



SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE 31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME November 5, 2017

We are a priestly people, a royal priesthood. Therefore, we all hear the privilege and responsibility of offering sincere worship and of preserving the true faith.

The scriptures gives us many images of God: shepherd, king, eagle with her young, and so forth. The readings for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time suggest the image of God as creative parent.

The reading from **Malachi** is a plea for unity, both in what is taught and in the reltionships among the believers. The motivation for this unity is we have all been created by the same God.

Our Gospel presents the same, with a little more expansion. **Malachi** rebukes the priests of his time for not teaching the truth. Jesus warns against hypocrisy of the Pharisees who don't practice what they preach! His lesson ends with the same call to unity we find in **Malachi**. We are to call no one on earth master because we all have one Master. That truth motivates our equality.

If you want to be the greatest, you must serve everyone else.

Malachi 1:14-2:2, 8-10

The Prophet Malachi calls us, as a priestly people, to conduct sincere worship and to pass our faith on to younger generations.

 How faithful are you to sharing your faith with your children?

1 Thessalonians 2:7-0, 13

Paul was proud of the community at Thessalonica and refused to burden them with his own expenses, even as he freely preached the gospel to them.

- How do you support the work of the church?

Matthew 23:1-12

Jesus warns his disciples not to imitate the Pharisees, who practiced their religion to gain public approval.

- Who are those who might be "Pharisees" in our times?

"Do not be called 'Rabbi'...call no one on earth your father...do not be called

'Master'" (Matthew 23:8,9,10). At the beginning of his First Letter to Timothy, St. Paul addresses him by saying, "to Timothy, my true child in the faith" (1 Timothy 1:2). In his 1st Letter, St. John addresses several verses repeatedly to "Fathers," for example, "I am writing to you, fathers, because you know him who is from the beginning" (1 John 2:13). In Jesus' parable about the rich man and Lazarus, he depicts the rich man as calling out from the place of torment, identifying a human being – though not "on earth" – as, "Father Abraham" (Luke 16:24).

Did Jesus contradict himself and did the apostle St. John and the early convert St. Paul disregard Jesus' teaching in Matthew 23:8-10?

Jesus employed several literary forms when he proclaimed the Good News of the Kingdom of God. Sometimes Jesus used the literary form of hyperbole, that is, "extravagant exaggeration" (merriam-webster.com). Next Sunday's Gospel reading is an example of that.

When Jesus and others in the First Century Jewish world wanted to emphasize that a statement was to be taken literally, they would usually add the lead-in expression, "Amen, amen, I say to you..." (John 6:32). We do not have that feature in next week's Gospel.

Next week's Gospel passage has more of a resonance with other passages, such as when Jesus asked his disciples at the Sermon on the Mount, "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own eye" (Matthew 7:3)? This is more clearly an example of hyperbole.

And, if we were to call no one on earth our father, its accumulated non-use could soon render that beautiful imagery of God as father meaningless!

Anyway, Jesus teaches us, through the use of hyperbole, to be on guard against insincere religious leadership. And, Jesus calls people with various roles of parental leadership to do so with greater gratitude for being able to mirror God's servant leadership in our world and in our lives.

Both next week's Responsorial Psalm and the Second Reading teach us that God prefers that our experience of Him be more like a quiet, caring parent. St. Paul was so inspired by God's peace that even serving others "in toil and drudgery" could still prompt him to "give thanks to God unceasingly" (1 Thessalonians 2:13). This balances out the picture given in the Gospel and First Reading. Sometimes we need the Lord to wake us up with extravagant exaggeration and at other times we need to experience God more calmly and say, like the writer of Psalm 131, "In you, O Lord, I have found my peace."

Pastor's Letter

We had some good news on the pro-life front here in Ohio this past week. On Wednesday, October 25th, the House Health Committee passed the Down Syndrome Non-Discrimination Act by a vote of 12-6. The Ohio Right to Life Society said at their website, "This step forward is an important one as we seek to protect babies prenatally diagnosed with Down syndrome...The percentage of women who get abortions after a prenatal Down syndrome diagnosis is astoundingly high, measured somewhere between 65-90%. This practice of modern eugenics must end...We are so thankful for the many people who testified in favor of the bill and who have joined...in our effort to #StandUpforDown" (www.ohiolife.org).

This past week, Pope Francis also met with people from around the world who were attending a conference in Rome entitled, "Catechesis and Persons with Disabilities: A Necessary Engagement in the Daily Pastoral Life of the Church." The conference took place October, 20-22 at the Pontifical Urbanianum University in Rome.

Among the people Pope Francis met with was Bridget Brown. Brown is "a self-advocate, an inclusion advocate, an actress... and a young woman with Down syndrome." She also loves her life and wants others to know that each and every person is precious. In a letter she wrote to Pope Francis she stated, "The world needs to know that I don't 'suffer' from Down syndrome. I have a full and wonderful life, and I am filled with joy to be alive. I absolutely love my life" (see www.catholicnewsagency.com/news).

Finally, to help us enter into celebrating All Saints Day this week Pope Francis' homily at last year's All Saints Day Mass (2016), when he was visiting Sweden, has a message of encouragement.

"If there is one thing typical of the saints, it is that they are genuinely happy." The saints, he said, "found the secret of authentic happiness, which lies deep within the soul and has its source in the love of God. That is why we call the saints blessed." He then pointed to the Beatitudes, explaining that they are both the path saints take as well as their final goal: "the Beatitudes are the way of life that the Lord teaches us, so that we can follow in his footsteps."

May the Lord help us all to journey together ever more joyfully, always ready for the gift of eternal life.
