The First Reading gives us a glimpse into the heart of a prophet, and we see how very human he is. Elijah, the great champion of God, flees into the desert, a broken and dispirited man. But like the Israelites of old, he is fed with 'bread from heaven'. Strengthened by this food he continues his journey to Horeb, the mountain of God.

In the Gospel Jesus declares that he is 'the bread that has come down from heaven'. The bread in question is primarily the revelation given to people by Jesus. Only at a secondary level does it envisage the Eucharist. The fundamental reaction called for is one of 'coming to him', which is a synonym of belief. Even though faith is a gift from God it does demand openness on our part.

A Note from the St. Alphonsus Catholic Church St. Vincent De Paul Society: Each year the St. Vincent De Paul Society provides an interim nine (9) month report to the Parish on our activities at this point in time. We use this occasion as an opportunity to thank the parishioners and regular donors for your continuing support and contributions. For the past nine months, we have visited 128 households in the Ocean Springs/St. Martin communities; and have disbursed \$39,467.14 to families or individuals in need of assistance. This assistance included rent, power, gas, water, medicines, food, gasoline vouchers, and a few bus tickets to return home for those stranded in our community. A significant portion of our funds come from the monthly collection for the poor and other donations. In addition, our Society members contributed just over 1000 hours during this nine month period.
