

I Love the Church

I love the Catholic Church.

Of course this should be no surprise to anyone. I mean, I'm a Catholic priest. It would be bad if I didn't love the Church, right? Well I do love the Church. I love everything about it. I love the little things and the big things and most of all I love the most complicated thing about the Church...us.

Yes, the people, you and me, we make up a huge part of the Church, the Body of Christ. We, the people, the body, can sometimes make it really interesting for each other, but the reason the Church exists is to help us reach heaven.

I also love even the things that some people can't abide like incense; when the smell hits my nose I am transported. I love the good music of the Church, the classics, the chant and even some of the new stuff. I love ritual, the movements and the language we use, the prayers and our spaces; they all mean something, they all teach something about God, about Jesus Christ.

This will shock no one: I also love the rules and laws of our Church, for they guide us in our faith and help us to understand what God wants for us and what our rights and responsibilities are, indeed that we have rights but also responsibilities. I won't get into all of them here in this column, but I will endeavor to illustrate some, such as our responsibility to go to Confession at least once a year! It is a great grace that we can enjoy the mercy of God when we need it, which for most of us is probably more than once a year. We also have a responsibility to support our parish with time and talent and, yes, with our generous donations that support the very many ministries.

Here are some examples from Canon Law: "Christ's faithful are bound to preserve their communion with the Church at all times, even in their external actions. All Christ's faithful, each according to his or her own condition, must make a wholehearted effort to lead a holy life, and to promote the growth of the Church and its continual sanctification. All Christ's faithful have the obligation and the right to strive so that the divine message of salvation may more and more reach all people of all times and all places. Christ's faithful are at liberty to make known their needs, especially their spiritual needs, and their wishes to the Pastors of the Church. Christ's faithful have the right to be assisted by their Pastors from the spiritual riches of the Church, especially by the word of God and the sacraments. Christ's faithful have the right to worship God according to the provisions of their own rite approved by the lawful Pastors of the Church; they also have the right to follow their own form of spiritual life, provided it is in accord with Church teaching."

These above items are right out of Canon Law and are by no means a full accounting of all that we must do or what we have a right to, but I think you can understand that while we do receive so much good from the Church, and rightly so, we also owe so much to the Church as well. We owe the Church because it was established by Jesus Himself and He established it to help us because He knew we couldn't do it by ourselves. So are there rules? Yes. Are they there to make life hard? No, in fact they are there to make life easy just like the rules and laws of the land we live in. Take a look, if you like, at the Canons between 208 and 223 of our Church Law. I think you'll find them enlightening. As I said above, I love the Church, every part of it and I hope we can endeavor over the next few years to enhance our love for Christ and His Church.



Announcement about the Matthew 13 Collaborative

Since the implementation of the Pastoral Plan for the Archdiocese of Boston, Cardinal O'Malley has continually reviewed the collaborative process to insure that our goal to strengthen our parish communities might be realized. After some consultation and praverful reflection, Cardinal O'Malley has decided to realign the Walpole and Sharon Collaborative and has decided to temporarily remove Our Lady of Sorrows Parish from the Phase II Collaborative Process. This modification will permit the Office of the Episcopal Vicar of the West Region and the Office of Pastoral Planning to engage in respectful conversation and prayer with the parishioners of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish to discern together an appropriate manner in which to better serve the people of God of this area of the Archdiocese. Cardinal O'Malley has appointed the Reverend Vincent P. Doolan as the Administrator for Our Lady of Sorrows Parish to insure that pastoral care will continue without interruption. The effective date of this action is June 1, 2015.

Blessed Sacrament and St. Mary's Parishes in Walpole will continue to remain a part of the Phase II Collaborative process under the pastoral leadership of Fr. George C. Hines.

Our Divine Parent

Perhaps most remarkable is the reality that we can call God our Father. Saint Paul states it beautifully in Romans 8:15: "You did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, 'Abba, Father!'" We're asked to name God in the same way Jesus did— intimately, as a child to a parent. It's a privilege we should never take for granted.

Today on this feast, what can you say you know about God from your experience of being God's beloved child? The Hebrews in the first reading could tell of God's mighty deeds for them throughout history. Jesus' disciples could speak to his great miracles and the Spirit moving among them.

These rich stories make up the parents' pages of our baby book—but what can we add to them from what we have known of God?

Catholic Spiritual Writers: Teresa of Avila

How can a cloistered nun, Carmelite reformer, mystic, and doctor of the Church inspire those of us who must live our life of faith in today's world? We face far different circumstances and live in a culture far different from Teresa's 16th century Spain. Not much in our lives seems to match hers. But we can find ourselves in St. Teresa's writings, in the sacred inner ground of the soul. This is where people throughout history have excelled, failed, or struggled.

Teresa originally entered Carmel in an effort to live a good religious life, but soon she found herself absorbed in the lax culture of that monastery. It had little room for reflection with the constant coming and going of visitors. We know how easy it is to lose focus, to stray from our original intention and let down our guard. No matter who we are or what our vocation is in life, at times we are bored, distracted, or embroiled in some other interest. It seems that the holy secret is to strive always to be attentive to God present within and all around us. Teresa teaches us to both live and pray in reality, to find the extraordinary within the ordinariness of our daily life. Whatever our life's calling—be it as a spouse and parent, a religious or priest, a civil servant, doctor, lawyer, or chief cook and bottle washer—we need to choose again what we have chosen and let our prayer flow from this reality. "Thus," Teresa assures us, "even though our works are small they will have the value our love for Him would have merited had they been great."

Her writings are real and readable. In her autobiography, written in obedience to her spiritual director, as well as in her innumerable letters, poetry, commentary, rules, and many spiritual works, Teresa remains her plain-spoken, supremely practical self. She will interrupt her own flights of ecstasy to insert some poignant advice: look for the Lord within your heart and soul where the Blessed Trinity truly lives, drawing you closer with each breath. Look for him also, as she says, among the pots and pans. She advises her younger brother Lorenzo to be prudent in his generosity because he has sons who have yet to marry. She tells one person to sleep more and another to sleep a little less, to find pleasure in the company of others, but to seek especially the company of the Lord, savoring all the sacrifices he presents as if they were the most enviable privileges.

I believe this sense of relationship with God was Teresa's most deeply felt desire. She wanted her readers, whether they were relatives enjoying her correspondence or fellow Carmelites studying her great plan, to observe and then imitate her reverence and familiarity with the Lord.


