

From the Pastor



4th Sunday of Lent Cycle A

The Gospel this Sunday is all about seeing the way God sees. It seems to me elementary that we might all want to do this but like the situation of the man born blind, in the story, there are plenty of people that work against our seeing God's truth.

I attended college after my military service and because of the responsibilities of my life I had to find work which would allow me the flexibility to work around my class schedule. I initially acquired a securities license and worked in sales for a mutual fund company. They taught me to be as nice as I could be to the people whom I was trying to sell but also taught me to confuse them so they would need my help making a decision. Of course the desired decision was to buy, buy, buy...

It was to my benefit if they bought. If I helped them see the ins-and-outs of mutual funds and investing, they would likely make an independent decision and might hold off or seek a better investment elsewhere. It was, seemingly, to my advantage that they didn't see.

The man born blind, in our Gospel story, is confronted with people, the Pharisees and Jews, who evidently thought it to their advantage that people didn't see the truth about Jesus. Look at how his neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar treat him, how the Pharisees treat him and how his own parents treat him. The man born blind exhibits tremendous courage as he holds on to the truth that he is beginning, more and more, to see.

As we follow the story we discover the man's insight growing throughout his struggle. Jesus is first "the man called Jesus". Later, he says that Jesus is "a prophet". As he continues in this struggle he affirms that Jesus must be from God and later, when Jesus invites him to believe in the Son of Man, he acknowledges him as Lord, makes an act of faith and worships him as God.

Jesus' question to the man born blind is appropriate for us also. Most of us began to see when we were journeying toward baptism or when our parents taught us the faith as youngsters. But, do we really "believe <u>in</u> the Son of Man?" How does the way I live my life demonstrate my belief?

How do I, as His disciple today, worship Him? Remember from last week's Gospel that God wants people who will worship Him in Spirit and in truth.

What do I need to change, in my life, to demonstrate the courage shown by the man born blind? What elements in our world try to silence the truth that Jesus wants us to see?

How do I, how can I, open myself to the insights Jesus might want me to see? Where is today's Pool of Siloam where I can wash the clay from my eyes?





Catholic social teaching inspires and guides how we are to live and work in the world. In this principle, Call to Family, Community and Participation, we remember that human beings are social by nature-we need each other. We, like the early disciples, are called to come together and grow as a communitywhether that community is in our classroom, workplace or family.

ENCOUNTER ANDRISE

"Education is the foundation of everything," says Andrise, who's been a first-grade teacher at a small Catholic school for 11 years. It's the same school she attended from first through sixth grade, in the community she calls home in northern Haiti. Andrise says the opportunities at Notre Dame set the course for her life. But a lot has changed since she was a student. New teaching techniques and resources are changing how students learn—and how teachers teach. "We use poems, dances, songs—all sorts of activities to help the students improve their literacy," she says. And Catholic Relief Services—working with the Catholic Education Commission in Haiti—is leading the way. Every student receives a new workbook to practice their reading and writing. This is a big change from before, when students had to copy notes from the board. "Now, all the students are able to learn at the same time," Andrise says. And she benefits too—from ongoing teacher training. Last year, the parish priest named her Teacher of the Year. The new techniques are working: Andrise's classroom is a highenergy place, and the students love school—and her. "They call me 'my mother,' and I call them 'my son, my daughter," she says. "They've already promised that next year, when they're in second grade, they'll take time out of their recess to come and visit me." For a teacher like Andrise, seeing the children grow not just as students, but as people, is the reason she goes to work each day.
