Paul's Epistle: Happy Father's Day We honor our father's living and deceased this weekend. Let us also pray for a greater understanding of the role fathers play in the lives of their families and our church community. Jesus' revelation of God as our Father gives us an incredible gift for our faith life. No matter what sort of father we have or had it is important that we strive to have a deep and abiding relationship with God the Father.

Fortnight for Freedom begins this weekend and will conclude on the 4th of July. This year the focus is on the call to bear witness to the truth of the Gospel. To do this we must come to understand the consistent teachings on the dignity of each person. We must come to understand that as human beings we are not simply a composition of malleable body parts.



"What Immaculate Conception School and a Catholic Education Meant to Me as a Student" Winner of one of three \$1,000 IC School Alumni scholarships graduate Ashley Brage

There is a poster of Saint John Paul II hanging in my room. Written across the bottom in fancy cursive writing is says this quote: "It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; he is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you." I believe that the one thing we all strive for in our lives is pure happiness. I have discovered that the times that I am truly happy is when I am living my faith. Catholicism has been a huge part of my life ever since I was a young girl. My faith was rooted through my family and religious schooling. I attended IC School from Pre-school until 5th grade. Being able to attend a Catholic school enabled me to grow up surrounded by amazing people that shared my faith. I believe that going to IC School has helped me to stay rooted in my faith by the constant presence of religion that a Catholic school allows.

Personally, I do not remember a lot of my childhood. My friends always reminisce on the childhood television shows they would watch, and I would be sitting there scrambling my brain attempting to recognize at least one that they mentioned. Although I do not remember much of my early childhood, a majority of my childhood memories took place in the walls of IC School. I remember being forced to trek up the giant staircase after an exhilarating day at gym class, and not being sure if I could make it. I remember coming up to the classroom on December 6th, Saint Nicholas' Feast Day, to find milk and donuts awaiting our hungry little stomachs. I remember being at the bottom of the stairs and feeling a wet glob splash onto my head to look up and see my brother who had just 'cleverly' spit on my head. I remember attending Mass every Friday. I remember learning and practicing all of the prayers that make up the Catholic faith. For the little that I remember about my childhood, I seem to recall a lot of my time at IC.

Attending IC allowed me to grow up surrounded by Catholicism. I believe that because I attended IC that it was harder for me to transition to a school where religion was not even allowed to be mentioned. However, I also believe that because I attended IC that I now incorporate my faith into everyday life. Our classroom looked just like the normal public schools, except that we were allowed to go deep and learn about our faith along with our normal studies. I was given so many beautiful graces that a lot of children did not get by being able to attend IC. The main gift going to IC School has given me is that I grew up with my faith being a part of everything I do, so naturally I have continued to

try to incorporate my faith into my everyday life. (Also, lunch was bomb—those chicken patties though..ammi right?) IC is where I began to discover who I was meant to become. The first time I spoke in from of people and performed was at IC, which is a huge part of my life now. In 5th grade, I remember reading an essay I wrote about Betsy Ross for the Modern Woodsman Essay Contest. I recall being so incredibly nervous and hating every single second of it, but I also remember later that year getting my first acting role as Little

Miss Sally Waters in our 5/6 grade play and embracing it. My mom always tells me about how after the play all of the other parents were coming up to her and telling her how amazing I was. Although I think she might be exaggerating, I believe that I found my place at IC and it has lead me to the person I am today. For that I am eternally grateful.

If one day I have children, I want them to be granted the opportunity to attend a Catholic school like I was able to. I am glad that I was able to spend my time surrounded by people that shared the same faith. I am thankful that I was able to discover my interests and talents there. I am grateful to have my Catholic faith and a place that allows children to grow up living it out.
