apostle there can be no question of watering down God's message—even in the face of rejection.



Amos 7:12-15

Go, prophesy to my people Israel.

■ Who is the prophet of God's mercy and power in our times?

Ephesians 1:3-14

In love, he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ.

■ How have you come to know your redemption through Jesus Christ?

Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two.

■ Who has the Lord called to journey with you? How did you come to know the two of you were called and sent by the Lord?

As many of us are enjoying life just as it is, here in the middle of July, in the midst of summer, and as some people are taking a vacation from God and from going to church the readings given to us from the Church for next Sunday's Masses have a focus on prophecy!

When we think about prophets and their task, we usually think about someone who is crying out words of warning with anger for the sake of instilling fear in their listeners. Yes, a prophet does have an unpopular task because he or she does need to motivate people to change their lifestyle. But an authentic prophet also has another key aspect to their actions of prophesying: they are motivated out of love rather than out of hatred. They are filled with an obedient love of God and a sincere love of the people to whom they are called to prophesy.

Next Sunday's First Reading comes from someone who did not expect to be a prophet. Amos grew up as a shepherd and a tree farmer. He was perfectly content doing that as well. Then, the Lord prompted him to become a prophet.

Amos began prophesying to the people throughout the

areas of what had been the Kingdom of Israel under King David about their unjust violence especially toward the poor. Amos was prompted by the Lord to call them to conversion. He did not want to do that task because he knew the kind of resistance people would direct toward him.

But, Amos responded obediently, motivated by the desire that God be reverenced and the people to be saved.

In next Sunday's Gospel, we see Jesus preparing his apostles for prophetic tasks. All of them were very similar to Amos. They had been fishermen and tax collectors and even revolutionaries, striving to overthrow the Roman army. They had not been members of a "professional" guild of prophets.

Jesus prepared them by helping them to see the Gospel message as a whole. On the one hand it would be a message of healing and mercy. On the other hand it would mean that people who had been sinners were going to be welcomed back to the community. So, some people would welcome the apostles into their homes and villages but others would not.

Jesus had shown that his own preaching of the Gospel was out of love. Looking at the people with compassion he saw them as "sheep without a shepherd" (Mark 6:34). The apostles, too, were to "preach repentance" (Mark 6:12) with great compassion as well. The healings and the liberation from evil spirits that would accompany their preaching were signs of the great love that God has for us.

May the Lord help us to hear his message of conversion not as <u>hatred</u> directed toward us but rather as a loving plea for us to experience healing and new life. May we respond to invitations for us, too, to preach repentance and to see others from the perspective of the love of God. May we want our neighbors as well as our enemies to experience the conversion and the call to be prepared for eternal life to which God is calling us.
