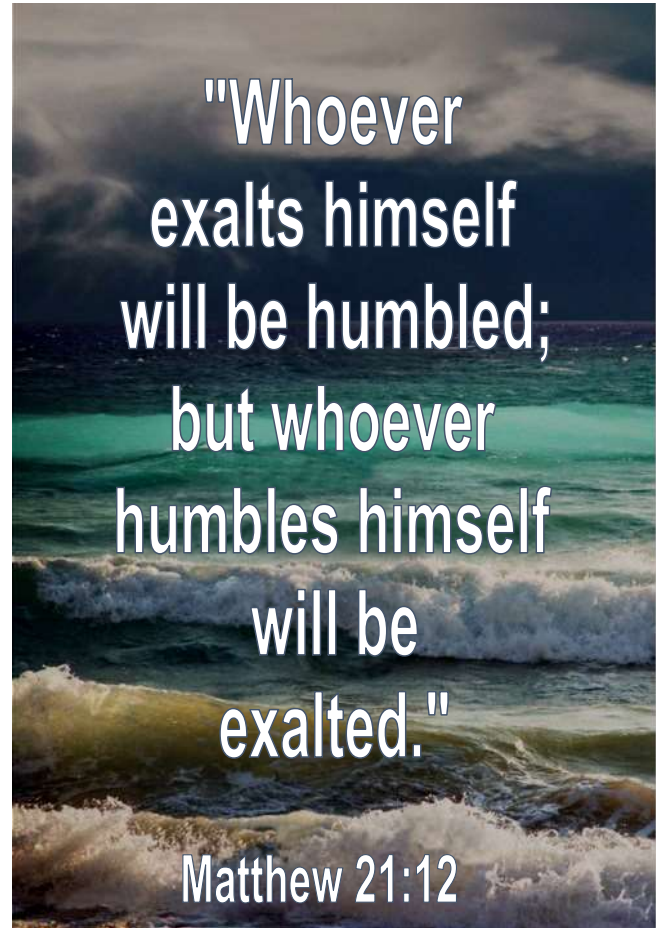

Please note that throughout the month of November we will have envelopes and 3x5 cards on the altars with the names of people we are keeping in remembrance. In the packets of offering envelopes you may have noticed one for All Souls Day that includes several blank lines. That's where you could write the names of people you would like to keep in remembrance in particular. Even though we're already several days into November now, those envelopes could be turned in on subsequent Sundays (or mid-week too) and will be added to those that are already on the altars. And, if you can't find that envelope or are not yet receiving offering envelopes, you could simply write the names of those you'd like remembered onto a 3x5 card and, again, either place it in the weekly collection basket or you could bring it by the parish office during the week as well.

Congratulations to members of our Bereavement Haven group that is observing their 2nd anniversary as an outreach ministry in our parish here in November. They meet usually on the 2nd Sunday of each month at 2:30 p.m. in the St. Benedict Church Social Hall. The group is open to all who have lost a loved one and who would like to have the active support of others who are passing through similar circumstances. The group has been truly ecumenical, drawing members from throughout the Guernsey County area and from several area churches.

Please note also that like last year on Thanksgiving Day we're planning to have two Masses in the morning. One is planned for 9:00 a.m. at St. Benedict in Cambridge and the other is earlier, at 8:00 a.m. at Sts. Peter & Paul in Lore City. 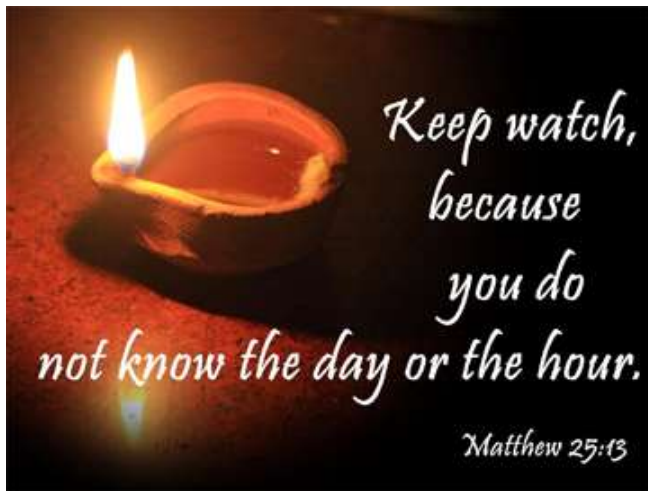

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE 32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

November 12, 2017

The true disciple is alert to God's coming. It is wise to be ready and waiting when the Lord calls.

The focus of the readings is wisdom. It is common in the Old Testament to find wisdom as an expression of God. In the reading from **Wisdom, we see wisdom praised as the gift which lasts forever.** As the presence of God, she is available to all who seek her. She guides their ways to the good.



The gospel takes this poetic text and puts it into a tangible parable. The focus of the parable is seen in the last line, "always be ready, for you do not know at what hour the Lord is coming." From the first reading and the parable, we know that being ready comes from wisdom.

Wisdom 6:12-16

Wisdom was present at creation and encourages us to seek and love her.

- How do I seek to know the wisdom of God?

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

Paul explains that those who survive until Jesus comes will have no advantage over those who have already died. Both the living and the dead will share in the parousia.

- Do I pray for the dead?

Matthew 25:1-13

The parable of the bridesmaids tells us to be prepared to wait, for no one knows the day nor the hour.

- How am I preparing for "the hour" when the Lord will come?

God wants us to be wise and active-minded.

God wants us to live our lives wisely and fully aware of the eternal destiny to which we are moving – and fully aware that the end of our lives on earth could be upon us either at any given moment or a long distance of time away.

In next Sunday's Gospel, Jesus describes readiness for eternal life as being like ten teenage girls (i.e. ten virgins) who are serving roles as greeters for the bridegroom and the wedding party when they return from his going to the bride's house to bring her and the rest of her entourage to the groom's family compound for the wedding ceremony.

We could probably understand why a bridegroom might be delayed if he couldn't begin his return trip until the bride was ready to leave! So, anyone who was serving as a greeter needed to be prepared for likely delays. Five were ready and five were not. Five had additional oil to be able to relight their lamps after an extended time of waiting and five of them did not prepare for a delay.

What could the oil represent? The oil can represent the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives and being truly open and attentive to the Holy Spirit's assistance, guidance and promptings. The Lord wants to help us to face temptations and to have a relationship that has both lively and dynamic moments and quieter times when waiting for additional blessings helps to strengthen the gift of faith he has given us.

The importance of being wise and not dull-witted is reinforced in next week's First Reading. In that passage from the Old Testament book of Wisdom, God's desire to help us is emphasized. "[Wisdom] is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her. She hastens to make herself known in anticipation of their desire" (Wisdom 6:12-13).

So, God is generous with blessing people with wisdom if they seek it. And, even if that seems like the emphasis is back on us needing to take the initiative to seek wisdom, especially practical knowledge about topics such as

eternal life, the last verses of next week's First Reading re-emphasize that God is actively searching for souls who want wisdom: "because [Wisdom] makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her, and graciously appears to them in the ways, and meets them with all solicitude" (6:16).

This desire of God for us is emphasized in the scene of Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4:7. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, in the section about growing in personal prayer and the spiritual life, recognizing God's stronger thirst for us is described as a key starting point for growth in holiness.

May God surprise us by responding more generously to our desire to know His love!

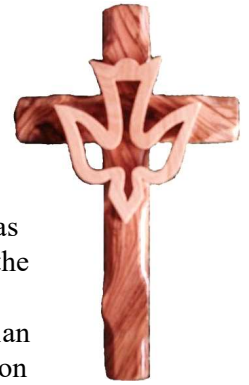

Holy Land Carvings to Visit Christ Our Light Parish November 11-12, 2017
