READINGS FOR THE 24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME September 16, 2018

We hear a message we associate more with Lent than with autumn. Jesus tells us we must deny ourselves and accept our crosses willingly. Each person carries their own personal cross, but in his letter, St. James writes that Christianity is not a private relationship between me and God, but must involve the care of others. Let us ready ourselves to hear the voice of God speaking to us.

Our focus is the call to truly express our faith in Christ. It is of little use to say we believe in Christ but not in his cross, as Peter seems to have done in the Gospel reading. Acceptance of Christ means acceptance of his cross and also of our own cross in union with him. To reject the reality of suffering is to reject the reality of the crucified Christ.



In the reading from James, we are told that it is false to say we believe in Christ if we do not live as Christ lived, namely, for others. To reject the reality of service in the Chritian life is to reject the reality of Christ who came not to be served, but to serve. Futher, James calls us to live with the belief that Christ died for all, and therefore we are all sisters and brothers of the same family. To deny this is to deny Christ.

Christ's death on the cross is the culmination of his life for others. For us, too, the cross and service must go together.

Isaiah 5:5-9a

The suffering Servant.

How have I suffered in my attempt to live out my faith?

James 2:14-18

Faith without works is dead.

■ Who witnesses to me their faith? How do they witness it?

Mark 8:27-35

If you wish to follow Jesus, you must take up your cross.

■ What is my "cross" in life?

Having our hearts and our intentions consistent with our actions: this is the hallmark of a disciple of Jesus. Our Sunday readings over the next several weeks, both in these chapters of the Gospel of Mark and in the Second Readings from the Letter of James, are about "discipleship formation."

What are some steps of Christian discipleship formation expressed in these readings?

Step one: have ears and hearts **open** both to listening attentively to God's word and to accepting God's word.

Step two: **believe** in *Jesus* as the Messiah, the one who has been sent by the Father to save us from our sins; that's the very content of His word.

Step three: accepting God's mercy and being set free from our sins, we are to have the same **courageous compassion** for others, helping them to be open to our Lord's saving grace to be set free from sin and prepared for the gift of eternal life as well.

This Sunday, September 9th, we hear in the Gospel about Jesus opening the ears of a man who was deaf and who had a speech impediment. The prophet Isaiah had foreseen that God would visit his people and his "vindication" would include healing. This healing would be of people's ears and hearts being opened, of their oppression ending (meaning especially oppression from sin and evil), and of new life bursting forth in places where it had not seemed possible before. This mirrors in a prophetic way the steps of discipleship.

Next Sunday, Jesus teaches us that a true disciple will have the *courage* and the *compassion* to take up their cross and follow him. It takes courage to take up our cross and follow Jesus in freedom from sin. It also takes compassion. As Jesus calls us to freedom from sin, he shows us the surprising way to grow more deeply into that freedom. Very often the cross we are called to bear is courageously offering mercy to someone against whom we'd rather hold onto a judgment. We sometimes find that as we grow in the wonderful experience of freedom from sin we grow impatient with the sins of others. "Why can't they see and appreciate the change I have experienced," we might say to ourselves, "and change from *their* sins?"

St. James speaks very straight forwardly about compassion for the poor in our midst. So often when we see the poor

we jump to the conclusion that it is their sinfulness that is the primary cause of their poverty. We are called, then, to offer assistance beyond material assistance. We try to offer assistance towards freedom from sin. That kind of assistance isn't always so readily accepted. That's where the courage, compassion and perseverance that feel like carrying the cross are needed. This is experienced as a grace – a gift that we receive and then hand on to others.

May the grace of God and the gift of being a community of faith help us to be open to the growth as disciples the Lord wants us all to experience, preparing us for the life of Heaven.

Pastor's Letter

Each year, September 15th is observed within the Church throughout the world as the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. That is because the day before, September 14th, is a feast day called the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, meaning we recall how Jesus transformed what was a symbol of shame – being executed on a cross – into now being a symbol of triumph over sin and death. The cross of Jesus is a symbol of God's profound love for us. On the next day, September 15th, we remember how Jesus' mother, Mary, was one of the few steadfast disciples who stayed with Jesus at the foot of the cross. Her sorrows were then transformed into tremendous joy when she encountered Jesus after his Resurrection.

This upcoming Saturday, September 15th, Bishop Monforton has asked each of the parishes that have a Saturday morning Mass to designate it this year as a Mass of Reparation both for victims of abuse within the Church and for the renewal of the Church throughout the world to be more of a community of accountability and transparency. Because we are blessed with having both Fr. Bob and Fr. Jonas we have been able to have a Mass each Saturday morning in addition to the Saturday evening vigil Mass. So, our 8:35 a.m. Mass this Saturday will be one of several locations in the Diocese of Steubenville where a Mass of Reparation will be offered. Please keep all victims of abuse in your prayers and please continue your prayers for the ongoing renewal of the Church throughout the world.

Please note, again, that we are planning to offer our annual Mass of Anointing on <u>Saturday</u>, September <u>22nd</u>, at <u>1:30</u> <u>p.m.</u> at St. Benedict Social Hall. This Mass of Anointing is open to anyone who has been struggling with the effects of both acute and chronic afflictions – and their caregivers – especially when some of those sufferings have been wearing down one's faith! This is the way a person formally and sacramentally unites their sufferings with

Jesus' passion as well. And, the Church asks them for their prayers, which are especially effective at those times. As in years past, we will have some food and refreshments after the Mass.

As a second notice – with more to be given later in the month and in October – parents of children 10 years old and younger can mark your calendars for a diocesan event that we will host here at Christ Our Light Parish on Friday evening, November 2nd, and Saturday, November 3rd. It is a conference sponsored by our diocesan Office of Marriage, Family and Respect Life called the **Leading and Loving Conference**. The conference is designed to give "parents the confidence to talk with their child about God's gift of sexuality and other important topics in an age-appropriate way, even from an early age. It gives parents a better understanding of the WHY behind what our faith teaches" (see the website of www.familyhonor.org). The format of the conference is 6 one-hour sessions, typically presented Friday evening (2 hrs.) and Saturday daytime (4 hrs.). This event has no registration fees, so please mark your calendars in advance for this event that is "parents only" so that "they can freely discuss delicate topics."

May the Lord help us all to journey together ever more joyfully and courageously, always ready for the gift of eternal life.
