
# St. James Parish Mission Statement



# ST. JAMES 75<sup>TH</sup>ANNIVERSARY—DECEMBER 25, 2017



2016—The 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Knights of Columbus, Mason Council #9182, Winter/Lenten Fish Fries started on January 15<sup>th</sup>. The Sound system in Cave Hall was repaired in early February and works great. The Saturday Mass at 4:00 PM went from four Eucharistic Minister Stations to Eight Eucharistic Minister Stations. St. James Parishioners supported the collection to help the Flint Water Crisis with contributions exceeding \$2,500.00. The Evangelization Commission handed out a free book for Lent, Rediscover Jesus, with a chapter for every day of Lent. The 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Blackthorn Dinner/Concert was held on February 27<sup>th</sup>. A Special Collection was

taken on the weekend of February 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> and others bringing in over \$22,000 for the Holy Cross Parish in Fiji following their devastating Cyclone on February 20, 2016. The clothing drive for Fiji just about filled the South Wing of Keating Hall. The Youth Ministry sponsored a Lenten Journey, Taste of Taize, to St. Mary Cathedral in Lansing on March 6<sup>th</sup>. St. James surpassed its 2016 DSA goal on March 14<sup>th</sup> just four weeks into the Pledge Drive. The final totals for the DSA Drive exceeded \$50,000. Fr. Kusi announced that he passed his Citizenship Test on March 19<sup>th</sup>. A new, state of the art sound system was installed in the Sanctuary. Parishioner George Wygant, Major Retired, was appointed Lead Usher by Fr. Kusi. The Mason Ecumenical Good Friday Service was held at the Mason Methodist Church. It was announced that the evening collection was for the Holy Cross Parish and the Villages of Vuna and Navakawau, Fiji, surprising and overwhelming Fr. Kusi. Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday Masses were held at 8:00 AM at Sts. Cornelius and Cyprian and 10:00 AM at St. James. The Fish Fry for Fiji benefit sponsored by Mason Council #9182, Knights of Columbus, was held on April 1<sup>st</sup> and brought in over \$10,000 for Holy Cross Parish and the Villages of Vuna and Navakawau. Sixteen children made their First Communion on April 17<sup>th</sup>. St. James office staff and Parishioners pulled off a huge Surprise 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday Party for Fr. Kusi on April 30<sup>th</sup> after the 4:00 Mass. Fr. Kusi received a new set of Callaway Big Bertha irons, XB adjustable driver, Mac Daddy sand wedges and an Odyssey white hot putter. Many Parishioners also gave Fr. Kusi cards and best wishes. Food service was provided by the Mason Knights of Columbus #9182. (2016 continued next week)

### **COATS FOR KIDS**

St. James parish has given many coats, gloves, hats etc. to our 7<sup>th</sup> Annual "COATS FOR KIDS". Often, I am asked "How we get so many coats? This is because St. James is not the only church involved in the coat drive. There are six Mason churches working along with us. This is largely a Mason community effort with the three elementary schools, and the middle school collecting coats for us.

We have businesses also involved in our success, such as A & W who support us by holding a fundraiser that pays for our flyers. The flyers are given out in all the Mason schools. Every child takes a flyer home. Dart Bank is represented on our committee by two members who set up a donation box at bank headquarters.

The Knights of Columbus reached out and has been helpful in supplying us with some brand new coats. We have recently been given the use of a storage facility by parishioners John and Marie Black. So many volunteers from all of the churches work the sorting of coats and the actual event.

Our Christian Service Commission was established to promote Christian Service among the people of St. James Parish and surrounding community. The Coats for Kids is a Christian Services program. St. James is well located and an excellent place to hold our community coat drive. Since we have been the hosts of this event for 7 years, the Mason community has become aware of the good works that come out of St. James Parish.

# WHAT IS THE CHRISTIAN SERVICE COMMISSION? WHAT DOES IT DO?

You may have noticed at mass that the announcement is made about "4% of our Christian Service tithe goes to..." a specific organization. The Christian Service ministry was started in the early 1990s when Fr. Kenneth McDonald was our pastor. He suggested that the parish tithe part of our contributions to the needy in our community. It was an innovative project. Suggestions were made as to areas of need, and a budget was constructed with the Finance Council.

That same model continues to this day. In June, when the commission meets, the existing list of organizations is reviewed. Changes are made occasionally, members may suggest a new need. An amount and the month when the donation will be sent from the office is agreed upon. Currently there are 18 organizations who receive donations from St. James over the course of a year. They include St. Vincent Catholic Charities, EVE, Inc., Mother Teresa House, Pregnancy Services, Mason Food Bank, and others.

Regular meetings are held on the first Thursday of the month, in April, May, June, Sept., Oct., Nov. In December EVE, Inc. hygiene packets are assembled from the travel size items the parishioners have donated. (Also in June.) New members, or anyone interested in learning more about this ministry, are always welcome! The meetings are not long, much is accomplished, and there is an abiding feeling of reaching out to others in the surrounding communities with love and care, which is what our faith encourages us to do.

### **ELEMENTARY FAITH FORMATION NEWS**



Children are participating in the international Samaritan's Purse "Operation Christmas Child' project for our second year. Filled shoe boxes will be at the local drop off site next week. We

will keep you posted as to where they end up going!

We have begun the poster contest sponsored by our Knights of Columbus with the theme "*Keeping Christ in Christmas.*" Contest winners will receive cash prizes and even have a chance to have their poster, if chosen during the national phase of the competition, made into promotional posters for the following year. The poster paper and instructions were give to catechists. Some children may be working on them in class and some may have taken them home, but they need to be returned to Mr. George Wygant after any Mass the weekend of December 10<sup>th</sup>.

The elementary children and catechists are appreciating the Catholic Children's Bibles donated by the Knights of Columbus this fall. Each bible has been stamped with a "thank you" and these bibles are now in classrooms for all the children to use
