



# From the Pastor Reflection for the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle B

Remember, in Mark's Gospel, more than the others, Jesus is the Kingdom preacher. One of his central messages is that the Reign of God is at hand. And, last week, we had Jesus in the house casting out demons and being accused of casting out demons by the power

of Satan. He demonstrated that it cannot be by the power of Satan and alluded to himself as the one who has tied up Satan and is plundering his property, those possessed by his demons.

But the lived experience of the first-hearers of this Gospel probably made them feel that Satan was still on the prowl, was still Beelzebul, the Lord of the Earth. How could this be? How can this seeming contradiction be explained? Has Jesus really tied up Satan, or not?

The parables following last week's story give hints to the answer. Our selection this week is two of those parables, the parable of how the reign of God grows imperceptibly and the story of how it is very small right now but will soon grow to provide it's benefits to all people.

In the story of the seed which sprouts and grows without us knowing how, Mark uses the same word for "sprout" as was used in Is 11:1 where it says "a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse." We know the shoot is Jesus. Would the first-hears have heard the same?

Would the first-hearers have heard that the salvation of the world is a process and would it have given them patience in the midst of a world that may not have seemed to them to be getting any better? They were used to waiting for fruit to ripen. Would hearing that the fruit must ripen before the harvest have given them patience and hope that salvation would eventually happen?

The second parable, of the mustard seed, would have signaled to them that the Reign of God during their time was very small. Did they realize that they were the Reign of God and that they would grow into the myriads of faith communities that make up Christianity today? They must have understood something similar because the words we translate as "dwell in it's shadow" is literal "pitch their tent" and recalls Psalm 91:1-4 which speaks of the serenity of those who "dwell" in the shelter of the Most High.

These parables also must be taken in context with the parables which precede them, the Parable of the Sower and the Parables of the Lamp. They heard that not all people respond fully to the Word of God and, that they should respond and that in their responding they will receive the fullness of the Word.

We live in a world that I think must be similar, in many ways, to that of the Church's first century. It seems that evil is having free reign in many parts of the world. Even the United States has its experience of evil. We've experienced terrorist attacks, we have violence in our streets, schools and workplaces, we have strained relations with other countries that sometimes include talk of violence, we have accusations of prejudice against certain ethnic groups and increasing claims of sexual misconduct. Where is the Reign of God in all of this?

What is my responsibility to make the Reign of God present in our day and time? In His Service,

# WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

**Question:** If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?


Answer: Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like Baptism or Matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community -- thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored.




