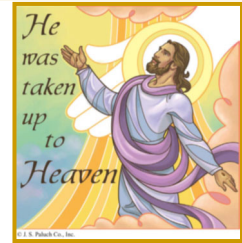

REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Lk 24:46-49

Reflection: Reflect upon/Share about a time when you were able to do something extraordinary.... Were did the power to do it come from? How was God involved? How can you more intentionally live in the power of the Spirit?

Alternative: What do you think you can do to become a better witness for Christ? How can God help you accomplish this? What will you need to do to open yourself to God's help?

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

This week we are looking at our Youth and Young Adult faith formation programs. These include our Middle School, High School and Young Adult offerings including youth Confirmation preparation. Our goal is to help our young people in these age groups continue development of their relationship with the Lord and their relationship with the Church. We try to help them make these relationships integral to living their day-to-day lives. The following are excerpts from our 2016/2017 Work Plan pertaining to this ministry.

Youth & Young Adult Ministries

a) *Emmaus Whole Community Intergenerational Faith Formation: (continuation)*

(1) Goal = Provide opportunity for youth & young adults to participate in learning opportunities as part of our whole faith community in an age appropriate manner. (See listing in Adult & Family Faith Formation Ministries for more detail.)

b) *Middle School Youth Scripture Based Faith Formation: (continuation with schedule change)*

(1) Goal = Help young adolescents begin to see Scripture's application to their day-to-day life situations.

(2) Method = Scripture based theological reflection on real-life situations and service projects.

(3) Gathers: Weekly sessions on Mondays @ 3:30-5:00 pm (implementing schedule change from current Friday sessions)

(4) Includes family welcome meeting for parents and teens at beginning of program year (late Sept)

c) *Middle School Youth Group: (continuation)*

(1) Goal = Provide Christian socialization & service opportunities for M.S. youth that they might experience having fun while living out the Christian life

(2) In collaboration with El Cajon Deanery M.S. Youth Groups

(a) *2nd Friday of each month – Fun night*

(b) *July & Aug fun and fellowship activity program (2 non-consecutive weeks from Mon through Fri)*

(c) *M.S. VBS Camp - Last week of June (Mon through Fri) @ 1:00-3:00 pm; implementing this new program in summer of 2016*

(d) *Young Adults and HS teens comprise the team of facilitators/leaders.*

d) *H.S. Youth Group (continuation with changes)*

(1) Goal = Provide Christian socialization & service opportunities for H.S. youth so at they might experience having fun while living out the way of discipleship.

(2) H. S. Youth Group Gatherings – scripture-based theological reflection on real-life situations

(3) Gathers: On the 2nd Monday of each month (Sept – May); (this is a new gathering time).

(4) In addition to (3) above and in collaboration with other El Cajon Deanery H.S. Youth Groups, we will participate in the following:

(a) *Summer Beach BBQ's*

(b) *Sports activity week (1 week in Aug)*

(c) *Camp Emmaus HS Leadership Camp (Aug)*

(d) *Once/month Socialization Activity (Sep-Jun)*

- (5) Increase participation in regional, national & L.A. Congress youth events; researching most applicable, economically feasible, minimal school conflict, parent supportive events.
- e) Young Adult Group-Post-Confirmation disciples (continuation with changes)**
- (1) Goal = Provide young adults opportunities for involvement in life of Parish
 - (a) *Implement Core Team/Mentorship program as part of the Mission of Church*
 - (b) *Encourage Y.A. Small Ecclesial Communities (SEC's)*
 - (c) *Continue High School Retreat team*
 - (2) Identify & advertise existing programs & events of YA interest
 - (3) Provide opportunities for social gatherings among peers at the parish, diocesan, and regional levels.
- f) Youth Confirmation Program (continuation with changes)**
- (1) Goal: Provide youth with an adult way of being a Christian disciple
 - (2) Utilizes RCIA model of disciple formation -- Prayer, Faith Sharing, Catechesis, and Christian Service – all within the context of Comprehensive Youth Ministry
 - (3) Models Small Ecclesial Communities as a way of living faith by extending the Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy into the week.
 - (4) Family participation in Emmaus is strongly encouraged
 - (5) H. S. Youth Weekend Retreat (held outside of Lenten Season) Apr 28-30, 2017
 - (6) Family Welcome meeting with parents and teens (Oct 2, 2016)
 - (7) Proposing change in program design and schedule (***in process***)
 - (a) *Move away from current 2 sessions/month and youth gatherings; add additional service opportunities between catechetical sessions.*
 - (b) *Research alternative process/program, such as, **Chosen, Decision Point, other approved SD Diocesan programs** with 2 – 12 consecutive weekly sessions to be held on Sundays @ 10:15-11:30 am (between the Masses).*
 - (8) Dialog with parents & respective teen 2 times in the 2nd year @ beginning and before the Rite of Welcoming to provide assistance where needed in determining teen's readiness.

As you can see, our youth and young adult programs are rather extensive. We are able to accomplish this with one staff person who directs the efforts of several young adult and adult volunteers. These programs are quite popular among the young people who participate as they discover that involvement in the Church can become a way of life which supports their innate spirituality and strengthens them for living out their Christianity in their day-to-day lives.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Jesus tells the disciples that they will be witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:1-11).

Psalm — God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord (Psalm 47).

Second Reading — God seated Jesus at his right hand in the heavens (Ephesians 1:17-23) *or Hebrews 9:24-28; 10:19-23*.

Gospel — As Jesus blessed his disciples he parted from them and was taken up to heaven (Luke 24:46-53).

CONTINUALLY PRAISING GOD

In both the first reading and the Gospel we are told about Christ's glorious ascension into heaven. Paul's letter to the Ephesians reminds us that Christ has been seated at God's right hand in heaven, above every choir of angels. There might be a temptation to stay at an awed distance from Jesus Christ. However, the tone of today's readings is far from that temptation. The tone is exultant and the message is urgent. We are to be his witnesses, and the Gospel describes the first witnesses this way: "[W]ith great joy . . . they were continually in the temple praising God" (Luke 24:53).

How can we continually praise God? The answer can be found in the second reading, in which Paul prays that God will give us a "Spirit of wisdom and revelation" in order to know Christ clearly (Ephesians 1:17). TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Second Vatican Council decreed that the devotional life of the Church should be examined and reformed with an eye towards expressing Easter faith. This encouragement for creativity has deep roots in our tradition, and some attempts at reform show great promise. One of the great treasures in our devotional repertoire is a familiar feature of Lent: the Way of the Cross. The faithful walk a path recalling the events of Christ's passion, a contemplative experience increasingly enriched these days by scripture and song. There are fourteen stations in the usual configuration, although in recent years, a fifteenth station of the Empty Tomb has been added. Why stop there? Why not develop a similar journey structured on the theme of the appearances of the Risen Lord?

Over the last decade, a *Via Lucis*, or "Way of Light," has developed as a companion to the *Via Crucis*. It has been celebrated at the Vatican and is catching on elsewhere. There are fourteen stations, beginning with the Women Carrying Spices to the Tomb, continuing with the familiar appearances of the Lord at Emmaus, the Upper Room, the shore of Tiberias. The journey ends with stations recalling the apostles' wait with Mary for the advent of the Spirit, and with Pentecost. This is fertile ground indeed for the genius of artists, musicians, preachers, and liturgists. This is a living example of how many of our traditions are born to fill a great spiritual need, and spread to every corner of the Church. It may even come soon to a church near you.
