





As we are immersed in the openness of summer time and with the month of July just around the corner we often think about the concept of freedom during this time of year. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have a whole section of their excellent website dedicated to fostering greater religious freedom and conscience rights. Their website is [www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org). At the middle banner click on the "Issues and Action" tab and select "Religious Liberty" from the options.

Among the sub-categories at that page is "Religious Liberty at Home" (meaning here in the USA). There we can find resources related to *The Right to Practice Faith in Business*, *Discrimination against Christian Students on Campus*, and *Discrimination against Catholic Adoption Services*. We ask the Lord to help us respond courageously with our Lord's compassionate truth to the issues of our time.

On Sunday evening, July 8th, together with the Guernsey County Right to Life organization, we will welcome national-caliber speaker, Rita Marker. Her presentation on end-of-life issues and conscience rights is planned for 6:00 p.m. in the St. Benedict Church Social Hall. Please feel free to bring a friend or family member for this presentation that will draw people from throughout the area.

This is a great time of year for picnics! So please plan to attend the Sts. Peter & Paul Feast Day Mass and Picnic this Friday, June 29th, in Lore City. We will begin with a Mass at 6:00 p.m., followed by a picnic at the pavilion and

social hall. There are games and activities planned in addition to the full variety of picnic foods. If you haven't signed up for the picnic, simply call the parish office so that we can have a closer number for planning purposes. You are welcome to simply show up that evening as well. As always, all of us are marshaled into the "Good Weather Prayer Committee."

And, there are a number of good suggested movies about saints for the month of July at the [formed.org](http://formed.org) online faith formation resource. "Mother Teresa" starring Olivia Hussey and "Pope John Paul II" starring Jon Voight are both available at that website.

A classic movie about "the flying saint," St. Joseph Cupertino, is also at that website. St. Joseph was an exceptionally humble saint who was blessed with the grace of levitation during prayer. Evidently during community prayer times, another Franciscan friar would be assigned to sit next to him and hold onto his habit if he started to float upward! The movie, "The Reluctant Saint", focuses on the circumstances in his life leading up to the grace of levitation becoming more frequent.

Also at the website is a two-hour radio theater presentation called "An Ode to St. Cecilia," that according to the website's promo includes "cinematic sound, original music, and the award-winning talents of highly-acclaimed British actors, including: Hayley Atwell, Sir Derek Jacobi, Brian Blessed, and Dame Siân Phillips." That might be a good resource to download and listen to while driving over long distances.

## READINGS FOR THE 13TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

July 1, 2018

**God's creative power flows through Jesus to heal and restore life. By our participation in this liturgy, we are in touch with the living God.**

The focus of the gospel is the power of Jesus over death. Mark continues his revelation of the divine authority and power of Jesus—over evil spirits, over sin, over wind and water and even over death. It is a prefiguration, a hint at the Resurrection, when Jesus will be ultimately victorious over death.

The reading from Wisdom focuses on the reality that we were created by God to live forever. God loves us and wants us to live. God makes all things good. To do evil is a choice. Evil exists, but we choose to follow either evil or God.

The readings together tell that those who choose to act in faith have life. Jairus' daughter lived because Jairus believed in Jesus.

### Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-25

**God created us not for evil and death, but for the fullness of life. We are made in the image and likeness of God, destined for eternal life.**

- What does it mean that “we are made in the image and likeness of God”?



### 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15

**Jesus became poor that we might be rich. As he was generous with us, so should we share our surplus with those who are in need.**

- Who do you know who is in need? What could you do to help relieve their need?

### Mark 5:21-43

**Jesus heals the woman with the hemorrhage and restores the daughter of Jairus. His touch is the source of life.**

- How have you experienced the healing touch of Jesus in your life?

**Life and death! Health and sickness!** Our greatest sorrows and joys and our greatest courage and weaknesses are experienced at the boundaries and overlapping of these realities. These experiences can bolster our faith and/or severely test it.

Ultimately, however, our Mass readings for next Sunday are about life and about healing. They illustrate for us that Jesus is the source of life and healing.

The Gospel begins with Jesus going back to the other side of the lake. Crossing back and forth over the lake expressed different kinds of places that needed to be redeemed. Jesus went back to where His rescue mission was needed by people who were striving to be good followers of Judaism. On this side of the Sea of Galilee Jesus encounters a synagogue official and a woman who had suffered from hemorrhaging for many years. She wanted to live her Jewish faith but couldn't because of how the bleeding had rendered her ritually unclean.

On this side of the Sea of Galilee where Jesus lived, in the town of Capernaum, most people were simply “pressing upon” him. Most people were there simply because there was the excitement of a parade or of a festive crowd gathering. Only two were truly reaching out because they needed and wanted him to touch their lives. The synagogue official had an earnest focus and need that drew him to turn to Jesus, regardless of the opinion of others who might have objected to some of Jesus' teaching. The woman with the hemorrhage needed Jesus to heal her so that she could participate in the faith life of the community again. The Lord invites us likewise to look into our hearts to those areas and reasons why we need a savior.

How about when we go to receive Holy Communion, for example? When we are in line do we have the urgency and focus of the synagogue official or the woman with the hemorrhage? Are we thinking about a world of other things like wondering what people think about our hairstyle or our shoes? Or, do we have an *aching* intention in our hearts that is drawing us with hope toward Jesus?

And, as has been mentioned before as well, it is good for us to consider where our faith is focused. Is the focus on *our* own faith or is the focus on *God*? Are we in effect trying to believe in our own faith (“I hope *my* faith is strong enough,” we often think to ourselves)? Or, do we direct the focus onto the *Lord* (“Lord, I believe in *you* and in *your* good will for me and my loved ones. Help me to trust in *your* providence and in your right timing for what is truly best for us”)?

Let us continue our daily journey with the Lord, whether in the boat passing through turbulent, unredeemed seas or on land moving through a crowd with the focus of so many on themselves rather than on the Lord. Let us be grateful for the mercy and providence He has already shown us and look forward to His love for us being renewed each day.


