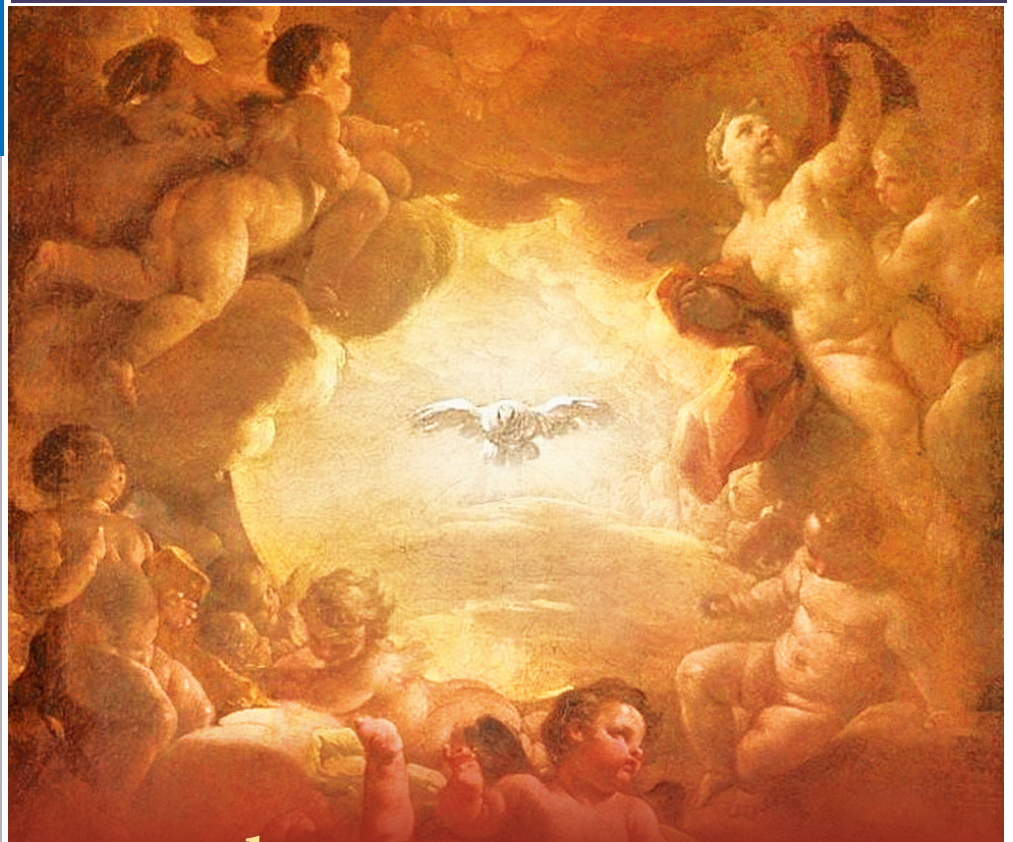

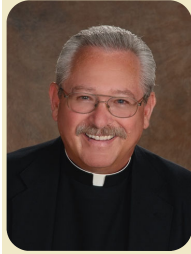

From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

I went to check out the local cemetery here in Rosarito, today. I'm on my day off. This one, and other ones I've seen in Baja, isn't anything like the cemeteries in the US. It's been mostly municipal cemeteries that I've seen. Privately operated ones might be different but I haven't seen any of those and don't even know if they have them.

There is no office at the cemetery. There doesn't appear to be anyone to maintain the grounds. The graves aren't lined up in an orderly fashion. There's no nicely mowed grass. In fact, there just isn't any grass. You'd think that no one cared if it were not obvious that family members come to maintain, or at least visit, the graves.

Today I saw a man cleaning off the top of one of the graves. I didn't think it would be respectful to go over and see whose grave it was and what their relationship was but I imagine it was very close. The top of the grave, like so many, was a cement slab and he was carefully cleaning leaves and twigs off of it.

Another grave had obviously been very recently visited. Someone had made a cross with about twenty vases, on top of it, filled with freshly cut flowers. I imagined that it was somebody's mother or the mother of someone's children who was being lovingly remembered.

Many of the graves were unique with differently decorated cement slabs on top, or a border fence or wall, or little house-like structures where the headstone would be. One had a baby bed on it with the legs buried in the ground and the headstone at the head of the bed. I thought how loved and missed that child must be. Some simply had a cross, metal or wood, with the person's name painted on it. I remember helping make such a cross for a person we buried in Tijuana last year.

I guess what I'm feeling is that these graves are the access points, for the loved ones, to the lives that they really must believe go on in some fashion. I used to be touched every time I saw _____ Escarsega's car at our local cemetery and would see him standing at Barbara's grave. He missed her sorely but knew that she still existed in some fashion and went to her grave almost every day to be with her.

That's the thing about human beings. We are so connected spiritually that we can feel it. Yet we come to know ourselves and express ourselves bodily; and, we experience others bodily. The physical is our access point the deeper reality of the person which is spirit. I think that is why it helps to have a place to be our access point when someone has passed on. That's why I agree with the Church saying that remains should be interred just like a body rather than being scattered.

This is also what I think bodily resurrection is all about. It is the belief that we stay fully human in eternity experiencing ourselves and each other bodily. I imagine our spiritual connection will be enhanced but I can't imagine being me without a body.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"If you love me you will keep my commandments." It's really as simple as that. We are only paying lip service to the Lord if we externally declare ourselves to be Christians but don't follow through on a life that confirms it. In our modern culture, we often think of love as a feeling or a kind of devotion. It is thus all too common to separate love from appropriate action. Perhaps we reassure ourselves that we love Jesus because we believe that he is the Son of God and our personal Savior. But these thoughts--or even any grateful or pleasant feelings that come along with them--are not the fullest manifestation of real love. Rather, as Jesus tells us directly in today's Gospel, "Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me."

Now, for those of us who may be asking what exactly these commandments are, it's helpful to remember Jesus' response when he was questioned on the subject. "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37-39). These fundamental principles embrace everything that Jesus calls us to do. If we put God first and foremost in our lives, and if we treat our neighbors as we would wish to be treated, then all the rest falls into place. The Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, and any other fundamental Christian codes of behavior are all summed up here. Indeed, if we truly seek to love Jesus, putting him first and following his ways won't feel like a burden but rather like a beautiful blessing.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

St. Teresa of Calcutta once said, "Spread love everywhere you go. Let no one ever come to you without leaving happier." Keeping the commandments of Jesus ultimately means loving as he loves. How do you think people feel after they leave your presence? This is a question worth pondering if we are serious about being disciples. Gentleness and reverence are beautiful charisms to foster as they speak boldly of love. If we truly love God and our brothers and sisters, we will always be gentle with them and treat them with the reverent dignity they deserve, regardless of what they have done. This is the ultimate challenge of discipleship. Committing ourselves today to following Jesus' commandments and to love as Jesus loves, how can we make those who meet us this week leave us happier and grateful that they have crossed our path?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: How do we know when we receive the Holy Spirit?

Answer:

My brothers and I discovered something as we got older. There's a little bit of Dad in us. Each time we catch ourselves using one of his gestures, expressions, or comments about a meal, we say, "I'm getting more like Dad!" When we are confirmed, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no radical change in us that makes us seem suddenly different. Over a period of time we come to see that there is a little bit of the Spirit in us. We catch ourselves using the gifts, and often end up wondering where a bit of wisdom came from, why we were so patient, or we feel an intensity in our prayer. Perhaps we felt drawn to deepen our spiritual life or found courage in witnessing to our faith. That's when we know we have received the Holy Spirit. We take on his image. Yes, we grow in age, grace, and wisdom, but we also grow in our awareness and understanding of the working of God in our life--we realize we're getting more and more like God. Our thoughts, words, and actions carry that quality and others also see it in us. You might call it holiness. But be confident--there's a little bit of God in all of us!

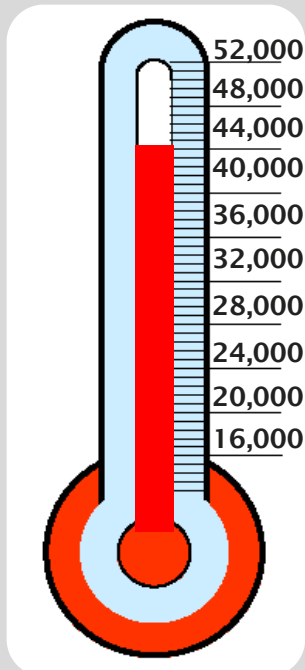

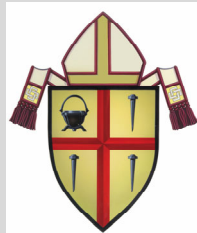

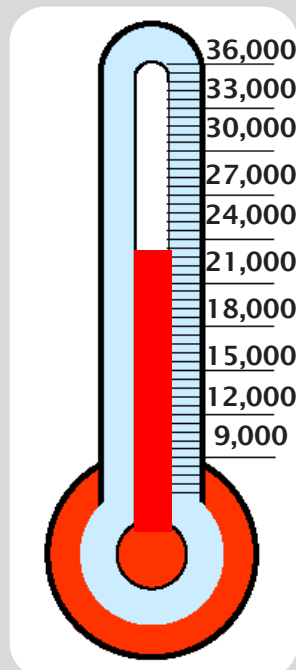
