Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31 First Letter of Saint John 3:18-24 John 15:1-8



My dear parishioners,

What did you think of the video we showed at Mass last weekend? Of all the years that I've been a parish priest it was only the second time that I've ever done that. I didn't hear anything from parishioners one way or the other about it. I chose to show the video that the diocesan Office for Communications produced because I thought it gave a face and voice to the Partners in Charity annual appeal. It also I believe, helped us to see in flesh and blood real ways how our Church is concerned with carrying out Jesus' work of being the Good Shepherd in this local area at this time. It is our generosity and sacrifice that makes this a reality here and now.

The envelopes are in the pews again this weekend and if you haven't already made a pledge or contribution, please prayerfully consider doing so at this time. Perhaps you may want to add to the contribution you've already made. If everyone does their part I feel confident we can make our goal.

On another topic; one beautiful work that continues to be done in the spirit of Jesus the Good Shepherd is the care of pregnant mothers and their newborn babies at Visitation House. This is something that you know is very dear to my heart. I was at the house last Tuesday to offer Mass and meet with some of the mothers who are planning to have their babies baptized. It was a holy moment for me holding our newest "angel" only six days old when he snuggled into my neck and fell asleep. He's got the longest fingers; maybe he'll be a surgeon!

The girls and their babies are well provided for. One of the things I assure you of is that they eat well and healthy. Keeping the doors open is always a challenge. While many Catholics from throughout the Diocese support Visitation House, it is not an agency that officially receives funds from Partners in Charity. One of the ways that the revenue comes in is through he **Baby Bottle Drives** that many parishes put on. I would like to begin ours this week so that nine weeks from now on Father's Day we can collect the bottles filled with your change.

The genius of this is that it combines prayer and little sacrifices. You are asked to spiritually adopt a child conceived but possibly in danger of being aborted. Give the child a name and pray each day over the next nine weeks for this vulnerable little one. With confidence that our prayers are answered the bottles are then collected and put in the basinet that will be by our Blessed Mother's statue. If we are going to build a Culture of Life it needs to be done by one good choice at a time.

Mother's Day Cards

Every year I have the privilege of offering the nine Masses that constitute the Novena for the Mother's Day Cards. Your offering for these cards is also part of the life saving ministry that goes on at Visitation House. The cards will be available the next two weekends.


