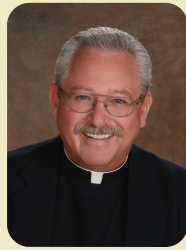

Reflection on the 2nd Sunday of Easter, Year B, Divine Mercy Sunday

Most people know the story of “Doubting Thomas.” I’ve always felt that Thomas gets a bad rap because he is not the only one who doubted. The Gospels seem to imply, if not state clearly, that all of the Apostles didn’t believe at some point or another. And, remember, Thomas was the one that was willing to go and die with Jesus in the story of the Raising of Lazarus. He had deep faith.

Some people know that the giving of the promised Holy Spirit, in this Gospel, is John’s Pentecost. Don’t miss the fact that the giving of the Spirit is connected to the Sending by the literary function of the words “And when he had said this...” The Spirit is given to empower the Church to fulfill the mission upon which it has been sent.

Why are these two incidents told together? Some Scripture scholars suggest that maybe this gathering of the disciples on the first day of the week was what we know as the Mass. The fact that Thomas was with them when they gathered again “a week later” suggests that the Church had already begun gathering each Sunday to celebrate the liturgy as He commanded them. If this is so, faith wasn’t the issue. They wouldn’t have continued gathering if they didn’t have faith in the Lord. But, I think, they didn’t understand the Resurrection.

Look at the similarities in this story with the Mass. There is the gathering, of course. There is the experience of the Lord’s presence. And, there is the sending on mission. Remember that the “sending” is what the deacon does at the end of Mass; “Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.” Remember that this is the action from which the Mass got its name.

Maybe this story isn’t so much about Thomas as it is about us. It could be telling us that it is in the Mass that we experience the presence of the Lord. In fact, the Church teaches that there are four modes of His presence in the Mass. He is present in the community gathered. He is present in the Word proclaimed. He is present in presiding celebrant. And, He is present in a special way in the consecrated bread and wine, His body and blood.

It begs us to ask ourselves how we experience the Lord’s presence in the Mass and, if we only experience His presence through one mode, how can we open ourselves to experiencing His presence in the other modes also. How does His presence, when we gather weekly, support the other six days of being a disciple?

This Sunday, the Octave Sunday of Easter was designated as Divine Mercy Sunday by Pope John Paul II in the year 2000. If you don’t get the connection, it is in the second reading during Year A where the First Letter of Peter says “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in His great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead...”

When he designated Divine Mercy Sunday he granted a plenary indulgence for those celebrating it under the usual conditions: 1) Sacramental Confession, 2) Eucharistic Communion and 3) prayers for the intention of the Holy Father. Please note that if you have celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation prior to Easter and have remained in the state of grace, there is no need for further confession.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

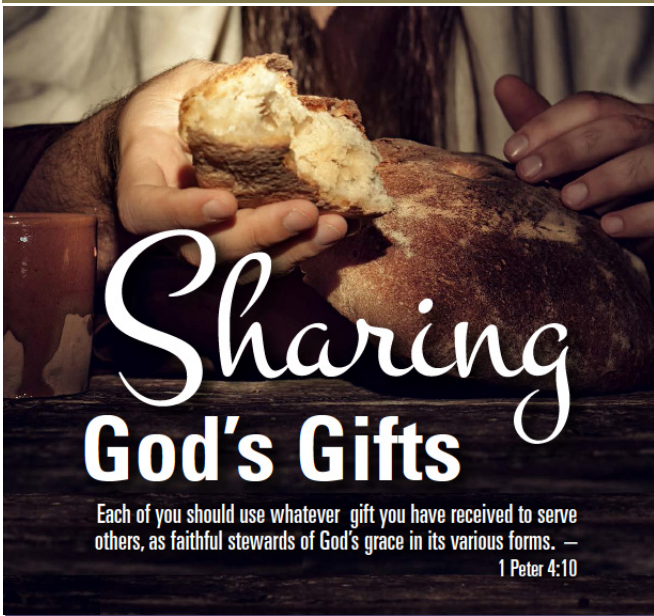
WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: What is the story behind Divine Mercy Sunday?

Answer: In Poland during the early 1930s, Jesus appeared to a religious sister, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. These private revelations had one key theme: the love and mercy of God. The relevance of this message was evident then and would continue to resound in importance throughout the social and political upheaval of the 20th century.

One of Jesus' requests was the institution of a feast of God's mercy. St. Faustina records in her diary, "I desire that the Feast of mercy be a refuge and shelter for souls? let no soul fear to draw near to me? It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter" (Diary, no. 699). After St. Faustina's canonization in 2000, the Vatican declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

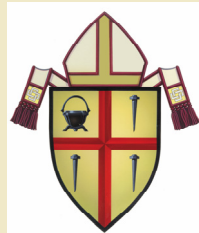

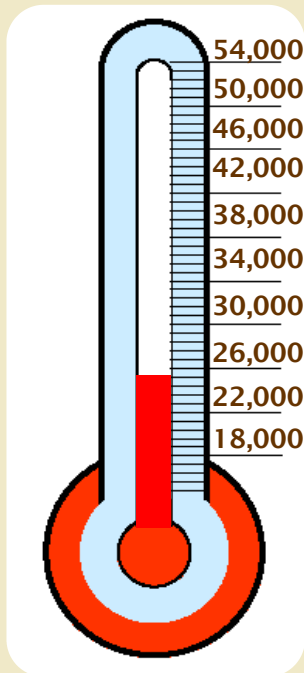

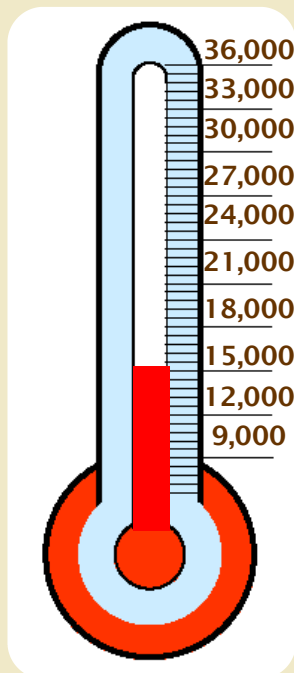
