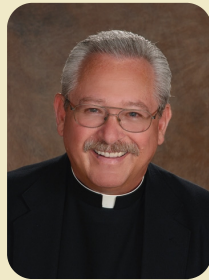

Reflection on the 3rd Sunday of Easter, Cycle B

The Washington Post ran an article about the rebirth of the Ku Klux Klan on October 16, 1915. A Methodist preacher and several others built an altar on Stone Mountain in Georgia. They “set fire to a cross, took an oath of allegiance to the “Invisible Empire” and announced the revival of the Ku Klux Klan. Beneath a makeshift altar... they laid a U.S. flag, a sword and a Holy Bible.”

That’s not much different than the more modern image on the internet of an American flag, a bible and a semi-automatic handgun. The one I saw said, “God, Guns and Country. That’s what made America Great!” (Capitalization theirs)

I’m pretty sure that neither of these images is what Jesus meant, in this Sunday’s Gospel, where He says, “You are my witnesses.” Swords or guns next to the Bible seem incompatible and remind me of the episode in the garden when Jesus was being arrested. Peter, attempting to save the good, drew his sword and cut off the servant to the High Priest’s ear. Jesus told him, “Put your sword back in its sheath!” Jn 18:11a

This Sunday’s Gospel is very similar to last Sunday’s wherein Jesus says, “As the father has sent me, so I send you.” Jn 20:21b, Our being His witnesses is not a passive state wherein we have simply seen something and know what happened. It is an active witnessing wherein we purposefully attest to something so that the truth may be known. This is Luke’s version of the sending but the disciples are told to wait until they have been empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Ultimately, I think, witnessing to the Resurrection means that nothing, not physical or emotional suffering, not the need to fit in or the fear of rejection, not the desire for power or wealth or pleasure, not even physical death, can deter me from living the truth of our Lord’s Law of Love. Because of the Resurrection, we can attest to the fact that good always wins out over evil. The question for us is “How does my life attest to this fact?”

Remember the quote often, doubtfully, attributed to St. Francis, “Preach the Gospel at all times and everywhere. And, if necessary, use words.” It goes hand-in-hand with another quote from Ralph Waldo Emerson who said, “What you do speaks so loudly I can’t hear what you say.” If we are not observably trying to live the Law of Love our words lack the power they could have. If we are observably living a life contrary to the Law of Love our word are empty and our witness is seen as a lie.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

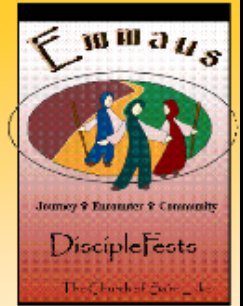

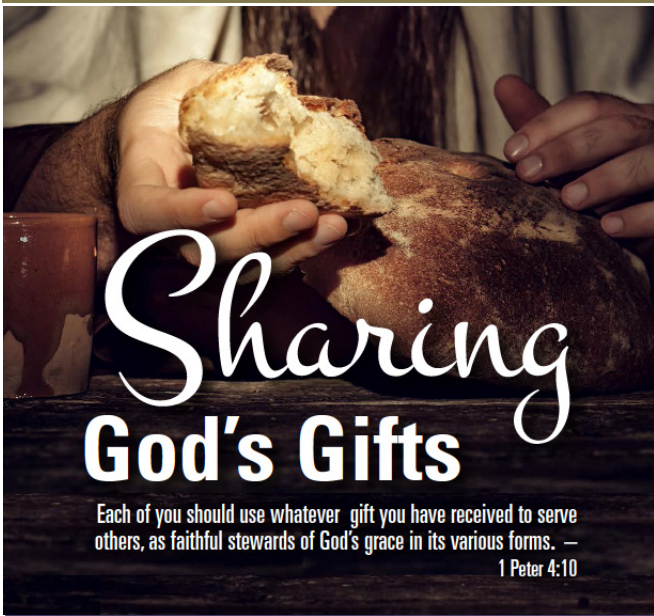
WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

Answer: There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns.

Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!

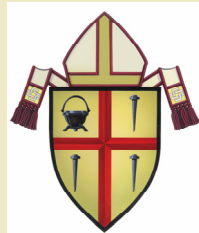

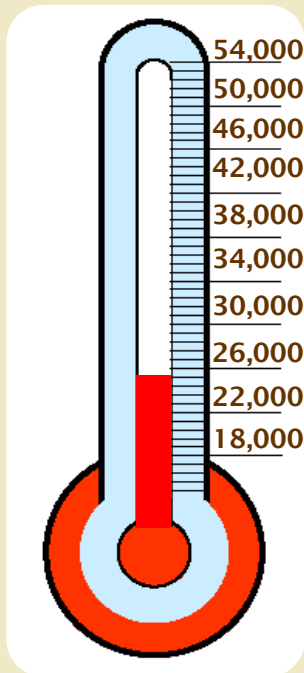

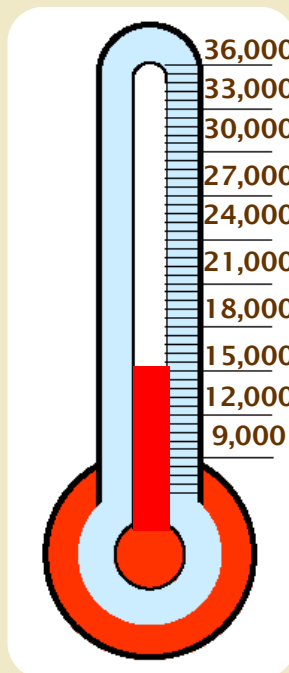
