WITNESS TO HOPE UPDATE #5

How about another update on The Witness To Hope Campaign? To that end maybe you saw the Diocese-wide WTH Accountability Oversight Committee 2018 Annual report in your recent *FAITH* magazine (November 2018, can also be viewed @ <u>www.faithmag.com</u>). That report is for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. I'd like to highlight some of its info here.

The total of all pledges from all across our Diocese (Adrian to St. John's and Hillsdale to Flint, 76 parishes) was \$81.8 million! Of that total, \$33.5 million has already been received. The remainder will flow in over the next 2-3 years.

You may recall that as the pledges flow in the share that comes back to any particular parish is on a sliding scale. At first a larger portion stays in Lansing but as the months roll by a larger and larger share goes to the local parishes. To date 60.2% of all received pledges are being used by the Lansing Diocese for the *wider church*. The other 39.8% has already been set aside for the local parish from which the pledger is a parishioner. However, from this point forward 68.3% of the incoming pledges will go to the parish at which the pledger is a parishioner. Over the next 30 months parishes in the 10 counties of our diocese will be receiving thousands, and is some cases tens of thousands, of dollars to fund local projects they chose at the launch of the campaign. Starting in late 2019 there'll hardly be a parish in the adjacent 10 counties where you won't hear nail guns, power saws or back-hoes. Meanwhile, let's take a look, from the *FAITH* article at the things our pledges are funding at the *wider church* level.

The Diocese of Lansing will either endow or pay-in-full such items as: Catholic Charities capital needs, priests pension fund, college seminarians, Major seminarians, Catholic schools financial aid, new HVAC and sound systems at the Cathedral, and more. Please take a look at the full article. I think you'll be very pleasantly surprised at the size and scope of this campaign.

Whether you look at it from the *wider church* perspective, or from the local view, you'll likely get the idea that WTH will reverberate through The Diocese of Lansing for many years after its books close.


