Paul's Epistle—As we celebrate our Independence as a Nation we must reflect on how we use our freedom as a people. The gift of freedom is the opportunity to do the right thing when given the chance. This poses two challenges; what's the right thing to do and what will it take to do the right thing.

The Church teaches that each one of us has the capacity and obligation to form our conscience in light of the Truth of the Gospel. To do this requires time and study as we strive to understand more fully what it is to be a people made in the image and likeness of God.

That being said, we will continue to offer opportunities to help you grow in your understanding and practice of the Faith. It is not easy to follow Christ, nor did He say it would be. Even He experienced people taking offense at what He taught and refused to listen to Him. To fully understand the Church's teaching on human sexuality and living a moral life takes a willingness to be open to a life that is counter-cultural.

The decision last week by the Supreme Court was the result of a long-coming disconnect of what it means to be human and how one expresses their affection for another person. As your pastor I am obligated to make sure that you are given every opportunity to come to know these truths and be supported in your desire to practice them according to our Faith.

This is no easy task and yet souls, mine and yours, are at stake. I believe no pastor takes lightly their responsibility to guide their parish in truth and charity towards heaven.

Let us all pray to God that He may give us the grace we need to accept the Truth's He has set before us; that we might choose life and love those who agree and disagree with us.

#### TARGET RED CARD PRO-



### "What Immaculate Conception School and a Catholic Education Meant to Me as a Student" Winner of one of three \$1,000 IC School Alumni scholarships graduate Taylor VanWell

What Immaculate Conception School means to me is that our Catholic faith will be instilled into the next generation. This understanding of God and our Catholic faith is a great foundation to build our lives on.

There are a lot of differences between IC School and other elementary schools. One of the biggest would be that at IC we got to go to church every week. When I went to IC, we went to church every Friday to listen to Father Bream talk. Going to church helped some of the students become closer to God and their religion. Believe me. I would know.

Having classes of religion also helped me to better understand the ways of God. I remember learning different stories in the Bible, like the first days of creation and the day when Jesus was nailed to the cross. My teachers used creative ways to make us remember the things they wanted us to learn. They used different resources such as games, puzzles, movies, and stories that taught us parts of the bible. I remember learning the Ten Commandments that God wrote for Moses. Our teacher taught us those rules and even had tests on them.

I would say they were quite challenging at first, but finally I got them locked into my head.

My favorite story in the bible has got to be Noah's Ark. The story is about how one man had so much faith in God he was willing to build a humongous boat ... during a drought! God wanted to save Noah and his entire family (his wife, three sons, and their wives) so he asked Noah to build an ark and gather two of every species of animal. This story is my favorite because the ark becomes like a zoo with all the animals. Everyone on the ark had to work very hard every day to care for the animals. Another important thing IC School taught me was to say my prayers. The Rosary probably has the most meaning to me because there are so many events connected to it. I used to protest having to say the whole Rosary before bed, but after I got a lot older, I finally understand the importance to say it. It is one way to stay closer to God and ask for protection and help against the terrible temptations. In the past, I had terrible nightmares. The ones that would make it hard to go back to sleep. After I started to say the rosary and prayed to God and asked for help, I have been able to sleep

peacefully again. I still get a few bad dreams now and then, but I'm not afraid anymore.

I know that God and my guardian angel are watching over me.

I want to say thank you for considering me for this scholarship so that I may further my education and hopefully begin my career goal as a zookeeper. I pledge to keep God close to my heart as he fills me with confidence, faith, and courage to become a good Christian role model for the next generation.
