

From the Pastor



Reflection for Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday), Cycle B

One of the reforms after Vatican II was a restructuring of Lent. In that restructuring the Sundays Passion Sunday and Palm Sunday were combined. Palm Sunday previously fell a week before Passion Sunday. Now, Holy Week begins with the Sunday we call Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday).

This combined celebration begins with a Gospel reading, preferably proclaimed outside of the church, and a procession, with blessed palms, into the church to help us experience, in a small way, our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Almost immediately, though, the tone changes.

Once we've entered the church, when the celebrant leads the Opening Prayer, we begin to hear forebodings of the Passion. The1st Reading is one of the Suffering Servant oracles from the Book of Isaiah which points to the embraced suffering of the one who will save us. The Responsorial is from Psalm 22 which combines feelings of abandonment by God with an abiding trust in God's love and protection. The 2nd reading is Paul's teaching on how Jesus humbly made himself a like a slave for our salvation becoming obedient to human life which brought him death.

Then we proclaim the Gospel. On this Sunday we are allowed to proclaim the Gospel in parts and the people are always given the part of the crowd. We hear of the conspiracy against Jesus, the unnamed woman's pre-burial anointing, the Last Supper, the Agony in the Garden, Judas' betrayal and Jesus' arrest. After this, the part of the crowd comes in as Jesus is placed on trial, Peter denies even knowing him and the people, playing the part of the crowd, shout "Crucify Him!" It is one of the most disturbingly touching parts of the whole Mass for me. In a seemingly interminable way, the Gospel goes on to tell of the crown of thorns, Jesus being scourged, the Way of the Cross, His crucifixion, His death and His burial. I'm always filled with emptiness at this point.

The Prayer Over the Gifts begins to point to the fact that Jesus' self-sacrifice is what saves us; through no merits of our own but through God's merciful love. The Preface even mentions how his Resurrection purchased our justifications and ends with "we praise you as in joyfully celebration we acclaim: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts..." My emptiness begins to lift.

The Prayer After Communion also points forward to the Resurrection in a sign of hope which acknowledges that, historically, it has already happened, and we pray that we may benefit fully from its effect.

Thus, we enter Holy Week. We have made it our practice, at St. Luke, to process out from this celebration in silence as we make final preparations for the celebration of Easter in this most holy of weeks.

Holy week may be a good time to reflect upon our own ability to turn against good, like the crowd did; against a good person or against the good that someone or some group is trying to accomplish. Or, maybe, we've denied even knowing someone to protect our image, like Peter did. Maybe we sometimes deny Jesus by our unworthy actions. Maybe we let leadership or peer pressure lead us to choosing what is less than the good. Maybe we just want Jesus to go away so we don't have to be confronted by His message of love. How can I change my life to more clearly show my love for the one who loves us so much?


WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: Where do Palm Sunday palms come from and where should they go?

Answer: The Palm Sunday celebration has ancient origins. Beginning the liturgy "outside" the church, we symbolically reenact Christ's entry into Jerusalem. The crowds in ancient Israel waved palm branches - a symbol of royalty - to welcome Jesus. These days, obtaining palms takes a lot of planning and coordination, as hundreds of thousands of churches worldwide need them on the same day! Many in the United States order palms from Florida, California, Texas, or Central America. Many companies stress the sustainability of their production and the just wages paid to their workers.

The palms used on Palm Sunday are blessed at Mass. This means they shouldn't end up in the trash! Many people weave palms into crosses or families display them in their homes. If you do not plan on displaying your palms throughout the year, they should be burned, buried, or left at the church. In the final case, the palms are burned to provide the ashes for next year's Ash Wednesday service.




