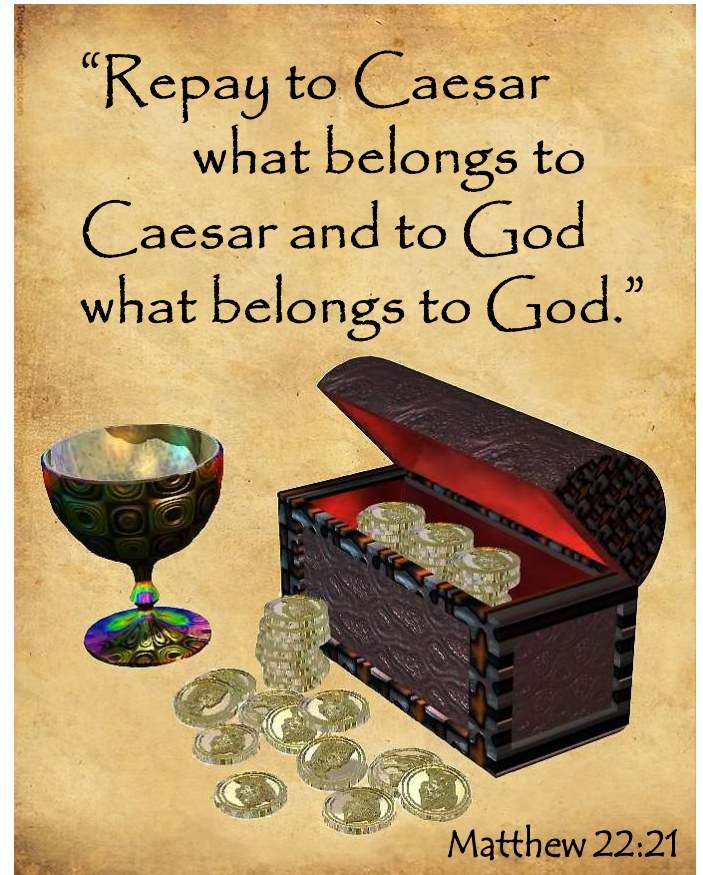

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE 30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

October 29, 2017

As Christians, we are called to love God and our neighbors as ourselves. This is not an easy task, especially when our neighbor appears different from us. So often we tend to judge and exclude people, rather than loving them as our neighbor. Mindful of our sins, let us turn to the Lord seeking mercy for the times we have not loved as we should.

Our readings focus on love of neighbor. In the reading from Exodus we have a list of commandments relating to the treatment of others. In short, we are commanded to love everyone and to take special care of those in need.

The gospel is a simple, straight-forward presentation of the “greatest commandment.” The focus is clear. Love of God and neighbor is not merely an option but the definition of what it means to be Christian.

Exodus 22:20-26

If he cries out to me, I will hear him, for I am compassionate.

- When have you experienced or needed to know the compassion of God?

1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

From you the word of the Lord has sounded forth.

- When have you witnessed the word of God? What was the situation and consequence of the witness?

Matthew 22:34-40

You shall love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself.

- Who is the neighbor who is a challenge for you to love? What makes it difficult?

How can we love God and our neighbor as thoroughly as Jesus commands us to do in next Sunday’s Gospel – “with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind”? Is it possible to be so complete with our love? Let us consider this Gospel passage more completely to see how Jesus can help us to expand our capacity to love.

The rabbis in Jesus’ time would put each other to the test to demonstrate that their teachings were worthy of their attention. One of the forms of testing was that they were supposed to recite or summarize the Law of Moses, the teaching of the Lord, while standing on one foot! In other words, if someone could summarize the law of God without leaving out some essential dimension of it, in doing so they would be demonstrating how thoroughly they had assimilated that teaching themselves.

In the first part of Jesus’ answer he quotes the great “Shema” prayer, found in Deuteronomy 6:4-9, that a devout Jewish person would recite at specific times every day and would have written on the doorpost of their house. A devout person like a Pharisee, who St. Luke identifies as the person who was putting Jesus to the test, would write the Shema on a piece of paper kept in a small leather box suspended from a headband so that it would dangle in front of their forehead. The answer to the Pharisee’s question to Jesus was literally hanging right in front of him between his eyes!

But, to the command to love God so completely Jesus adds the command to love our neighbor as ourselves. He gives

the Pharisee – and us – an insight into the “physics of grace.” “Loving our neighbor as ourselves” works in tandem with loving God. One without the other is incomplete and does not continue to grow. If we find that our capacity to love is less than complete, Jesus invites us to enter into the active practice of love, expressed both to God and to our neighbor.

The Law of God is not something cold and lifeless, only something that tells us “thou shalt not.” It is something that is meant to be alive in our hearts and lives, something that continues growing in our hearts. And, expressing love for our neighbor, in the teachings and example of Jesus, is something broader than caring only for people who we like. It means also caring about people who are difficult to love. When we do so, love grows. We become more and more able to love with all of our heart, soul and mind.

May the Lord help us to experience his teachings as something alive and growing in our hearts through loving God and all of our neighbors!

Mark your short-term calendars for this upcoming Wednesday, October 25, at 6:30 p.m. for an Information Night about the Christ Life approach to personal and parish renewal. Christ Life is literally for everyone 18 and older. It's an approach to facing some of the fundamental questions in life. What gives ultimate meaning to life? Why does Jesus matter? I'm looking forward to unfolding this approach and process in our parish, beginning ultimately with the first seven-week course in January.

Deeply grateful "thank yous" go to all who participated in the Courthouse Rosary Rally this past Saturday. I appreciate all of the effort and perseverance that Joyce Day has directed toward this each year over these past 5 years leading up to this year's 100th anniversary of the events in Fatima, Portugal. With its emphasis on prayer for personal and national conversion, how important for us to gather at the courthouse for prayer. Then, I'm tremendously grateful for the team that carried our statue of Our Lady of Grace in the procession from the courthouse to the church. That was great to so clearly symbolize our spiritual mother, Mary, leading us to her son, Jesus.

Please note that we are planning for a full range of options for Masses on All Saints Day, including a 7:00 p.m. Mass at St. Benedict Church on Tuesday evening, October 31st. May the Lord empower us to keep the "Hallowed" (i.e. "Holy") in Hallow-een!

On All Saints Day itself, Wednesday, November 1st, we're planning for Masses at 7:00 a.m., 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. in Cambridge and at 7:00 p.m. at Sts. Peter & Paul in Lore City.

All Souls Day, Thursday, November 2nd, is also a day for prayers of remembrance, especially Masses, for those who have gone before us. Likewise, we're planning for a couple of "extra" Masses. In addition to the regular 8:35 a.m. daily Mass, we're also planning for two evening Masses, again one at 5:00 p.m. in Cambridge and another at 7:00 p.m. in Lore City. You might find it also helpful to visit a cemetery on that day, or sometime next week, and to offer prayers both for the repose of the souls of those resting in the cemeteries and in gratitude for the gift of faith in Jesus Christ that we've received from those who have gone before us.

May the Lord help us all to journey together ever more joyfully, always ready for the gift of eternal life.

Rosary Rally

A warm sunny day welcomed all to our 5th annual Rosary Rally on October 14 at the courthouse. This was one of 21,570 rallies across the USA in honor of Our Lady of Fatima's appearances and message 100 years ago. Mary told the children that we should daily pray the rosary for peace in the world. Participants gathered to do just that on Saturday. The rally included a musical group that led the singing, and volunteers that led the prayers of the rosary and other prayers as well. The Marian Procession that followed the rally was a lovely testimony in our Catholic belief that the Blessed Mother leads us to her Son, Jesus Christ. Servers led the procession with the crucifix from the courthouse to St. Benedict Church. Other children carried the "giant rosary" and ribbon pennants, while flower girls scattered rose petals in front of the statue of Mary which was carried by members of the Knights of Columbus. After Mary was returned to her place in the church, Benediction was held. LEPS Pride hosted a reception in the social hall where they had cupcakes arranged as a rosary. Many thanks to all the volunteers who worked to make this display of Catholic faith a prayerful and memorable event.
