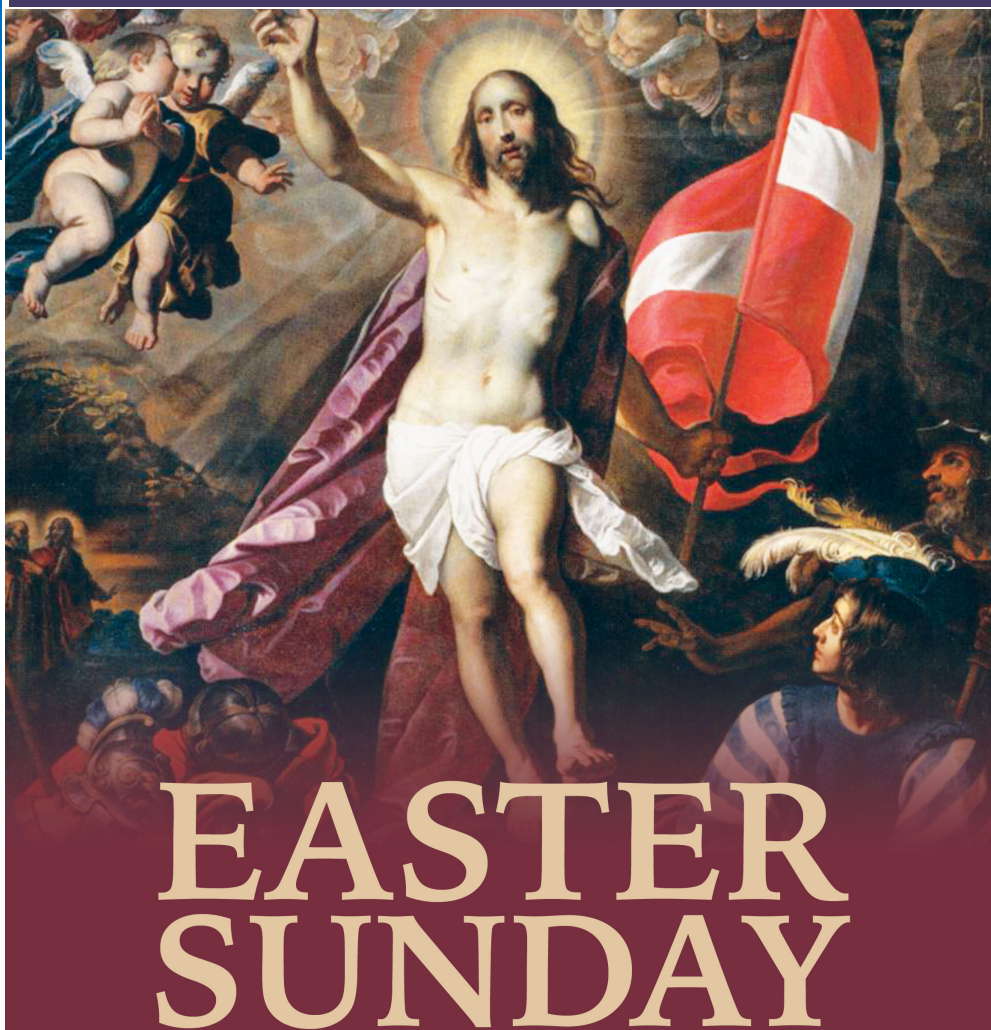

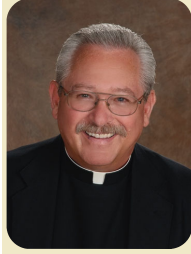

### *From the Pastor*



Happy Easter to you all.

Today we celebrate resurrection, new life. And, it's not just new life and it is not just life as it used to be. It's the fullness of life which Jesus offers.

In ancient times most believed that this world is all there is. By the time of Jesus, a significant portion of the Jewish community believed in resurrection, though. What we celebrate today clinched it and now pretty much everyone believes in an afterlife.

Sometimes I wonder if that's all people think being a disciple of Jesus is all about. Do we simply believe that what Jesus said to Mary is all that it is about; "Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." (Jn 11:25-26)

I believe what he said to Mary and I think it all hinges on the meaning of "whoever believes in me". I know it's not just intellectual assent. It's way more than that. It is believing **in** Jesus like we believe in any person we trust. It's like I trusted my mother to always love me and do what was right for me, to always support me in growing up to be the best person I could be. I believed in her and she never let me down. I think that is what it means to believe in the Lord.

To believe in the Lord, then, means to come to know Him, to come to trust Him and to do as he wants us do. And when we do, we discover a life that is more full and more fulfilling. And, when we live the fullness of life here we open ourselves to the fullness of life in the hereafter. I believe that is what it means to believe in Him.

That's why we celebrate Easter because we believe in the fullness of life which the Resurrected One promises. And, every Sunday in our tradition is a little Easter. That is the way it has been from the very beginning. Immediately, Jesus' disciples began celebrating Eucharist on every Sunday, the Lord's Day. They celebrated every Sunday as we celebrate every Sunday, so as not to forget who we are, so as not to forget the promise, so as to live the promise even now.

Happy Easter. May your relationship with the Lord grow every day. May we, as a community of disciples, continue to grow in relationship with Him and with each other.

## PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

## GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed." The two Marys were in for a surprise. They had come, as usual, to do the ritual anointing of their dead friend's body. But on their arrival, not only was there an earthquake, there was also an angel whose "appearance was like lightning" and whose "clothing was white as snow." The brave guards were so scared they "became like dead men," but the women managed to stay on their feet and hear the words of the angel. Guess what! Jesus isn't here. He's been raised from the dead. Now go share the good news! No wonder these women were feeling a mixture of emotions! They were frightened by these incredible supernatural events, but overjoyed that Jesus was alive again. Just imagine their joy when "Jesus met them on their way," and they were able to embrace him and worship him. What a day! Now, we too join in the celebration of this day of all days. Every Easter, we recall these glorious events, but we do more than just remember. We also rejoice that our Lord is alive right now, that death and sin have been conquered forever, that the gates of heaven are open for us. The joy of Easter is not a nostalgic kind of happiness that only looks backwards. It is instead a call to rejoice in the gifts that we can enjoy today and in eternity. We may not have seen the angel, felt the earthquake, or kissed the feet of the risen Lord, but we are nonetheless the beneficiaries of this momentous event. We are an Easter people, a people in the hands of a loving God whose power can overcome all the terrible threats and trials of existence with the amazing gift of eternal life.

## LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Alleluia, the Lord is risen! Mary of Magdala went to Jesus' tomb and found that it was empty. She was the first witness of the Resurrection and announced the empty tomb to other disciples. We are called to be witnesses too. Can you imagine the joy the disciples experienced when they realized that Jesus was actually raised from the dead? Sometimes our faith in the Resurrection can run lukewarm. We don't fully doubt that Jesus was raised but we aren't fully convinced either. Once we become convinced our lives, no matter where our roads take us, will automatically radiate with joy. Like Mary, we are called to then share that joy with others so that they may realize that it is the Lord and come to believe.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: In our bulletin before Easter, there were two lists of people joining the church: candidates and catechumens. What is the difference?

Answer:

People who come to the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) have various backgrounds. Some come to find out about faith; others are baptized in another Christian denomination and are seeking full communion with us; and still others come already knowing they want to be baptized. Those already baptized, who seek full communion with us, are called candidates. Their formation in faith has already begun and they have knowledge of Jesus, the Gospels, and what it means to be a believer. Those who are not baptized need to be formed in faith and develop a relationship with God. They are called catechumens. We do not want to diminish the importance of faith formation by making the RCIA another study session of the catechism. Other elements of church life are also important: community, spirituality, traditions, Scripture, personal commitment to faith, etc. All of these things are discussed and experienced in the RCIA as part of the initiation into the church community. As such, the whole parish becomes part of that process as we invite and welcome people to join us and our church.
