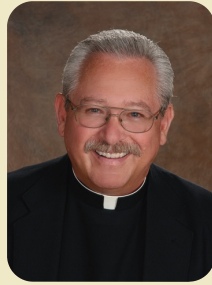

Reflection on the 1st Sunday of Lent, Cycle B

If there is one takeaway from the liturgy of the 1st Sunday of Lent, in Cycle B, it has to be “Repent, and believe in the Gospel.” (Mk 1:15) The meaning of the Greek word we translate as “repent” is not so much about being sorry for what we’ve done but about changing our minds, changing our hearts, changing our ways. It is completely future oriented; leave the erroneous attitudes and actions of the past behind and move into the future in right relationship with God, with our very selves and with others.

In John’s baptism, the ceremonial washing symbolized washing off those erroneous attitudes and actions. It was a symbolic cleansing that allowed the baptized to rise out of the Jordan pure, open to the new life that the messiah would give. Our Lenten practices are similarly a symbolic cleansing that, if we truly enter into them, will allow us to walk into the future in right relationship.

To be in right relationship, we have to really believe the Gospel. Remember that the word “Gospel” means good news. We have to really believe the Good News, and for Mark the good news is that the time of fulfillment of all that God has promised is now, and the good news is that the Kingdom of God is at hand. For Mark it was the historic “now” of two thousand years ago. For us it is the existential “now”; it is in our “today” that the Kingdom is at hand. All we have to do is believe, and walk into it. That’s the good news!

So maybe the question for us, this first week of Lent, should be “what is keeping me from really believing the Good News?”

Am I being held back because I am used to believing some other “gospel” in my life? Am I too committed to some socio-economic principles or political belief system that I can’t let go and abandon myself to the good news of Jesus Christ?

Maybe I live in fear and lack trust that the Good News is truly good news. Do I place my trust so much in the ways of this world that I cannot accept Gospel messages that contradict them?

Maybe I only trust myself, so much that I cannot fully trust the Good News of Jesus Christ? Do I think my logic outweighs the logic of the Gospel? Is the wisdom the Lord spoke, too antiquated for today’s problems?

How can I use Lent to let go of the things that are keeping me from fully accepting the Good News? Can I let go of at least one of those things during Lent and see if it brings me more freedom? Can I use Lent to restrain myself in the ways of the Lord? Can I trust Him?

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

Encounter Majd

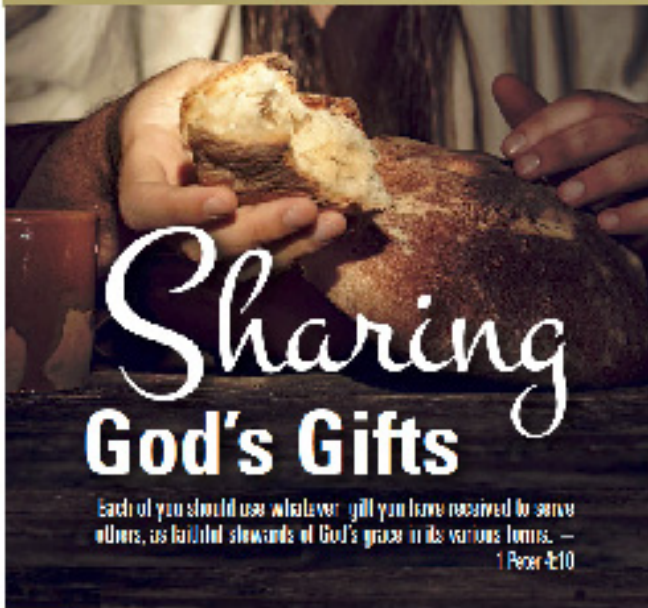
Eight-year-old Majd thought his family was going on a picnic. His mother, Lamya, said they would be back home in a week. But when ISIS attacked their home in northern Iraq, the family fled for good. "What worried me the most were the kids," Lamya says. "Our life was stable and we were doing well; we had a very big house. Our children had everything they needed. But when we fled, I was not able to bring anything for them—even food." Fortunately, the family found an apartment to rent with other displaced families. It is much smaller than the home they had, but it's safer. The children enrolled in a CRS-sponsored school, where the routine provides hope, stability and a sense of belonging. "Education is very important," says Lamya, especially in Iraqi culture. Lamya received training from CRS and became a teacher at the school. Now she has hope for the future. "I really love children, so when I go to class I feel like I am with my family," she says. Her son, Majd, also loves going to school. "Majd is so motivated to go to school. He just wants it to be morning so he can go," Lamya says. "He is relaxed, having fun and more confident." For Majd, school means a normal life—now and in the future.

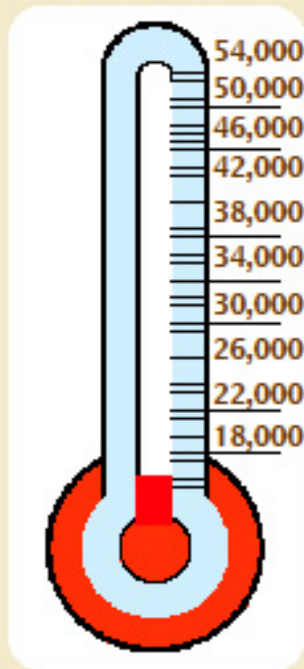

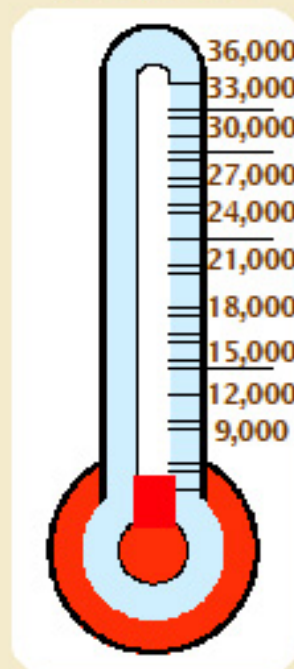
