Well, the numbers have been crunched and the bills have been paid and here are the totals from the 2016 Parish Bazaar!

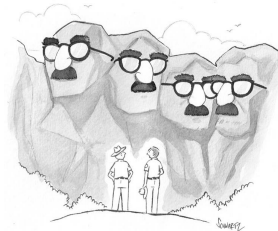
We served 1,310 for dinner:

When we remove the starter cash,
we ended up with a gross deposit of :
\$47,789.82.

When the bills were paid,
we ended the bazaar with a net deposit of:
\$36,273.28.
