**WEDDINGS:** Arrangements must be made six months in advance.





# SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 24, 2017

Our readings are filled with images of the Lord's enduring love for us, and this love is brought to fulfillment in the angel's greeting to the Blessed Virgin Mary. As we prepare to enter into these sacred mysteries of salvation, let us ask the Lord for the grace to be open to the mystery of the incarnation and for the grace to say yes to the Lord.

God's love is faithful. Mary will give birth to a son. Holy is his name.

The first reading focuses on the promise made to David—a member of his family would be a great king whose kingdom would last forever. This reading is filled with the fidelity of God. "I called you... I have always been with you... I promise to be with you forever... He will be like a son to me... I will never take my love away from him."

The promise is fulfilled in the Annunciation. By the power of the Spirit, Mary will give birth to a child and "he will be the ruler of the family of David."

In both of these readings we see the power of God at work in human beings—God's faithful love made real in history.

#### 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 16

I will be a father to him and he shall be a son to me.

How have you shown your love for your son/your father?

#### Romans 16:25-27

The revelation of the mystery kept secret is now manifested.

- What do you know of the prophetic messages of the Old Testament?

#### Luke 1:26-38

You will conceive in your womb and bear a son and you shall name him Jesus.

- What difference does Mary's "yes" to the Angel make in your life?

Where does God like to be? Does God, the Creator of Heaven and Earth, have a favorite dwelling place? Both our 1st Reading and our Gospel for next week, for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, address these questions.

In the time of King David, ~1000 B.C., the Israelites still had the Ark of the Covenant that God had asked Moses to construct about 250 years earlier. It was the chief focal point for the presence of God on Earth. The Israelites would sometimes bring the Ark to a battle site to be more open to the victorious action of God in their midst. It is described in Exodus chapter 37 to have been about half the size of our current altars, made of wood but lined with gold. There were poles for carrying the Ark by twelve priestly assistants, one for each of the twelve tribes of Israel, six on each side.

The Ark was maintained within a tent, specially designated for it. But King David was inspired to provide a more dignified place for the Ark than a tent. The prophet, Nathan, responded with a word from the Lord, to tell David that it would be his son who would build a temple for Him and for the Ark, which did happen under his Son, Solomon.

In the Gospel, we see God turning the tables. There, God is the one who is indicating where <u>he</u> would like to dwell.

In a special way, the fulfillment of God's enduring dwelling place was to be through Mary, becoming a new and living Ark of the Covenant. Mary is ultimately identified as the New Testament Ark in Revelation 11:19 (the last verse of Revelation 11) – 12:2.

How can we appreciate Mary as the Ark of the Covenant? According to Hebrews 9:4, the Ark of the Covenant contained the Ten Commandments, some manna and Aaron's staff. Mary carried Jesus in her womb, the living Word of God and the One to whom the manna referred.

A key shift takes place in Mary: from dwelling in either a tent or in one temple, God shows that He prefers to visit and to dwell in a <u>person</u> and in <u>many</u> buildings.

That's where we become part of the picture. God does want us to be living tabernacles, too, open both to God's presence and to our responsiveness by living our lives in ways that give God glory. St. Therese the Little Flower evidently once wrote that she felt drawn to genuflect as people passed by her who had just received Holy Communion. She perceived them as being living tabernacles.

May the Lord indeed continue to form our daily lives that we give witness to both, the presence of the Lord and the action of the Lord, as His living tabernacles.

# Pastor's Letter

I would like to repeat saying "thank you" to Sr. Carol Juckem, OSF, for sharing her creativity with us through the St. Benedict School Christmas Program, which was presented this past Thursday, December 14th. Not only did she organize and lead the students through many practices to prepare for the program, she also wrote the very program itself. This year's program was entitled, "Families, Shine On" and built on some of the themes from previous programs she has written and presented here too.

Thank you also to Mrs. Janine Bock who has volunteered many hours for developing various music groups not only at St. Benedict School – for example, the school's band – but also some Christ Our Light Parish groups like a high school "praise band" and a children's choir. We all have benefitted both from our students being able to begin learning a musical instrument and from having venues and groups through which those musical talents can be shared within our worship.

I know many people travel during this holiday season. Please continue to bring back bulletins from the various parishes you visit while you're away. We can get so many interesting ideas from what other parishes are doing and experiencing the Faith alive in other settings can also be very refreshing.

If you would like to participate in the March for Life in Washington, D.C. this year, please note that the event is a little earlier in the month of January this year. Our local Knights of Columbus Insurance Field Agent, John Spencer, is organizing two buses for the southern part of our Diocese again. Sign up sheets are still available at both of our parish locations. If you haven't participated in this overnight event, I would highly encourage you to do so. It's open both to individuals and to families. One of the buses would be passing through Cambridge at 4:15 a.m. (!) on Thursday morning, January 18th, and arriving back here late evening on Friday, January 19th. In addition to the March itself, which begins with a rally at the Mall around 11:30 a.m., is at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, January 19th.

But, one of the highlights each year is the Mass for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception the evening before. Once we as a group settle in at our hotel, we journey over to the National Shrine to try to get some decent seats. The Basilica is usually filled, including the main church upstairs, all of the side chapels and even all of the basement chapels. It's a very inspiring experience to be part of a gathering of faith and hope like that.

May the Lord help us all to journey together both grateful for the gift of this life and always ready for the gift of eternal life.
