

# Be Changed by the Ones You Encounter

I write this column on Wednesday, April 22, 2015, two years to the day after I celebrated Krystle Campbell's funeral at St. Joseph Church in Medford after her death in the Marathon Bombing in Boston. Two years ago I was left the task of trying to find words to help bring some small bit of solace to the Campbell family and the many people who were there for her Mass. The church was full and everyone from Governor Patrick to Cardinal Seán were gathered to pray for this shining soul, a person who would give you anything she had if it meant your happiness. Many loved her and the church wasn't big enough to hold all who desired to come. I think we had 200 people at least who were stuck outside.

I don't remember everything I said that day, but I do remember saying she was never really gone from us, that she would always be with us. I believe this because I'm Catholic and I know it to be true that the all souls are eternal. How many times have we felt the presence of someone we love who has passed away? How many times have we thought there might have been an intercession by their prayers? It is something we feel, but it is not just a feeling, it is real.

This may not seem so profound to some people, and perhaps it is not, but the sense of loss is usually the hardest thing to get over; that sense that you won't physically see the person any more. I think of the contacts still in my cell phone that I cannot delete for some reason. My friend Jimmy who committed suicide or my friend Fr. Dan Kennedy who died from a defective heart: these numbers I hold onto for some weird reason. I can't call them and their phones are probably disconnected, but for me holding onto them means a little piece of them is still with me every day. Now, I know they still live. They are eternal just as we are, and I believe I feel their presence in my life, as I feel Krystle's as well. I hadn't been at Saint Joseph's that long when the Marathon bombing happened, but I always felt God had placed me there for a reason, perhaps to meet the Campbells, and that experience did have a profound effect on me and I'm a different priest for it. I hope a little bit better too!

I guess my message today is that we find ourselves in places and meeting people every day and we should be changed a little bit by those encounters. We should be moved to change and grow, if it is needed and that life should not be stagnant, but should continue to flow. What a sad life we lead if we cannot change or evolve, hopefully for the better and hopefully in Christ. Look to Jesus, He is perfect and unchangeable but we are not, and to strive to be more like Him is our goal. That is how we grow and change: by following the Good Shepherd and striving to be like Him, knowing that it is the striving that is important. Perfection comes in Heaven.

## Mother's Day Rose Sale





## A Letter from Judith Lowe

Dear parishioners of Our Lady of Sorrows,

After prayerful consideration and conversations with Fr. Chip, I have accepted the position of Director of Music for St. Mary of the Assumption Parish in Milford, beginning June 15. **My last Sunday at Our Lady of Sorrows will be June 14**. As the largest parish in the Worcester Diocese, St. Mary's offers opportunities that I am nearly certain I will not be offered again. While I had hoped to journey with you through through the heavy winds of your new reality as part of a collaborative, I believe that God is calling me to Milford. Thank you for the time with you. I look forward to maintaining friendships with those of you who have been so kind and truly helpful to me during my stay, albeit short, here at Our Lady of Sorrows. Music is truly a great gift from God.

"I feel the winds of God today, today my sail I lift Though heavy, oft, with drenching spray and torn with many a rift. If hope but light the water's crest, and Christ my bark will use, I'll seek the seas at His behest and brave another cruise."

### Collection

The average cost to run the parish is \$11,371 per week and our expectation is that 69% (\$7,845) will come from the weekly offertory. Last week, the parishioners contributed \$6,306. This number includes the average of our electronic giving. \$681 was collected for the second collection last weekend which was for Home Missions, Black & Native Americans & Military Archdiocese.

### First Communion

This year we will continue our local custom of celebrating First Communion at various regularly scheduled parish Masses during the Easter Season. We will celebrate First Communion at the 4:30 pm Masses on Saturday, May 9 and 16, and at the 10:45 am Masses on Sunday, May 10 and 17.

Why celebrate First Communion during the Easter Season? Since First Communion is a Sacrament of Initiation, the Easter Season is an appropriate time to celebrate it as well as the other Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism and Confirmation. We celebrated Baptisms on April 26 and again on May 3 and Confirmation on May 15—all in the Easter Season.

Why celebrate First Communion at regularly scheduled parish Masses? Why not have "separate" and "special" Masses for First Communion? The key to the answer lies in our belief the Eucharist (First Communion) is a Sacrament of Initiation—initiation into the worshipping community of faith. Separate First Communion Masses and some of the customs surrounding them may give the impression that celebrating the Eucharist and receiving Communion is a once-in-a-lifetime event like a baptism or a wedding. The children are being initiated into the ongoing sacramental life of the parish. It is important for the parish community to be part of the Eucharistic celebration during which the children will share at the Eucharistic table for the first time.

First Communion is a significant moment both for the children and their families and the whole parish community. It's a time for the whole gathered assembly to welcome these children to the table of the Lord. We do so with great joy! It is also a time for us to become newly inspired and open to the Spirit as we witness our second graders move more deeply into their relationship with our God. May the community's active presence and participation at the Eucharistic celebrations during which the children will share for the first time at the Eucharistic table cause all of us to reflect on the gift of the Eucharist in our own lives and in the life of our parish community.
