



MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY 75TH ANNIVERSARY, ST. JAMES!

On December 25, 1942, St. James Parish was born. Since then, we, the people of St. James, have always celebrated a double birthday celebration on every Christmas Day. The first and of course of utmost importance is the birthday of Jesus, our Savior, Emmanuel—God is with us. He is the Word made flesh, Son of God and Son of Mary. Jesus brings joy to a world filled with hatred and enmity. He brings peace, love, mercy and kindness to a world filled with violence and revenge—an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. In the words of the prophet Isaiah, Jesus says: "He sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, healing to the brokenhearted, liberty to captives and release to the prisoners." How awesome is that? Our God is truly an awesome God! Yes, Jesus' birthday is really worth celebrating! And so we join with the angels in singing—Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will!


But what are we, the people of St. James, celebrating on our 75th birthday as a parish? First, we are grateful to God for sowing the seeds of faith in the hearts of the forty-three charter members who signed the petition requesting the Most Reverend Joseph H. Albers, Bishop of the Lansing Diocese for a parish of their own in the city of Mason. So on that cold Christmas morning of 1942, Reverend Charles Keating, who was then secretary to the Bishop, together with a crowd of about 45 people filled the Ball-Dunn Funeral Home, not to mark the death of a loved one, but rather the birth of Jesus. The occasion also marked the birth of St. James Parish. These events certainly call for a big celebration; so on September 17th, 2017, we celebrated in style with Bishop Earl Boyea presiding at Mass, together with most of the priests who had served at St. James Parish over the years. It was a blast! And it was also a memorable celebration for us when I was formally installed as Pastor of Sts. James and Sts. Cornelius & Cyprian Parish.

Secondly, because we celebrate the same birthday with Jesus, so we share the same mission. We are also called to bring joy, peace, love, mercy and kindness to our world today filled with violence, terrorism, sexual abuse, hatred, racism, etc. We are also sent to bring glad tidings to the poor, healing to the brokenhearted, liberty to captives and release to the prisoners. Some may think that this may be too overwhelming, but not if we all choose to bring joy, peace, love, mercy, and kindness to just one person in your life—your Mom or Dad, your brother, sister, friend, or neighbor. If you are able to do this, it could be the best Christmas gift you can give to Jesus and to St. James.

Happy Birthday, Jesus! Happy 75th Anniversary, St. James!
