From the Pastor



Dear parishioners,

When I leave Desayunador, in Tijuana, and get to the first light, there are always several people selling things or wanting to wash car windows for a few pesos. I always tell them no and give them money anyway. I'm always in a hurry and, if they don't have water, the windows come out streaky. Sometimes it works, sometimes not. Oh, the other thing they are good at is giving directions to the border; I guess there are a lot of lost Americans who go by there.

Today, two gentlemen approached my car. For some reason, I had a black streak on the side of the car and asked the first to see if he could clean that off for me. He was being successful when the other gentleman started to wash my window. I told him no and gave him some money but that didn't stop him, oftentimes it doesn't. Then, the light changed. My anxiety went way up, not just because I was in a hurry but there were people behind me. I tried to tell him that he had done enough; "Está suficiente. Basta, por favor.". After I had said that, the gentleman who had cleaned the side of my car said, "He's just trying to do a good job." That stopped me. I realized I had disrespected him and calmed down.

I learned a lot in that little episode. One which I already know but don't always put into practice is that whoever we are dealing with is a human being. As a disciple of the Lord, I should always make the interchange about them, not about me. Secondly, those people selling Chicklets, churros, magazines or whatever, oftentimes seem to be an annoyance but they are entrepreneurs trying to do a good job. Those who beg are working too. It's how they try to survive.

Many of these entrepreneurs come to Desayunador; that's how they keep their cost of living down so they can survive on the modest amounts they make selling their stuff. They bring their guitars, their shoe shine kits, their strings of candy and treats, their handmade trinkets, etc. with them. (By the way, if anyone has an acoustic guitar they are not using, I know a 75+ years old man who could put it to use.)

I feel that I've always respected them at Desayunador but it can seem so overwhelming when you are confronted with several on the street. They have learned that I won't give them money right outside of Desayunador; no matter how much I have there is never enough to go around and I, personally, can't take that so none of them get any until I see them on the street in some other location.

Another interesting note, the gentleman dressed in white who collects money, at the border, for the drug and alcohol rehab clinic, recognizes me now. Whether I give him money or not, he always comes over to say hello. I feel like, in some way, I have made a friend and, he makes my wait in line more fun. Regulars at Desayunador continue to introduce themselves to me and ask me about myself. I know that these relationships are of necessarily limited depth but I really appreciate them.

These experiences help me open myself to people who are, and whose lives are, different from mine. They help me respect and love God's people. I know these are ones who, for whatever reason, are easy for me but it causes me to reflect on how I need to love and respect even those who are different from me and are difficult for me to interact with.

Praise God for all of his people. May we come to know and love them and experience the breadth and depth of who God really is.

❖ PARISH FINANCES ❖

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to collect an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental Donations, Interest, One-time gifts & bequests, etc.).

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

"And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." What consoling words Jesus had for his disciples, even as he was about to bring an end to his earthly ministry. He had spent some time with them after his resurrection, but now his mission was complete and he was about to return to be with his Father in heaven. Undoubtedly this must have been a difficult moment for the disciples. But as if to reassure them, Jesus gives this remarkable promise: that he will **ALWAYS** be with them, even when he is no longer physically present. We know, of course, that the presence he is referring to comes through the gift of the Holy Spirit. And what is most wonderful about this promise is that it also applies to us!

Jesus is with US always. His presence dwells in our hearts through the sacrament of baptism in which we receive the real, indwelling gift of the Holy Spirit in our hearts. We are not alone! The sometimes difficult journey of Christian life is not one we need to navigate solo. Christ himself ascended into heaven so that he could make himself present in a more universal and timeless way through his Spirit to all people who call upon him. Thus we rejoice on this feast of the Ascension. It's not so much about Jesus leaving. Rather, it's about him continuing his mission in a new way, a way that includes us very directly.

So let us remember that Jesus is present with us, even when we cannot see him next to us or hear his voice loud and clear. Let us call upon his Holy Spirit when we need guidance, comfort, or direction. And today, let us give thanks to God the Father for sending his Son to save us and for giving us his Spirit to accompany us on our own journey of life.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

At the Lord's Ascension the disciples were given very clear instructions, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." These are instructions for us as well. We have been given a purpose and a mission as believers and followers of Jesus Christ. Our celebration reminds us to take time for prayer. Prayer can deepen our awareness not only of who we are but of the Holy Spirit bringing Christ's mission to fulfillment. With this knowledge, we can believe more deeply and then act on that belief.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

Why do some dioceses move holy days, or not even celebrate them at all. Doesn't everyone do the same thing?

Answer:

The short answer is no, not everyone does the same thing. Although the Church is universal, there are many local customs and saints that each country, sometimes just a region, will honor. For example, feast days and patronal days may not be major feast days on the Church's universal calendar, but are celebrated as such in one place. Holy days of obligation are the same way. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops has a certain amount of discretion in choosing days that best reflect the local church's experience and history. Another reason certain feasts are moved is a practical one. With limited clergy, or a great difficulty for people to get to Mass, the feast day may be transferred to a Sunday. The rationale is that if a significant feast should be part of the Church's celebration, then better to do so on a Sunday when people and clergy are available, rather than try to fit it on a day when one or both cannot be there.






