Pentecost—we often think of Pentecost as an event in the Church, which it was, but we should also realize that it is a dynamic event taking place everyday. The Holy Spirit longs to come into each of our lives and allow us to live out our baptismal calling. The difficulty many face is that we do not often see this manifestation in the lives of those we interact with on a daily basis.

When we think of Pentecost we often imagine the "tongues of fire" or the strong wind and the instant transformation of those touched by the Spirit. Often for those touched by the Holy Spirit there is an overwhelming peace that comes upon them; a deep sense of love that is unlike anything else ever experienced and at the same time there is still the same challenges and struggles life poses. The more we allow the Holy Spirit to be a part of our life the more we can see the profound impact our lives can have on others.

Rosary—As we announced last week we are asking people to offer one rosary a week for peace in our world and for our Supreme Court as they decide on the issue of marriage. It was brought to my attention some people are not very comfortable praying the rosary as it was not something they grew up doing.
