Second Reading : Romans 8:31b-34

Gospel : Mark 9:2-10

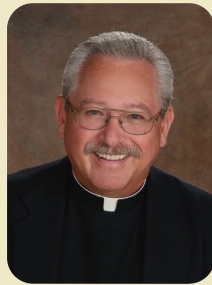

Dear parishioners,

Who do you listen too? CBS News, NBC, CNN, Fox? Do you listen to the assertions of one political party over another? Does television, radio, movies, newspapers, and the Internet shape your values, beliefs, perceptions, and behavior? In the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent, Cycle B, God tells us to listen to Jesus.

The imagery of this Gospel shows Jesus as the “beloved Son” to whom the Father hands over the workings of His kingdom. He is “well pleased” with the manner in which His Son is performing His work. He tells us to “listen to Him” if we want to be aligned with the will of God for our world.

The first question, I think, is “Do we want to be aligned with the will of God for our world?” Do we trust that His will is right for our world? Will doing His will make our world a better place? Will doing His will make my life, and the lives of my family, better?

The second question is “How can I listen to Jesus so that I can know God’s will for me?” Jesus lived two thousand years ago. It was easy for Peter, James and John to listen to Him. They hung out with Him day-by-day. They could ask Him questions for clarification and discuss their understanding of the questions of life with Him. How can we come close to that?

If we recognize the Gospel as the living Word of God, then we can do relationship with it (Him). If we listen with the intention of listening to Him, He will touch our hearts, He will reach into our souls and challenge many of our previously unchallenged beliefs. People comment about this occurrence all the time; they say that something in the Gospel really touched them. It happens to me all the time. The power of the Gospel still causes changes in my life.

Also, we believe the words of John 14:26; “The Advocate, the holy Spirit that the Father will send in my name—he will teach you everything and remind you of all that (I) told you. He is the Spirit of truth which, in John 13:16, Jesus says will lead us to “all truth”. If we believe these words are meant for us, and believe that the way Jesus leads us now is through the Holy Spirit, then we are open to the Spirit’s working with us in our day-to-day lives to lead us to this truth.

There are many ways of describing how we might listen to the Holy Spirit working in our lives. No matter the method, they require that we pay attention and reflect on the occurrences of our day-to-day lives in order to see God working through them. It means that we can’t just let life lead us around blindly. Rather, we look for God’s presence in those occurrences and in the encounters of our day. When we can see God’s presence, we begin to see meaning and come to insight about God’s will for us.

To whom do I now listen, in my life? To whose will do I respond? What can I do, what changes can I make, to begin to hear the voice of God’s “beloved Son” more clearly? How can I align myself more closely to God’s will?

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).
