

Pastor's Letter

The Guernsey Association of Churches is coordinating for Thanksgiving Day both a dinner people could attend and meals that can be delivered for households in need. Please see info about ways to participate in this event on the table at the back of the Oratory or in the Marian Room, including either providing pre-cooked food before Thanksgiving Day or serving as volunteers at the dinner or delivering meals to the homebound on Thanksgiving Day. These are great ways to express gratitude to the Lord for the many blessings we have received.

On another Thanksgiving-related item, this year's St. Benedict School 5K Turkey Trot is helping me to try to get back in better shape. Last year's event inspired me so that from the end of December until the end of March I managed to lose 15 pounds and even participated in another 5K event, a trail race in the Akron area.

Then along came the Easter season and a busy summer!

Anyway, this year's 5K walk/run is again a good motivation, this time to make a bit more effort to get in shape <u>before</u> the event and both to have a faster time than last year and to complete it without walking. I'm blessed to have our gym for jogging in if some early mornings are not good for running on the sidewalks or park and to have the Great Guernsey Trail if I occasionally stay over-night at the rectory in Lore City and then exercise in the morning along the trail.

Here are a couple of interesting facts about "Turkey Trots." Since 2015, these Thanksgiving Day run/walk events have surpassed the Fourth of July as "the most popular day to run a race, drawing nearly a million participants to more than 1,000 different events across the country," according to an article at runnersworld.com. "But while the Turkey Trot's popularity is a modern phenomenon, its origins stretch all the way back to 1896. The inaugural trot took place 122 years ago in Buffalo, New York. The 8K cross-country race, hosted by the local YMCA that Thanksgiving Day, drew just six participants, and only four of them made it to the finish line!"

We had around 250 participants last year, and I'm pretty sure we all made it to the finish line! I enjoyed seeing many families participating together and even a number of people who wore some clever Thanksgiving-themed costumes! Again, please note that we're planning to have a Mass at 8:00 a.m. in Lore City on Thanksgiving Day (in addition to a 9:00 a.m. Mass in Cambridge) for celebrating that dimension of thanksgiving as well, especially because the word "Eucharist" means "thanksgiving." The Sts. Peter & Paul parking lot and Social Hall are within walking distance (~1/4 mile) of the starting line for the Turkey Trot at Leatherwood Park in Lore City and could serve as an overflow staging area.

May the Lord help us all to journey together ever more joyful and thankful, always ready for the gift of eternal life.

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE 33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME November 19, 2017

The final judgment will come upon us even as the pains of labor overtake a pregnant woman. Once it begins there is no turning back. Be prepared for God's coming.

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year, and the gospel, like last week's, direct our thoughts to the end of time. Last week the focus was vigilance. This week and next it is "rendering our account." God has given each of us talents, grace, a vocation in life. It is clear from the gospel that we are meant to use those talents for the good of the reign of God. The importance of the parable is that our reward, "Come be happy with me," is not dependent on the size of our talents, but on our use of what we have been given.

The woman in the first reading is praised because she lived her vocation as wife and mother in a most charitable and noble way. Each of us is called to do that.

Proverbs 31:10-13, 16-18, 20, 26-3₁

This prudent woman, wife and mother demonstrates practical wisdom in daily life.

- How much do we employ "practical wisdom" in our lives? Think of examples.

1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

The last days will not come until everything is fulfilled. In the meantime, let us not be asleep, but awake and sober.

- How are we preparing for the "last days?"

Matthew 25:14-30

As servants of the last kingdom, we are to invest and to multiply our gifts creatively and generously.

- How am I investing and multiplying my God/given gifts?

God has a plan for the salvation of the world and for the salvation of each one of us in particular. For the unfolding of that plan God has a particular role for each of us. And, to help us carry out our particular role, God blesses us with specific gifts of the Holy Spirit. We experience life in Jesus as what we were created for by putting these spiritual gifts into action. These spiritual gifts enable us to care for others, especially people who are difficult to love.

In light of all of this, next Sunday's Gospel speaks of talents that a person entrusts to various servants to help the enterprise of his household to continue to flourish while he goes away on a journey. Upon his returns he asks the servants to give an accounting of how those talents were employed during his absence. On the literal level of the parable, the servants were given money to invest. Or, we could see them as abilities they were given for developing other sub-businesses.

There are at least two spiritual ways we can understand the talents that hopefully can help us to become more alive in the Lord. We can see them as those spiritual gifts that God gives each of us and that he wants us to use for building up the Body of Christ, the Church. They are ways his reign and kingdom can be more visibly and actively renewing our world, our lives and the lives of people around us.

Here is a brief array of spiritual gifts drawn from various Bible passages, identified by a Catholic ministry called the Siena Institute. When the Holy Spirit gives us one or more of these spiritual gifts and we put them into action, others grow in their relationship with the Lord. They include craftsmanship, discernment of spirits, encouragement, evangelism, faith, healing, hospitality, intercessory prayer, knowledge, leadership, mercy, a missionary lifestyle, music, pastoring, prophecy, service, teaching, voluntary poverty, wisdom, and writing. Has anyone told you that when you exercised a gift like what's listed here that it helped him or her to grow substantially in their faith in Jesus? That's one key way we can discover which spiritual gifts the Lord has given us.

Another way to understand the "talents" in next Sunday's Gospel parable is as the people the Lord puts in our lives. As we appreciate them and cultivate those relationships and friendships, the Kingdom of God is built up. We become better prepared for the life of Heaven, where we can experience loving God and others purely and completely. This can help us to appreciate better the people in our lives. Yes, sometimes we might want to dig a hole in the ground for them (!), but the Lord wants to help us at least to "put them in the bank." This can mean that we turn to the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul teaches in Romans 8:26-27, to help us to pray for others when we experience difficulty and weakness in loving them.

May the Lord continue to bless us with specific gifts of the Holy Spirit for the unfolding of His kingdom in our midst here in Guernsey County. And, may the Lord help us to love the people he places in our lives – all of them!




