

As we enter into the New Year, may the Lord guide our resolution-making this weekend. May our resolutions help us to be more open to Our Lord's saving graces.

Here are some suggested resources for the month of January that are available to all for free through our www.formed.org account. Again, you may register for free using our parish's access code: QARQ3C.

Several suggested resources for this month focus on conversions to the Church, which is appropriate since we observe the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul during the month of January.

Try the online book entitled, <u>Night's Bright Darkness</u>, by British poet Sally Read, who chronicles her recent conversion from being a staunch atheist and deeply anti-Catholic feminist to Catholicism. As a gifted writer, she writes in "vividly poetic language."

A 65-minute audio CD by Jennifer Fulwiler entitled, My Conversion Diary: From Atheism to Catholicism, is also available. She is a writer from Austin, Texas, who is a regular contributor to the weekly Catholic newspaper, National Catholic Register.

And, also featured this month at formed.org is an hourand-a-half video documentary entitled, <u>Convinced</u>, that highlights the conversions of 21 different people including Abby Johnson, Jeff Cavins, Patrick Madrid, Mark Shea, Leah Libresco, Matthew Leonard, Taylor Marshall, *Scott Hahn(!)* and John Bergsma.

Formed.org also has a "Kids' Korner" with plenty of resources, including a children's story, <u>The Giant King</u>. And, they have apps available for both Android and Apple smart phones to make viewing content on the go even more convenient.

May the Lord help us all to journey together both grateful for the gift of life in Jesus Christ and always ready for the gift of eternal life.

# READING FOR THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD January 7, 2018

In our search for the Lord we need go no further than to behold the faces of our family, neighbors, and friends, for the presence of Christ dwells within the hearts of all God's faithful. As we prepare to celebrate these sacred mysteries, let us turn to the Lord for mercy and pardon for the times we have not paid homage of the presence of Christ in the world.

The birth of Christ is the manifestation (epiphany) of God in the world. In Christ, salvation has come for everyone, Jew and Gentile alike.

The reading from **Isaiah** tells us that the light has come, a light for all to walk in. In the light, the glory of God shines forth. This light is the epiphany of God. The Gospel tells us that this light shone in the east and brought visitors from afar to see this manifestation of God's love. Christ is the One to whom all people will come, bringing gifts fit for a king. He is the "newborn King of the Jews" and, indeed, of all the earth. He reveals the limitlessness of God's love for all.

#### **Isaiah 60:1-6**

#### Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem!

- How have I experienced the presence of God in my life?

#### **Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6**

The Gentiles are co-heirs, members of the same body.

- Who in my life has become most difficult to see as Christ-like?

#### **Matthew 2:1-12**

They found the child with Mary his mother ... and did him homage.

- Do I truly do "homage" to the Lord? How faithful am I to the Lord?



### A key theme that unfolds throughout the

**Bible** is that God established successive covenants with His special people in the Old Testament leading up to the covenant He made with and for us all through His Son, Jesus.

Those covenants, those "testaments," that God established were with successively larger groups of people, from Adam and Eve through King David. God promised Eve that one of her offspring would defeat the evil one. This promise – a covenant – was established between God and a couple. Other covenants are made with Noah, leader of a family, using the sign of the rainbow, with Abraham, the leader of a tribe, with Moses as leader of a nation, and with King David, who was the leader of a kingdom, which is a collection of nations under one king.

The final covenant God made with us – the New Testament – was made between God the Father and Jesus. Jesus represents the Church that God established as a <u>universal</u> community/kingdom. In Jesus, then, the Father established a <u>universal</u> covenant. The worldwide and even universal scope of the Church is at the heart of what is celebrated on the Epiphany. The visit and adoration of the Magi is to show that Jesus is the Messiah for the whole world – and even for the whole universe!

The adoration of the Magi has significance on several other levels as well. When St. Matthew says that, "They

prostrated themselves and did him homage," it indicates that they were, on one level, acknowledging Jesus as a king. Then, that they gave him a gift of incense indicates that they recognized him as having divine quality. Some astronomers report surprising movements of the planet Jupiter about the time of Jesus' birth. That could have spoken a message to the Magi. The planet Jupiter was commonly associated with the universal god, Zeus. Evidently a common religious view at that time was that each nation had its own god. So, with the Magi offering Jesus both homage and incense could indicate that they were surrendering worship of their own gods to worship Jesus instead. The Magi could have been acknowledging the universal quality of both Jesus' reign as king and his divinity.

The Magi also offered Jesus the gift of myrrh, which was used as a burial spice. This could be seen as a prophetic gift foreshadowing Jesus' death. Putting the three gifts together, furthermore, could be seen as foreshadowing of Jesus' kingly and priestly power over death as well.

May we benefit from the covenant – the secure promise – that Jesus established with the Father for us. May we benefit from his invitation to us to be gathered under the protection of his universal reign, which is both kingly and priestly. May we, like the Magi, acknowledge Jesus as our king, as our God and as the one who can and who wants to save us from sin and death.
