



From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

I spent the 1996/1997 academic year in the Boston, MA area at John XXIII National Seminary. I was 48 then and didn't like being cooped up at school, nor with school work, any more than I liked it when I was a kid. So, I spent two days of the week in downtown Boston volunteering at Boston's Catholic Worker House, an organization oriented toward embracing the poor.

During my time there, I had some interaction with the Haitian population of Boston. I don't know if it was the prejudice of the Boston people that affected me or if it was purely my own prejudice, but it seemed to me that the Haitian people were not, really, productive members of the community. They were different in the first place and they didn't seem to be interested in doing anything productive.

My experience of Haitians over the last several months, though, has been entirely different. They look the same as those I experienced in Boston, by the way, and many of them don't speak English or Spanish. They speak their version of French. Consequently, when I speak to many of them, I am confronted with a blank stare. I've learned, or assumed, that they don't want to let me know that they don't understand me. Sometimes I think the appearance of them not wanting to do anything is, actually, not knowing what to do.

Many of them have come here as families. The love they have for each other is obvious. They exhibit tenderness and concern for their spouses and children. Those who speak Spanish help those who only speak French to understand, and comply with, our ways. They help out and work hard to make an impossible situation bearable. They are not anything like the people conjured up by my prejudices so many years ago.

The ones with whom I can communicate, have told me that they are just trying to support their families. They left Haiti after the first earthquake when jobs in Brazil were plentiful. They worked, mostly in construction, to help prepare for the Olympics. After the Olympics and the crash of Brazil's economy, there were no jobs and they had to move on. They came up through Central America to Mexico on their way to the United States which, at the time, gave them special status. That door, though, was closed by the Obama administration and they are now stranded in Mexico.

It hurts my heart to see human beings suffer. I think it hurts God's heart too. What if it were my children? As a Christian, I accept that these are my brothers and sisters. How can I let my brothers and sisters suffer so much?

Yet we do. I don't quite get why. I know for a lot of people it is fear, but can't we get beyond the fear and trust in God? Are we afraid that He really didn't conquer evil when Jesus died on the cross? What are we saying to our Lord when we refuse to help His, our, brothers and sisters?

Some might say that we, the U.S., are doing a lot to help; we give more than any other country in foreign aid to help reduce global poverty. That's true but how does that relate to how much income we have? In 2014 we gave \$23.4 billion in poverty focused foreign assistance. That was .7% of our federal budget. In 2012, the last year that I could find this statistic, we gave .19%, of our gross national income to poverty reducing foreign aid. That puts the US in 19th place behind most industrialized nations. According to the report I've been referencing, Americans spend more on candy, lawn care, and soft drinks than the US government spends on poverty-reducing foreign assistance.

I think the Gospel is more important than any other considerations when we make decisions on how to act in life. I know, that's my job. But, if I didn't believe it I wouldn't do this job. We each confront different situations and different people every day of our lives. I think the test of our Christianity is how we respond to those people and situations. My question is, "When St. Peter, at the pearly gates, asks us why we didn't help, what excuse do we think he will accept?"

¶ PARISH FINANCES ¶

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE 7th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow." Today Jesus continues the powerful teaching of his Sermon on the Mount. Typical of this famous sermon, here he urges us to see things in a new way, specifically regarding situations and people who bother us. First, he tells us not to seek revenge. Instead, we are to demonstrate incredible generosity. Then, he instructs us to "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

These instructions don't come naturally to most of us. We are much more inclined to want to get even with those who cause us to suffer, and to wish ill for those who have hurt us. But Jesus proposes another way.

In truth, what good does it do to seek revenge or foster hate? It only continues the cycle of evil. Jesus encourages behavior that will stop the cycle short. He gives us a model that--although it may not change the heart of our "enemies"--will nonetheless change OUR hearts for the better. When pressed into service for one mile, if we voluntarily go two, then WE are the ones whose attitude and experience is certain to change. Instead of spending the length of that one mile cursing and complaining, we spend the length of two enjoying a surprising kind of freedom: "I chose to do this," instead of "I am being forced to do this."

When we practice the generosity of giving more than we are asked, and the charity of praying for those who persecute us, we will find ourselves in a position to transcend the trouble. It sets us free to not be mastered by the evil around us. Thus, we are able to help end the cycle of evil and begin a new cycle of love and peace.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us to love our enemies and to pray for those who persecute us. It is one of the most challenging commands of the Gospel for believers. We should consider how well we fulfill this command of the Lord.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

Is it true that Friday is still a day of abstinence? If so, why do we eat meat?

Answer:

Church law and practice is universal, but some things can be changed or modified by a conference of bishops with Rome's approval. Abstaining from meat is a good example. Canon 1251 says, "Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the conference of bishops is to be observed on Fridays throughout the year unless they are solemnities." The bishops in the USA obtained permission from Rome to do penitential and charitable works in place of abstinence on Fridays.

Friday should still maintain its penitential character through our personal sacrifices and good works. Our personal practices are not limited or defined by church law.
