

# The Readings for next Sunday, March 29, 2015 Palm Sunday The Passion of the Lord

Isaiah 50:4-7 Philippians 2:6-11 Mark 14:1-15:47



My dear parishioners,

I would like to take this opportunity to review both for your benefit and mine what I see as the purpose of these weekly letters in our bulletin. I find letter writing, which with the advance of technology, is becoming a practice of the past, a basic form of personal communication. Fundamentally I want to share with you what's going on in the parish and the how and why we are doing things in this or that way.

For instance the Partner's in Charity Appeal which is certainly the most significant appeal for funds that takes place in the entire year. We have begun this process a few weeks ago on the Third Sunday of Lent. We are off to a decent start collecting \$23,940 toward our parish goal of \$45,000. However, being sensitive to the value and meaning of the Lenten Season I've decided that our next big push will happen after we've celebrated Easter and Divine Mercy Sunday. Almsgiving is one of the disciplines of Lent, most assuredly, but I don't want it to be the dominant theme of this Lent at St. Roch's.

There is an excellent video that has been put together about Partners in Charity and how the funds are applied and I would like to show this during the Sunday Masses when we ask for your sacrificial assistance again.

What else is going on? Well, I am really excited about bringing the 33 Days to Morning Glory to its apex on this Wednesday, March 25 when a number of us will be making the Marian Consecration at the 6:30 Mass that night. Week by week guided by exceptional teachers we have been coming to understand how our dear Mother, Mary wants to help us become true disciples of Jesus. I hope that many of you who have been using the book will join us for this powerful, grace-filled moment.

Can you believe that when we next gather for the Sabbath Day Masses it will be the beginning of Holy Week with Palm Sunday. There is nothing that we do throughout the entire year that begins to compare in importance with the events of Holy Week. This is why this or any parish exists in the first place; to be in communion with Jesus and to make real in our own lives His victory over sin, satan and death. I am deeply grateful that we will be baptizing a number of adults at the Vigil this year. Please make arrangements now for all of us to be together during the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.

To be in the best possible state of mind and soul you might want to think about making a good confession before Holy Week. I will be assisting at the following Penance Services that are of course open to all. St. Joseph's in Charlton, this Tuesday, March 24 at 6:30; St. Joseph's in Webster, next Monday, March 30 at 6:30; and our local service this year at St. Ann's in North Oxford on Tuesday, March 31 at 7 pm.

These are powerful days that can make a significant difference all year long.
